Dear Mrs Pritchard,

I would like to thank you for your response to the information that I provided you regard Colonel Orion Bartholomew. Yours is the first and only response I have had to about 15 letters that I sent out to Cities and Towns regard four Civil War soldiers that I have pictures of and copies of their records.

You asked how I happened to have a picture of Colonel Bartholomew. Actually I have two pictures of the Colonel, and both are signed by him, and he wrote Danville Indiana on one.

My find and hobbie began when I was asked by my Aunt to come and clean out her attic and cellar for her a couple of years ago. Well the cellar and attic contained many antiques and among them were two old round top trunks. The trunks contained among other items a cigar box with about 75 CDV's "Carte De Viste", or pictures of Civil War soldiers, and some civilian pictures also. About 30 of these cards were signed and the organization the man was in also given.


My Aunt had no knowledge of how they got there as they were property of a border that passed away, and had no family. The borders name was Charles Saulter.

After coming by these cards I began writing to the National Archives for their Military Records. When you apply for records they furnish you with items such as pension records, military records, place of birth, residence before and after service, and place of death. I tried to supply you and others I wrote to the necessary information to trace some of the individuals life.

I have about 100 pages of Colonel Bartholomew's records and they are very interesting documents.

My hopes are to locate some great, or great great grandson or grand-daughter of one of these men, who may be interested in knowing that someone has taken an interest in an early citizen and relative, and to advise Historical Societies such as yours that someone cares and is interested in these early citizens.

Most are signed by the individuals pictured and the unit they served in, along with place of residence being shown in some cases.

I have written to the National Archives in Washington, D.C., and have obtained records on these persons such as military service, pension and death records to authenticate the pictures with these records and signatures.

My purpose is to give a brief outline of statistics on these men to Historical Societies or interested citizens, or even possibly relatives of individuals in cities and towns that their records indicate they had some contact with. I feel that my hobby may be interesting to some of these people.

Any information or response will be greatly appreciated and I will add them to my collection of pictures.

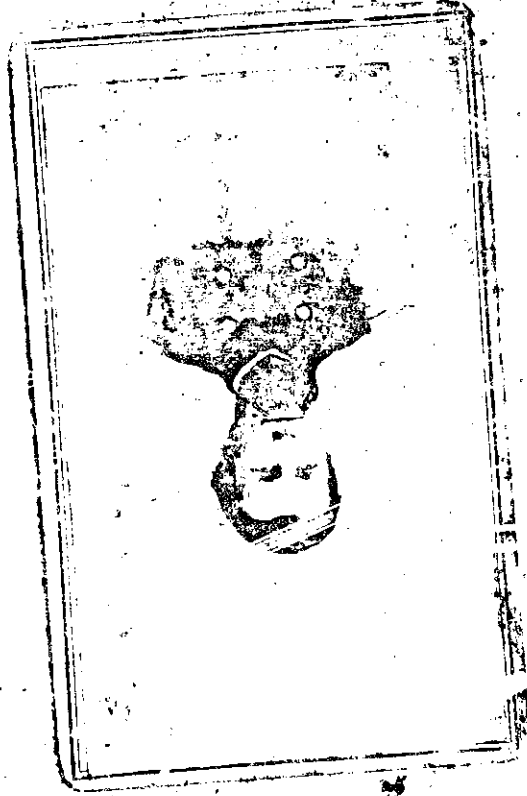

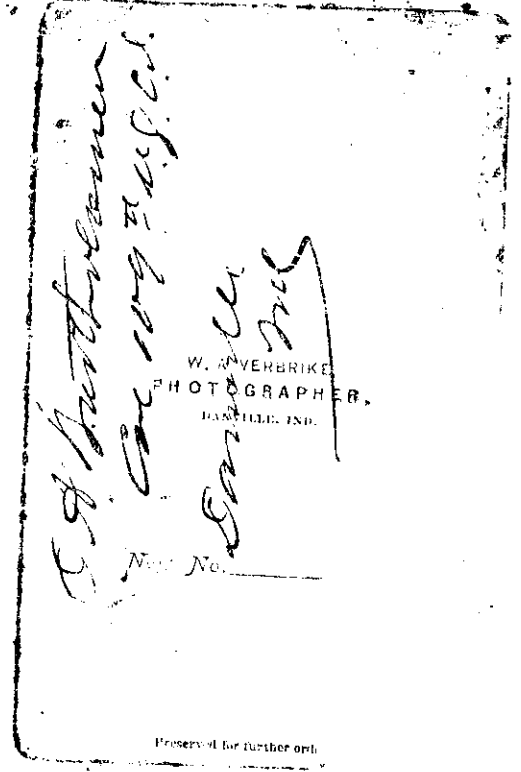

can be prairie land by pairing & hence it  
is the best piece of land I know of any corner  
about here. I can find in one hour and 100 dollars  
if you could let me have about 200 dollars  
in the course of a year I think I could get it  
it is bound to be worth in a short time a

is the good land so look at it last spring  
help me if you can the market here is a bad  
one good as it is in Indiana. I expect to stay  
in this town this winter we are all well

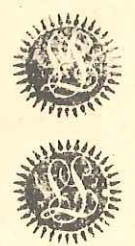
