310 71. ROBERT BOATMAN, bf 1780- bf 1860, of South Carolina and Alabama, son of (31) Waterman Boatman and Dinah Cooper, was married to Martha "Patty" Duke, 1780-1860+. Federal census records indicate residence in South Carolina, Union District (County), in 1820 and 1830, Dekalb County, Alabama in 1840 and Pontotoc County, Mississippi in 1850. Robert is deceased by 1860 and Martha resided with her daughter, Martha Boatman Phillips, in Pontotoc County where it is believed that she died.

FIFTH GENERATION

0 105. MARGARET 'PEGGY' BOATMAN, ca 1778-1850+, of Kentucky, Indiana and Missouri, may be the daughter of (50) Henry Boatman. Peggy Boatman and George Haynes were married on 27 January 1803, recorded in Bourbon County, Kentucky. We believe Henry to be Peggy's father, the only Boatman old enough who remained in the area. However, we continue to search for proof.

George Haines/Haynes/Hains/Hanes/etc. is first found in the records of Nicholas County, Kentucky in the 1810 census on page 52. Living in the household was his wife, two girls, two boys (all under 10) and a male 10 to 16 who may be a child from a previous marriage or, perhaps, a brother to George or Margaret. George made the Nicholas County tax lists of 1811 through 1814 after which he may have moved to some other Kentucky County. George obtained land on 28 November 1817, the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 25, Sparta Township of Dearborn County, Indiana where he appears in the 1820 census in Caesar Creek Township with his large family. The Marion County, Indiana census of 1830 next lists this family. The marriage records of the county contain at least three of the children.

George Haines was born about 1770/80, probably in Pennsylvania, and died about 1845 in Knox County, Missouri. Peggy was also born in Pennsylvania and died in Missouri.

The town of Millersburg, located on the eastern border of Bourbon County near Nicholas County, was established by John Miller, for which, the town was named. More data desired on this family.

108. HANNAH BOATMAN, 1782-1852, of Scott County, Indiana, daughter of (50) Henry Boatman, was born probably in Washington County, Pennsylvania. Hannah's sister (107) Elizabeth, married John Miller, who on 27 April 1804 signed a document to certify that James W. Craig was a responsible person, so that James could marry. James may have been employed by John Miller at the time. Afterwards, on 3 May 1804, James W. Craig and Hannah Boatman were married by J. Barnett, a Methodist circuit rider, who preached in Nicholas and Bourbon Counties.

The 1850 census of Scott County, Vienna Township, Indiana, lists James' age as 65, born in Pennsylvania, a farmer with \$700. in real property. Hannah was listed as age 60, born in Kentucky. They are buried at the Craig Cemetery which can be seen from Interstate 65. The deed to this land was a homestead purchased from the Federal Government, signed by President Andrew Jackson. The deed is now at the Indiana State Museum at Indianapolis.

WILLIAM BOATMAN, ca 1788-1834, of Kentucky, son of (50) Henry Boatman, was first listed on a census in Nicholas County, Kentucky in 1820, age 26 to 45, with female (wife?) same age and three females born between 1804 and 1820. He may have married on 9 April 1816 in Bourbon County, Kentucky to Patsey McIntire, daughter of Robert McIntire, but this would probably be his second marriage. William died late 1834 and George Boatman was administrator of his estate in January 1835.

119. JOHN BOATMAN, ca 1776-1842, farmer, of Kentucky and Indiana, son of (51) Robert Boatman, was born in southwestern Pennsylvania, an area which, in 1781, became Washington County. The first record of John Boatman is his marriage to Elizabeth Hunter on 28 January 1800, recorded Jessamine County. He is probably the same Lt. John Boatman who received his commission on 26 June 1802 in the 9th Regiment of the 'Cornstalk Militia' of Kentucky, so named because arms were scarce and army soldiers drilled with cornstalks in lieu of guns.

