After working as a reference librarian at Brownsburg Public Library and completing her Master of Library Science degree, Rachel worked for a year here at

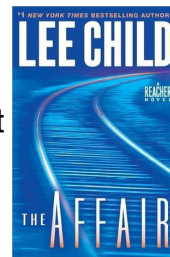
Plainfield-Guilford Township Public Library in Adult Services. She was then hired as director at Monticello, where she has been for the past 3 1/2 years.

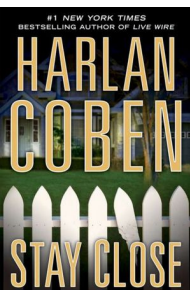
New Books and Recommendations by Jo Sibley, Readers' Advisor

Spring brings a shower of new books including ones by Danielle Steel, James Patterson, and Suzanne Brockmann. Steel's new book is **Betrayal** is about the dark side of fame and fortune. A famous Hollywood director discovers someone in her trusted inner circle has been stealing from her. Brockmann's **Born to Darkness** and Patterson's **Guilty Wives** are perfect books to read in warmer weather.



Also new are **Stay Close** by Harlan Coben, **When Maidens Mourn** by C.S. Harris, and **The Thief** by Clive Cussler. I hope that this spring finds you reading several enjoyable books.
