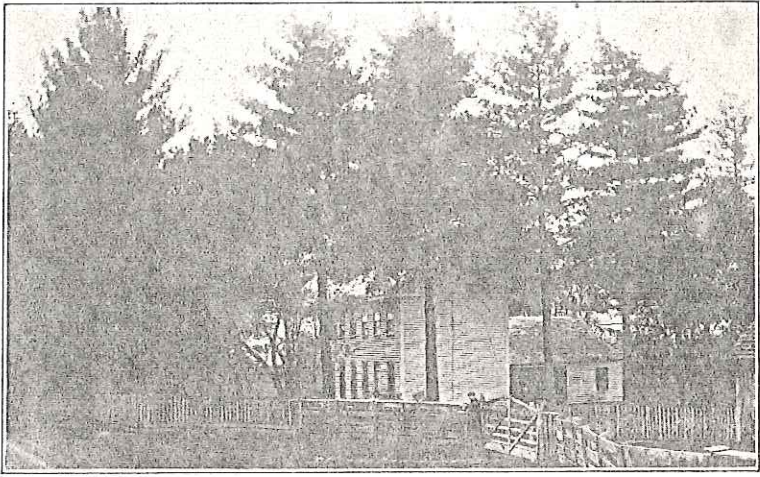

“THE PINES”

The homestead of John Dayton Ballard and Ella Woodward Ballard, his wife, in Hendricks County, Indiana was built by.....Jessup about 1835.

The material for building was obtained from trees which were grown on the place, as was also, the walnut which comprises the interior wood work. The house is still standing and is in a fair state of preservation. It sets picturesquely in a grove of pine trees and is located in a Quaker Community, religiously known as Fairfield Meeting of the Society of Friends.

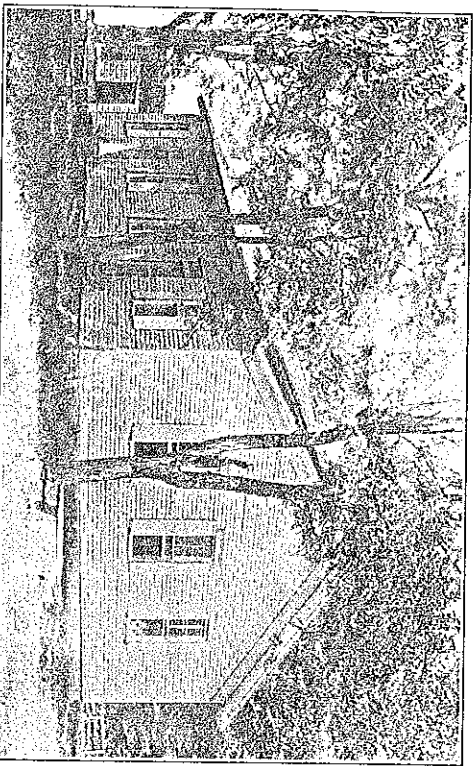
The Meeting House (built in 1826) is one mile eastward and not far distant from it is the home of Asa Ballard, his father. The Asa Ballard house was built about 1830 and has the unique feature in that the Masonic emblem is formed in the design of ornamental fret-work in the front gable of the house; and because of his fraternal affiliations and having married, the second time, a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, he was turned out of meeting.

He was re-instated when his wife embraced their faith and adopted the dress of a Quakeress, which, at that time, was a full skirt (several yards around), tight fitting basque and a silk or satin bonnet, the latter made stiff with

crinoline and buckram and circled the face entirely. It was held together beneath the chin by a precise bow of ribbon. The color was usually gray, but sometimes black, and in either case the dress and bonnet and shawl always matched.

He was born in Ohio and married Sarah Shanafelt, born in Maryland, second wife, and their children were John Dayton, Martha Jane and William Hadley. It is the last mentioned who, in memory of his daughter, built the Bertha Ballard Home at Indianapolis, Indiana and gave it to The Society of Friends to be conducted as a home for young girls employed in business. It has beside the dormitory rooms and a spacious dining-hall, a music-room and a library for their cultural influence, and for their physical recreation a bowling alley and gymnasium. The architecture of the building is colonial in design and is substantially built of brick and stone, having three stories and a basement. Upon the second floor in the front of the building is a large central window of art glass the design of which is the life size portrait of beautiful little Bertha Ballard nine years of age.