John Boatman migrated to Lincoln County, Kentucky before 1810 and settled on 100 acres on the Dix River, east of Crabb Orchard, remaining until the Fall of 1826. He then migrated to Parke County, Indiana and purchased land in Florida Township, sections 19 and 28. He sold his land in Lincoln County in April 1832 to Gentry Isham for \$250.

Elizabeth Hunter Boatman died in Parke County about 1829 and John migrated to Vermillion County, Indiana and married on 28 October 1835 to Catherine Patton, widow of Michael Patton. John and his family appear on the 1840 census of Vermillion County. Gilbert Brown and Hugh Lambert filed an appraisal of the estate of John Boatman on 22 November 1842. A petition to the court to sell real property to settle John Boatman's debts was made on 20 November 1843 and names John's widow and ten heirs. Each heir later received \$16.45 at the time of the settlement, except for Daniel who was living in Missouri and his whereabouts must not have been known.

120. ROBERT BOATMAN, ca 1778-1840+, of Kentucky and Indiana, son of (51) Robert Boatman, was married 5 January 1802 in Jessamine County, Kentucky to Nancy Willis, daughter of Sherrod Willis. This family appears in 1810 census of Jessamine County with five children, all under 10 years of age, 1 son, four daughters. By 1820 there were five sons and four daughters not including one older daughter who had married, died or was living elsewhere. Some of these children are probably siblings of Nancy Willis, raised by this couple.

Robert Boatman remained on 121 acres of third quality land on Hickman Creek through at least 1829 as shown on tax records of Jessamine County. His brother, William, also paid taxes on 121 acres on Hickman Creek, land he received from their father in 1812. Robert made one final census in Jessamine County in 1830 prior to moving to Marion County, Indiana by August 1837 where a daughter appears in the marriage records and he and his family appear in the 1840 census on page 466.

We have been unable to determine when Robert's wife, Nancy, died but certainly prior to 1840 when the female age 30 to 40 would fit his second wife, Mary. Mary was born about 1801 in Kentucky and we believe that she was also a Willis, perhaps the youngest sister of Nancy. Mary and eight children are named in the 1850 census of Warren Township, Marion County. A search of the land records of Marion County do not reflect the property value declared by Mary in that census. Robert died prior to the 1850 census and a settlement of his estate does not appear in extant records of Marion County. Mary and most of her "brood" moved to Sullivan County by 1870 where she obtained or inherited land in Haddon Township. This list of children must be proven in most cases as some are listed due to their being at the correct place at the right time.

320. ROBERT BOATMAN, 1800-1883, farmer of Indiana, Missouri and Texas, son of (119) John Boatman and Elizabeth Hunter, was born in Jessamine County, Kentucky. He spent his youth near Crabb Orchard, Lincoln County and migrated with his parents to Parke County, Indiana in 1826. Robert married in neighboring Vermillion County on 2 April 1829 to Mary 'Polly' Patton, daughter of Michael and Catherine Patton. Mary was born 4 February 1812 and died 23 January 1858. Her marker in Gardner Cemetery on the Dillon Aeschleman farm in Schuyler County, Missouri is the only Boatman marker.

Robert Boatman was an original land owner in Helt Township, Vermillion County, in 1837 where all of his children were born. The 1850 census of the county lists all of his children and the 1860 census of Schuyler County, Missouri lists most of them. A complete listing of the children are found in a recently discovered 'family record' submitted by son, Francis M. Boatman, in his pension application in 1911.

Robert was married second to Elizabeth McGowan Davis, widow of William Davis, and the daughter of James McGowan and Sarah Carder. The marriage was on 30 July 1863 and recorded in Collin County. Interesting letters which he wrote to his family from Weston, Collin County, Texas from 1866 through 1870 are retained by descendants. His grave in Bolivar Cemetery in Neighboring Denton County is marked by a weathered but impressive slab.

