GENEALOGY OF THE BARNHILLS

John Barnhill, first we have any account of, was born and raised on the borders of Scotland and Ireland and came to America with other brothers in probably early 1700 or possibly late 1600. He had two sons, David and Winfield, supposed to have been born in Millin county, Pa. David had three sons, John, Robert and Gabriel; Gabriel moved to Wayne county, Ohio; John stayed in Pennsylvania; Robert moved to southern Ohio. Gabriel had four sons: Joseph, Robert, David and John. Robert and Joseph moved to Hancock county, Ohio; John to Paulding county, Ohio, and David to Tuscarawas county, Ohio. David had two sons, John and Robert; John moved to Tennessee and lost to view. Robert was born probably in Tuscarawas county, Ohio. He married Sarah Marvis, on the 8th day of February, 1801. They lived for a few years in Scott county, near Georgetown, Kentucky. They moved to Butler county, Ohio, in or about the year 1804. They reared a family of 13 children, seven sons and six daughters, one son dying at the age of 26 years, unmarried.

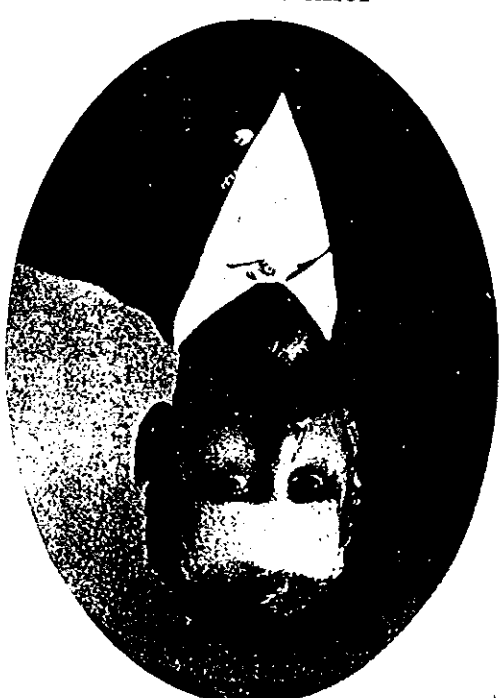

Of the above family Samuel, William, John, Jane, Daniel and Robert were born in Scott county near Georgetown, Kentucky, and Catharine, Mary, Hugh, Nancy, Sarah, James and Margaret were born in Butler county, Ohio. The family came to Indiana where Indianapolis now is, April 8, 1820, (except Robert came ahead to blaze the road and landed at Indianapolis, March 20, 1820.) They settled near Fall creek, had a log cabin of one room built. Robert the husband died of pluerisy of the head, was sick seven days. After his death (Sarah) the widow entered a quarter section of land on Eagle creek. She afterwards sold the land, the children getting \$100 each, and his was the first estate entered for settlement in the probate court. The remainder of the family having arrived they removed to Eagle creek in the fall of 1821. John and Robert helped to cut the first wagon road from White river to their settlement on Eagle creek, with the assistance of neighbors who soon came in, they erected the first church at Old Union. Their first school house was on Daniel Barnhill land, of log, with punchoon floor, stick and mud chimney. It was not a good one. The house drew harder than the chimney. Oiled paper was used in those days instead of glass. George Conrad was the first school teacher. The legal tender for tuition (said Donice P. McClelland) was linen, linsay, beeswax, and Gauseng. Jery J. Corbaley was the first justice of the peace and acted in that capacity for many years. Sarah the widow married Jacob Whiting-er, June 15, 1824. He was born Oct. 16, 1768. Died Jan. 6, 1849, aged 80 years. Of the above family, Samuel married Polly Kailshack Feb. 25, 1814.

Robert Barnhill died January 12, 1892, at the residence of A. F. Shirts, Noblesville, at the age of 88 years, eight months and five days. The remains were laid to rest beside those of his wife at the cemetery on the old farm.

Mary Speer.

Mary Speer, daughter of Robert and Sarah Barnhill, was born in Dutler county, Ohio, May 3rd, 1807. She was united in marriage to William Speer, July 29th, 1824. There were born to them ten children, five girls and five boys, six of which are yet living, four boys and two girls. She joined the M. E. church in the year 1828. (or about that time.) in a hewn log meeting house at Shilo. Her husband, William Speer, died when they lived on a farm near Clermont, Marion county, Jan. 16th, 1864. She moved from Marion county to Zionsville in the year 1870, where she lived up to the time of her death, which occurred on the night of August 26th, 1893, at 15 minutes past 10 o'clock, aged 86 years, three months and twenty-three days.

