BURNS, JOHN T., P.O. Brownsburg; Att'y; son of Henry F. and Sarah (Thomas) Burns; was born in Fleming Co., Ky., July 8, 1833 and settled in this county in 1858. Married, March 19, 1858, to Parthenia Ann Nash; children - Maria Frances, Eudora Jane, Walter Landor. Mr. Burns was a member of Legislature in 1865; was File Clerk in House of Representatives in 1867.

Notes: The T. stands for Thomas for his middle name.
Later they had a fourth child Lou (female).

PARTHENIA ANN (NASH) BURNS

Parthenia Ann (Nash) Burns (b. 5-11-1837 d. 6-12-1920) was the daughter of Richard and Frances (Smith) Nash. Richard Nash's parents were Thomas and Hannah (Brown) Nash. Richard was born 2-29-1912 and died 7-4-1860 while Frances, his wife, was born 1-15-1814 to (Joel or Bailey.) Smith and wife.

Parthenia Ann (Nash) Burns was married to John Thomas Burns on 3-18-1859. John Thomas Burns was born 7-18-1833 and died 1-22-1889. He was the son of Henry F. and Sarah (Thomas) Burns. John Thomas Burns was a member of Legislature in 1865 and was file clerk in House of Representatives in 1867.

John Thomas and Parthenia Ann (Nash) Burns had four children: Maria Frances, Eudora Jane, Walter Landor, and Lucretia. Maria Frances (b. 1-27-1860 d. 2-11-1932 2-11-1932) was married on 3-2-1879 to Everett Twilley Hopkins (b. 1-19-1854 d. 11-22-1937) who was the grandson of Richard (b. 9-18-1774 d. 6-30-1810) and Elizabeth (Twilley) Hopkins (b. 3-12-1779 d. 8-5-1835). He (Everett) was the son of William (b. 1-17-1809 d. 12-31-1891) and Ruah Ann (Harding) Hopkins (b. 10-26-1822 d. 11-24-1907).

The three children born to Everett Twilley and Maria Frances (Burns) Hopkins were Harry Harding Hopkins, Frank Burns Hopkins and Mary Ludora (Hopkins) Edmondson. Harry Harding Hopkins was born 2-23-1880 and died 5-17-1967. On 1-23-1910 Harry Harding Hopkins married Indiana ("India") McKee (Catterson (b. 8-28-1877 d. 11-18-1924), who was the daughter of James Patrick (b. 3-20-1827 d. 9-25-1909) and Emerine Turpin (McKee) Catterson (b. 7-8-1834 d. 11-15-1913).

Harry Harding and Indiana (Catterson) Hopkins were the parents of the following children: James Howard Hopkins, William Everett Hopkins, Emma Frances (Hopkins) English, and Mary Eloise (Hopkins) Castetter.

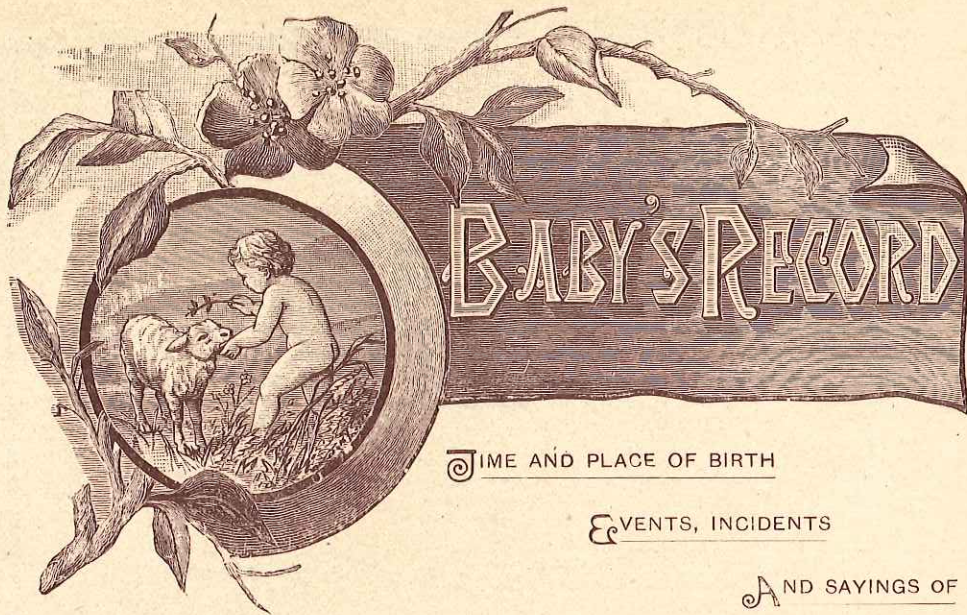

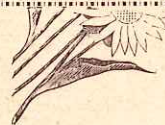

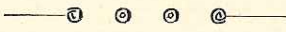