Asa Ballard was the son of Joseph Ballard whose old homestead is also in the rural community known as Fair-

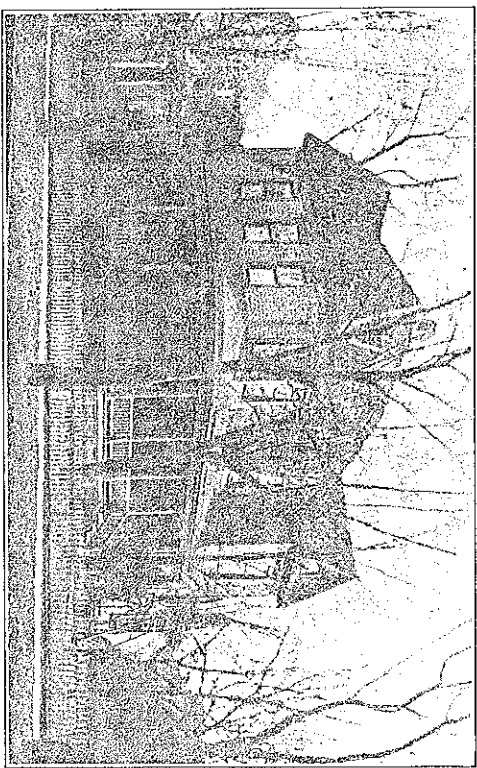
field, but across the creek and a few miles north of the Asa Ballard homestead. The Joseph Ballard farm was purchased while Indiana was a Territory, and the deed which bears the original signature of President James Monroe has never been out of the possession of a direct line of the descendants of Joseph Ballard; as it was the home of his grand-daughter Martha Jane Ballard Reeve and her husband John Reeve and where their children Ella, Emma, Charles and Inez were born and reared. The joint ownership is now held by Charles Reeve and his nephew Merle Allen, son of Ella, representing the fourth and fifth generations respectively.

Joseph Ballard was born 1770 in Virginia and married Elizabeth Bircham in North Carolina. They moved to Ohio and later to Indiana, and are buried in the old graveyard of Fairfield Friends Meeting. The following inscription is upon his tomb: "A Pioneer of 1821." He was the son of David Ballard who was born in Virginia 1750, and David Ballard was a Missionary to the Indians in Ohio in Territorial days. It was said of him when he was stricken suddenly by death during a service: "A good man has fallen."

Merle Allen, Whittier, California, son of Ella Reeve and Elmer J. Allen; and Donald and Charles Kellum, Indianapolis, Indiana, sons of Emma Reeve and Walter Kellum; and John Ballard Old, Tulsa, Oklahoma, son of Nellie Ballard and George H. Old represent the 18th generation in direct descent from Fulco Ballard, Gentleman, England.

This was the home of John Dayton Ballard and Ella Woodward Ballard, who removed from Indiana to Kansas and there spent the remainder of their lives.

It was in this home located at 1624 Washington Avenue in the City of Parsons, Kansas, that Mrs. Ballard assisted by her daughter Mrs. Jessie Ballard Wherry organized the Hannah Jameson Chapter, National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

"The Charter members were Mrs. Ella Woodward Ballard, Regent; Mrs. George W. Gabriel, Vice Regent; Mrs. Mabel Henderson Piper, Secretary; Miss Margaret Thompson, Registrar; Mrs. Polly Comstock Cory, Treasurer; Mrs. Jennie Adams Davis, Historian; Mrs. Sallie Houston Carr, Chaplain—the other charter members were Mesdames Abigail M. Wheeler, Alfred Noyes, W. P. Talbot, Ira Adams, Jessie Ballard Wherry, Sue Fessenden White, James W. Henderson and Harry McLaughlin.

The name "Hannah Jameson" suggested by Mrs. Sallie Houston Carr, daughter of General Samuel Houston, was chosen by the members as a compliment to Mrs. Ballard, it being the name of the wife of her Revolutionary Ancestor.

Beverly Ballard built a log cabin for his family on 7.10 acres entered from the Government in 1834 in Sec. No. 6 T16N R2E Brown Township Hend. Co. Ind. He also entered land in Lincoln Twp. where later his son James Ballard (b. 2 26 1818 d. 7 22 1892) would build and operate a sawmill.