The family to which she belonged was what we call a large family, composed to thirteen children, seven sons and six daughters, of which she was the last one to bid adieu to the many of the generations that are left, they were a family that seemed to have inherited a religious disposition. The family came to Marion County in the year of '20. They cut the first wagon road from the city of Indianapolis to what was called Big Eagle Creek, near Clermont. They settled in the dense forest near together and among

the Indians, around whom the vast multitudes have since gathered. She was loyal to her country, furnishing two sons at its call in time of peril, and trusting in her Dear Savior until death. She was known by many and loved by all. May she rest from her labors until the Master says arise and put on the bright robe of immortality and say, "Enter thou into the joys of thy Lord."

William Speer.

At his residence, near Clermont, Marion county, Indiana, January 16th 1864, William Speer, in the 62nd year of his age.

Mr. Speer was born near Rising Sun, Indiana, but for many years previous to his death had been a resident of the county in which he died. In his early manhood he identified himself with the M. E. church, of which denomination he remained a consistent and faithful member until summoned from earth away. By his amiable deportment, strict regard for moral uprightnes, and undisguised opposition to that which he felt and knew to be wrong, he had endeared himself to a large circle of friends and admirers. Those who knew William Speer best loved him most. As a husband and father, he was remarkably kind and affectionate; as a neighbor, generous and obliging; as a citizen, he possessed that lofty patriotism which future generations will delight to honor. Although uncalled from the humble walks of life to figure before the public, no man loved his country with a purer love than he; none felt a warmer interest in its welfare. When the President first called for volunteers for "three years or for the war," two sons responded to the call, attaching themselves to the "7th Indiana" and repaired to the scene of conflict. A few weeks before his death, Mr. Speer visited these sons. Shortly after his return he was taken with smallpox, contracted during the visit, which carried him to his grave in a few days. As the disease progressed, he gradually lost the power of speech, and, for about two days before his death, was unable to converse intelligently with his family and attendants. However desirable it may be to receive the last testimony of dying friends, bereaved ones, in this case, take comfort in retrospecting the life of the deceased, and cherish the hope of a glorious reunion beyond the cold stream of death, for

Nancy Ennis.

Nancy Ennis, wife of William, Ennis, died at her home near Clermont, Ind., January 16, 1885, aged 58 years, 2 months and 8 days. Nancy Ennis was the daughter of William Speer who was one of the pioneers of Marion

county, Indiana. She was born in Wayne township, November 8, 1826. She joined the Methodist church in the year 1843, in a log school house in Pike township, known as the McCorkle school house, near the place where she will be buried. She lived a consistent member, and no doubt has gone home to heaven. She was married to William A. Ennis, October 30, 1845, and in about three hours after they were married, her sister's child lay a corpse. Her sister was the wife of David McCurdy, and instead of having an infair, necessity compelled them to attend a funeral. The results of their marriage was a family of 10 children, six boys and two girls living. All were present when she died. Three of them live in the city, and whenever they came home, she always met them with a kiss. On this occasion the first words she spoke to her son John, were, where is little Charlie? She was a fond mother, and a true companion. She was struck speechless on Thursday morning and remained that way for some time, but came to and died on Friday evening at about 7:30 o'clock. She passed away quietly without any struggle, apparently she was taken very suddenly; went to bed, it seems, as well as common, but her time had come when she had to go. She has left us an example to follow. Let us meet her in heaven. She has gone to those friends who have gone before. Our best friend on earth has gone home—our dear mother. God bless our dear mother, what is home without a mother? She was in her sickness like she had been in health, never murmuring. A little while before she died, her husband ask her if he had not better send for another doctor, and she replied, "Wait a little while." Those were her last words. Her school mates in childhood days were true friends in time of rejoicing and trouble, and stood by her bedside when she was passing away. Today we mourn the loss of a true Christian character, a friend and neighbor.

John Moore

John Moore was born, June 9th, 1816, near Zanesville, Perry County, Ohio. Died, December 17th, 1905, at the old homestead where he had lived for more than 65 years, being 89 years, 6 months and 8 days old.

"Uncle John," as he was known by all who knew him, was a man of noble character, charitable, kind and generous, but stern and inflexible in purpose, when he had once fixed his views of right and wrong.

He was twice married. November 14th 1839, he was married to Mary Burns, who died July 1st, 1850, leaving him to care for four little children, Sarah, Margaret, Catherine and Priscilla.

He was married to Sarah Speer, January 8th, 1852, and from this union were born eight children, William, Tolbert, James, Eudora, Agnes, Clara, Grant and George.

The widow, eleven children, twenty-three grand children and eight great-grand-children survive him.

This death being the second link broken in this family for sixty years. The second eldest daughter, Mrs. Margaret Wall, died August 7th, 1905.

Mr. Moore was a member of the Clermont Presbyterian church, more than 55 years. He was ordained a ruling elder in the Clermont church, December 3rd, 1854. While he was a member of this denomination, and true to its teachings, he was always ready to assist all other churches in the cause of Christianity.