William Boatman married on 7 July 1853 to Sarah Ann Ashbrook, recorded in Sullivan County. Sarah was the same age as her second step-son, Levi, and 32 years younger than William. She was born in Sullivan County 14 June 1834 and died at Sherman, Texas 11 September 1907. ~~One source names her maiden name as Fisher, information which deserves to be investigated.~~

The family remained in Sullivan County for ten years where William farmed in Haddon Township. William moved with his second family in 1869 to Wright County, Missouri where he purchased a small farm near Hartville. He remained only a short while because the next child, Charles, was born in 1872 at Weston, Collin County, Texas where William's brother, (320) Robert, lived. The family lived for a short time in Brown County about 1876 where (1009) Levi had settled and, in the late 1870s in Waco, McLennan County, Texas, the birthplace of the last child. They settled in Sherman, Grayson County in

1880, buying land that they farmed - now King Street to the Central Railroad - to the other side of the Community Hospital, formerly St. Vincents Hospital. They built a log cabin (see inset) which later was a part of a two story, 'T' shaped house with two rooms facing north, the kitchen south, two upstairs rooms with outside stairs. The main house was connected to the old log house by an overhead toolshed under which the wagons were sheltered.

William died in 1883 from injuries received from a fall from his horse. He and his young son, Eli, were riding on horseback when a ghostly figure jumped from behind a cottonwood tree on their farm, spooked the horse which bucked them off. William died, Eli's chest was crushed but he recovered. Sarah continued to farm with the help

of the sons until they married and left home. The 1900 census of Grayson County, ED #99, Precinct #1, page 17, lists the family of Sarah A. Boatman: sons Eli and Robert; daughter-in-law Mattie J.; grandchildren Thomas W., Jesse A. and Cora L. Boatman.

The compiler of this data has searched and scratched for data on this family and, until now (Mar 1984), had uncovered little on William and his second family. With the unexpected discovery of cousin (4004) Hazel Boatman we now have an old chronicle of the entire family, data which is recorded in an old 1840 dictionary, now crumbling and falling apart. This excellent record of the family has raised one question, that of the birthdate of William Boatman and his first wife, Eliza Jane Laney. There seems to be exactly ten years error, the year of both appearing to be 1812 rather than 1802 which, the latter, would be correct if the census taker recorded their ages correctly in 1850 as 47 years old.

The 1860 through 1880 censuses of Randolph County lists the family near Cairo, Missouri, where they remained. Wesley and Margaret Boatman are buried at Antioch Cemetery, 3½ miles east of Moberly off highway 24.

This census also lists another male, age 20 to 30, in the household. The 1850 census of Garrard County, Kentucky lists Nelson, Elizabeth and five children. We believe that the family moved to Cass County, Illinois prior to 1867, perhaps during the War.

347. LORENZO D. BOATMAN, ca 1811-1862, Farmer, of Indiana and Missouri, son of (121) William C. Boatman and Elizabeth Willis, was born in Jessamine County, Kentucky, migrated with his parents to Sullivan County, Indiana in the fall of 1826. He married on 17 November 1833 his cousin, (328) Sarah A. Boatman, daughter of John and Elizabeth Hunter Boatman.

This family was enumerated on page 51 of the 1840 Federal Census, Missouri Township, Scott County, Missouri. Sarah's brother, (323) Daniel, was listed on the same census page. Lorenzo returned to Indiana by 1850 and lived in Parke County, Florida Township, amid Sarah's relatives. The young John Boatman living with them in the 1850 census could be Daniel's son as he is not mentioned in the Bible record of this family. The families of Lorenzo and Robert moved to Christian County, Missouri by 1860 and to Conway County, Arkansas before the outbreak of the war in 1862.

The Civil War took it's terrible toll of this family. Five sons entered the service of the United States and only one survived the war. Lorenzo was not accepted into service due to infirmity but he did die while following his sons' regiment. Following the war, the estate settlement of the grandfather, (121) William C. Boatman, resulted in the naming of the surviving heirs. Lorenzo had died intestate and only his wife Sarah, daughters, Elizabeth Followill, Eliza A. Miller and Martha E. Boatman, were named for this share of the estate. Robert was not listed as an heir as the family may not have known of his existence since he returned to Arkansas. He was born in Jessamine County, Kentucky and married in Sullivan County, Indiana about 1837 where he, his wife, Catherine Elizabeth Allumbaugh, and two daughters appear on the 1840 Federal Census. The census also gives us the information that John was employed in manufacturing or other occupation (not agriculture) and did not first pursue agriculture as did his brothers, George and Lorenzo.

