We then talked about Grandfather and Grandmother Atkinson who came to Ind. from N. Carolina in the year of 1832 in a covered wagon, when their oldest child was 2 years old. They stopped on the way to do their washing. Grandmother saw a wild pig running down the mountain with

something in its mouth. They were attracted and found it was their pocket book which contained all the money they had. They came on to Ind. and entered the north 80 of the farm, began clearing and built a log cabin and cut bushes to make a road to the creek, so they could get through with the wagon. Grandfather went to a log rolling two years later and heard some men talking about buying the lower 40. He came home got ready and went to Crawfordville back, got there at daybreak. The other men were just ahead of him, but they stopped for breakfast. He went on to the land office and bought the land for \$7.25 an acre, just getting ahead of the men a few minutes. The cabin was used for a wash house in later years after the present house was built. The land was

facing the south. There was a mark on the floor so they could tell the time of day by the sun. This was their sundial. The kitchen was built on the north at that time. After Grandfather here 7 years he decided to go back to N. C. to buy the old home place, but when he got there the bushes had grown so big and the place didn't look like it did when he left it, so he turned his horse around and headed for Ind. He was glad to get back and built a barn the following year, 1840.