He was a pioneer of Indiana, coming to this county and state from Ohio in 1832. He was married to Harriet Duncan, January 10, 1856. To this union were given three sons: Lorenzo M. now of Chicago, Ill.; William H. of Speersmore, Oklahoma and Arthur D. of Davenport, Iowa. While he had not affiliated with any church denomination, he lived an honest, upright life. He was an affectionate husband, and a kind and affectionate father. He leaves a wife, three sons, one sister, Mrs. Mary Beelar, of Zionsville, and a number of nephews and nieces and a host of friends to lament his death.

Henry P. Speer.

Henry P. Speer was born in Marion county, Ind., February 9, 1839, and died in Zionsville, July 5, 1898, aged 59 years, 4 months and 24 days. He and Eliza J. Alford were married February 2, 1865.

To them were given three children, two of whom lived to mature years. Flora Effie, the eldest, became the wife of Rev. J. C. Reeves, and the mother of one child, Clyde Hurst, the only and greatly loved grandchild of Brother and Sister Speer. Little Clyde died in 1893 when about two years of age, and was followed to the spirit world by his mother, September 24, 1896. Brother Speer has now joined them leaving his wife and son Clyde A. to mourn his departure, together with three brothers, Robert, of Stilesville, Thomas, of this place, and Harry, of Mt. Jackson, and two sisters, Mary Beelar, of Zionsville, and Sallie Moore, of Clermont. Brother Speer has resided all his life not far from and for the past fifteen years here in Zionsville. He united with the M. E. church at Jones' Chapel when about 17 years of age under the pastorate of Hezekiah Smith. Though for the past 20 years his health was feeble he continued a teacher in the Sunday school as long as he was able to attend, and always a staunch and faithful friend of the church and pastor. Two years ago the 16th of last May he was stricken with paralysis since which time he has been unable to talk or walk, and his sufferings have been most intense. He often gave signs of wishing to be released, but bore his affliction with remarkable patience and great endurance. Bro. Speer was a kind husband, a tender father, a pleasant cheerful friend and neighbor.

As a soldier in the war of sixties his record is enviable. He enlisted in Company I, 7th Regiment Ind. Vol., September 20, 1861. His regiment moved at once to western Virginia and joined General Reynolds command at Cheat Mountain. On the 3d of October was in the battle of Green Brier. Was again engaged in the battle of Winchester Heights on the 22d of March, 1862. Also in the engagement at Port Republic, June 9th, and

at the battle of Fort Royal on the 12th of the same month. The regiment was with General Pope and was next engaged at Slaughter Mountain on the 9th of August, and in second battle of Bull Run on the 30th of August. It was in the pursuit of General Lee during his invasion of Maryland, and took part in the battle of Antietam on September 17th. It was next in the battle of Fredericksburg under General Burnside December 13th. During the next year 1862, his regiment was at the battle of Chancellorsville on the 2d, 3d and 4th of May; and at Gettysburg on the 1st, 2d, 3d and 4th of July. During the year 1864 he was under General Grant and engaged in all of his great battles and was very severely wounded in front of Petersburg.

William H. Speer.

William H. Speer, for many years the sexton of Mt. Jackson cemetery, died Sunday night at his home adjoining the cemetery, in which he had worked so long. Although he has not been well for several years his death was unexpected. He became worse Thursday and was unconscious Friday. At his bedside were his two nieces, Miss Jennie E. Pugh, who lived with him, and Mrs. A. M. Eyster, who lives in this city, and also a brother and sister of Zionsville. The funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the house. Rev. Thomas Williams of Boston came to conduct the services. He was formerly pastor of the West Washington Street Methodist church and a close friend of Mr. Speer. The Odd Fellows had charge of the burial. There were a large number of friends and relatives at the funeral despite the bad weather. Flowers covered his coffin when lowered into the grave.

Mr. Speer was 68 years old and a veteran of the civil war, having been a member of Company I, Seventh Indiana infantry. He was a member of George H. Thomas Post. He participated in the battles of Antietam, Bull Run and Gettysburg, being wounded during the latter conflict.

His wife, Sarah Harding Speer, to whom he was married in 1865, died three years ago. Ever since that time he has gradually declined talking of her and spending much time at her grave. No children were born to them, but two nieces, Jennie E. Pugh and Anna M. Eyster, lived with them from infancy and were as children to them and to them they gave the love and attention that parents would have given them. Mrs. Mary Beelar, a sister, and Thomas Speer, a brother, both of Zionsville, survive Mr. Speer.

The old sexton was well known in Indianapolis, particularly to those who have friends buried at Mt. Jackson cemetery. The latter was for many years a Baptist burying ground, a church of that denomination having formerly stood within the cemetery's confines. The church has passed out of existence and the cemetery was made a private burying ground by its purchaser, Mr. Speer.

Mr. Speer owned nearly 100 acres of land west of the Asylum, which was purchased by Mrs. Speer's grandfather from the Government at \$1.25 per acre and had remained in the family ever since.