John Boatman was a resident of Hopkins County, Texas on 13 February 1854 and on 28 April 1859 he received 160 acres of public land that he had settled upon and which he had made improvements for at least three years. The war apparently caused this family to return northward to Missouri, then the Territory of Nebraska by 1863. Elizabeth Allumbaugh was named as heir of Nancy Baker (Barker?),

heir of John Turpin of Madison County, Kentucky, on 9 July 1863, at which time she and her husband were declared residents of Richardson County, Territory of Nebraska, Catherine Elizabeth Allumbaugh was the daughter of Peter and Sally Ross Allumbaugh who were married on 16 April 1804 in Madison County, Kentucky.

Nancy was born about 1818 and died about 1905/6 at Kent, Sherman County, Oregon.

Oliver took his family west with his father-in-law to Buchanan County, Missouri about 1848 and was enumerated in the 1850 Federal Census. By 1860 they were living in Jackson Township, Johnson County, Missouri. The widowed mother-in-law was living with them. The 1870 census lists the family in Richardson County, Nebraska, Falls City, Post Office. 40 1005. FRANCIS MARION BOATMAN, 1841-1913, farmer of Missouri, Colorado and California, son of (320) Robert Boatman and Mary Patton, was born in Vermillion County, Indiana. He was married on 21 December 1865 to Mary E. Israel, recorded Schuyler County Missouri.

Marion made an application for pension on 15 September 1887, requesting compensation for injuries suffered in the War. He was then a resident of Wray, Washington County, Colorado and stated that he enlisted on 19 April 1861 in Company "I", 14th Indiana Volunteer Infantry. He received a gunshot wound in the left knee at the Battle of the Wilderness in Virginia on 6 May 1864 and another gunshot wound in the right wrist at Chancelorville, Virginia 2 May 1863. He was discharged at Indianapolis on 20 June 1864 and enlisted on 6 September 1864 under the name of his brother, (1000) Michael P. Boatman, and served in Company "G", 42nd Regt. Missouri Volunteers Infantry. He thus filled his brother's military obligation.

This couple moved to California about 1888 and on 19 July 1911, while a resident of Hayward, Marion filed an affidavit which contained the data from the Robert Boatman Bible. 1065. WILLIS BOATMAN, 1826-1926, of Indiana and Washington, son of (332) Jacob Boatman and Elazeer Willis, was born in Jessamine County, Kentucky. Census records indicate that Willis Boatman was the first of the name 'Boatman' to span our new nation, to reach the Pacific coast. There may have been others to have reached the coast during the gold rush to California but we have heard no such stories. Our Boatmans seemed to have been hard working dirt farmers who were not lured by tales of gold and get rich schemes. If there were Boatmans in the gold rush, they did not stay and it was 1880 before a Boatman was in the census of California.

Willis Boatman and his wife, Mary Ann Richardson, are listed in the 1900 census of Pierce County, Washington. Also listed in 1900 census of Pierce County is Earnest Boatman. Mrs. Boatman died 11 November 1911 at the age of 76. Mr Boatman died 2 January 1926 at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Caddie Horning of Sumner, Washington.

'Mr. and Mrs. W.N. Boatman of Mexico, Missouri, observed their sixtyseventh wedding anniversary here yesterday. Boatman will be ninety years old Saturday while Mrs. Boatman is eighty-five. Mrs. Boatman recalled that their honeymoon was a buggy ride from Evansville, Missouri where they were married to Centralia, Missouri. Mr. Boatman's birthday in 1860 fell on Saturday and, as only slaves were married on Saturday, the couple changed their marriage plans and were married on Wednesday.'