At the death of Beverly Ballard, James Ballard became the owner of the land where the log cabin stood. In 1853 James Ballard and his brother George Ballard (b. 1 1822: d. 1912), who was a cabinet maker, felled trees, hauled logs to the sawmill owned by James Ballard and hewed the sills for a new house. In 1854 the house consisting of two rooms 15X15, two rooms 9X10, and a 9X10 porch enclosed on three sides was completed. It was heated by a fireplace, there were five windows and three doors lead outside; one to the north just a few steps away from the log cabin. Sometime during the 1880's, the porch was fully enclosed and became the fifth room of the house.

When James Ballard died the house and some of the originally entered acreage was willed by him to his daughter, Mary Jane Ballard (b. 2 25 1858: d 10 20 1922), who lived alone on the farm until her marriage (8 8 1895) to Daniel B Ennis (b. 1 1864: d 4 17 1921). In 1907 they tore down the log house built by her grandfather, Beverly, put a brick foundation under the house built by her father James, (up until this time it rested on rocks), took out the original fireplace, and built a 16X30 addition consisting of two rooms over a brick walled cellar, and a cement porch. The cellar had<sup>v</sup> framed, roofed outside entrance, with cement steps which are still in use. A false outside chimney and solid walnut fireplace mantle were built into the house built by James and a larger matching porch was added to

At the death of Mary Jane (Ballard) & Daniel B Ennis, the house and approximate acreage of 84 acres was willed to Margaret (Hogan) Haag (b. 9 6 1890 ), who was the niece of Mary Jane (Ballard) Ennis, and who had made her home with them following the death of her mother until her marriage (6 4 1913) to William Haag (b. 9 1 1891 : d. 8 29 1972). William and Margaret (Hogan ) Haag completely modernized the house during the period from 1922 to 1972: first electricity was installed, the cellar was enlarged to create room for a furnace, an inside cellarway was constructed, closets and a bath were created in the 1854 house, hardwood flooring was laid over the old rough boards, and the kitchen was completely modernized.

Margaret (Hogan) Haag is the present owner, however her grandson Ray William McClain (b. 9 1 1946- )<sup>X</sup> with his wife Mary Margaret (Turk) (b. 2 19 1942 ) and their daughter Amy Jo McClain (b. 2 26 1973), are the present occupants.

The hand hewn sills in the 1854 part of the house are still in excellent condition, as is the original solid walnut woodwork and 4 solid walnut doors made by George Ballard. Much of the original plastering is intact; the woodwork was nailed to framing and then plastered up to it. The original china doorknobs are still on the doors and the original iron lock with its 4 in. long brass key is still working. Solid walnut cupboard doors in the kitchen were hung in 1907 after being moved from the 1854 house. Two of the walnut thresholds that were laid in 1854 are still in use..

A drawing of the house would be incomplete without the huge white oak tree that has sheltered seven generations of this family.

BALLARD CEMETERY BROWN TOWNSHIP

Common in pioneer times, was the "family" cemetery.  
 The Ballard Cemetery is located on ground entered by Beverly Ballard in 1834 & 35, and is presently owned by Margaret Haag, great granddaughter.

There are two versions of how the cemetery came into being:

1. A young man who was working for James Ballard, (son of Beverly) died, leaving no known relatives and was the first person buried there.
2. James & Sarah (Corbaly) Ballard had lost one son who is buried in Walker Cemetery in Lincoln Twp. When their second son died, James Ballard said "I will start my own burial ground".

In either instance, the cemetery was begun about 1850 and perhaps earlier, and was originally planned as a family burial ground, however, after the migration of the Irish to Brown Twp. there was an epidemic which killed so many babies in the community, and some of the Irish Catholic families requested that James Ballard allow their unbaptized children to be buried in his family plot. At that time all Catholic children were baptized at St. John Church in Indianapolis, so it was not unusual for a child to be a year or so old before baptism. Proof of these children's proper burial was evidenced in 1928 when during the opening of a grave tiny gold casket crosses and a piece of glass were unearthed. Many protestant children are also buried there, and many of the graves that are marked are no relation to the Ballard family.

There are numerous unmarked graves, some stones practically illegible, and some stones buried. (These I hope to unearth this summer) Each rock is a grave marker and there are two red cedar trees which I have always been told are also markers. The cemetery is about half the size it originally was: due to it's placement on a hill overlooking Shoal Creek to the immediate west, erosion has taken place and though it has always been well fenced, the stones are in a bad condition at this time.