Evansville, Missouri, not listed on most modern maps, is located about ten miles east of Moberly. The buggy ride to Centralia totaled about 25 miles. Edna Elizabeth Watts was born 2 February 1842 at Evansville and was yet living on 27 August 1927 when she signed an affidavit attesting to the health of her son, Roy, upon his return home from the Spanish American War. Edna died at Mexico, Missouri on 12 October 1928 and buried at Mexico Cemetery with her husband. Edna was the daughter of John Watts and Elizabeth Griggs.

William N. Boatman and his family are listed on page 343, Cairo, Randolph County, Missouri, 1870 census and in 1880 at 222 E. Monroe Street, Mexico, Audrain County. The 1900 census of Audrain County lists William, Edna, a daughter and a grandson, all living at 222 E. Monroe Street. A Bible record in possession of a grandson, James D. Boatman, Jr., lists ten

1170. WILLIAM BOATMAN, ~~1834~~ 1834-1862, of Missouri and Arkansas, 74 son of (347) Lorenzo Boatman and (328) Sarah A. Boatman, was born in Indiana, in Sullivan or Parke County, Married Lucretia J. "Cressie" Cooper on 25 March 1855 at Barton County, Missouri, by James H. Zeveryly, J.P. The marriage was recorded at Jasper County from which Barton had been formed earlier that year. William and Cressie lived in Willow Spring Township, Howell County, Missouri at the time of the 1860 census and there were two children. They moved to Newton County, Arkansas prior to the war. William's brothers, George, Perry and Robert, enlisted in the Union Army on 10 June 1862 and William also joined on 7 August 1862. A statement by his widow in March 1866 states that his death occurred at "Springfield, Missouri on 10 October 1862 by fever contracted while in the service of the United States as, Private, Company "E", commanded by Captain Charles Galloway". A claim for Minor's Pension in 1870 contains the following declaration:

"The 2d Auditor shows he was enrolled Aug. 7, 1862 and the Adj. Gen'l U.S.A. and of Ark. show that he died Dec. 21st 1862, the latter states that the place of death and character of disease not specified. The affidavit of John Flood & Joseph Pearce of Co "K" 1st Ark's Cav. shows that they were personally acquainted with the soldier & that he was mustered in the service about the month of Sept. 1862, for three years and that he died at Springfield, Mo on or about the 17th day of Oct. A.D. 1862 of Flux & Fever contracted while he was in the service and in the line of his duty. They know the fact from having been with the soldier when he was taken sick and attending him when he died. It is impossible to obtain the testimony of an officer or surgeon as they are (not) now residents of the state."

William's widow, Cressie Cooper, claim for pension was denied as she died 22 June 1869 at Vendor, Arkansas before action could be taken. The wheels of government turned slowly even in those days and the plight of these orphans must have been very dire except for the actions of relatives and friends. Lemuel R. Jones, of White Township, Newton County, executed on 7 December 1869 a Declaration as Guardian of the three minor children of William Boatman. The daughter, ten year old Victoria, lived with her aunt and uncle, John and Emeline Cooper Flood, at the time of the 1870 census, (page 14, Newton County, Arkansas)

This has been a very difficult line to trace and the combined efforts of many researchers have resulted in conclusive evidence of the parentage of William Boatman. The persistence of Russell Criner, and others, has resulted in a connecting link to the Boatmans of Sullivan and Parke County, Indiana—though this theory is not accepted by all concerned.

Robert Boatman enlisted for six months as Private, Company 'B', 1st Arkansas Infantry Volunteers, Kelsey's Company, on 10 June 1862 and mustered out 31 December 1862. He re-enlisted on that date at Benton Barracks, Missouri and served for six more months. Robert, unlike four of his brothers, survived the war and lived later at Conway County, Arkansas, near Morrilton. The 1870 census of Griffin Township, Springfield Post Office, on page 3, lists Robert, wife, Sarah, and his son, Houston. His first wife, Sarah Miller, died on 1 March 1871, age 23, and Robert remarried on 17 September 1872 to Malissa Perine and had at least two children. Malissa was born in October 1844 and died 24 December 1916.
