

CLARK FAMILY

James Clark was born in Belfast, Ireland in 1750.

He came to America, when he married Alice ~~Arbuckle~~, about the beginning of the Revolutionary War. They settled in Greenbrier Co., Virginia. He fought in the Revolution as a Frontier Border Soldier. Alice ~~Arbuckle~~, was born in 1755. Died in 1820. James Clark, died in Clark Co., Kentucky 1806.

~~omit~~ The Aruckles lived in Augusta Co. Va. previous to 1769. Colonial Militia records list John, James, and Matthew Aruckle, in an Augusta Co. company of 1759. Augusta Co. records speak of James Aruckle, and two sons serving in Sayer's Co. of Militia in 1759.

Alice Aruckle, was probably a daughter of James Aruckle, and a sister of Matthew and James.

It is known that Matthew Aruckle, went to Greenbrier Co. Va. in 1769.

Capt. Matthew Aruckle, was one of the most experienced woodmen and Indian fighters of his time. He was born about 1742 and removed to the upper James while young. In 1765 with one or two companions he explored the Kanawha Valley, to the Ohio. They were the first white men to pass this way except prisoners of the Indians. In 1776 he was sent to command Fort Randolph. At this important post he remained for three years and was in charge of a constable who was killed.

The following record of the Revolutionary service of James Clark, was found in the Williamsburg Historical Library by a descendant.

I written to the Clark Mr. T. N. Hadley, put me on the track of you all. I want you to give me the full history of Joseph, and Nancy's, children and William's, family and Polly, and Dickerson. One of my daughters died Nov. the 11th. She was married and had one child, it died Oct. the 26, 1870. I have four daughters married, 2 single daughters one son living, he is 17 years old. My youngest is a daughter. She is twelve years old. I am going on 60 one years old Polly 56 years. I have five grandchildren.

I had a hard time with the rebels and guerrillas. I was radical from the top of my head to the bottom of my foot that was the reason the rebels were so hard on me that kept me on the scout for months and years I lived in the middle of rebeldom. I am for the right of suffrage. I am in hopes that I will live to see the white ladies have the right of suffrage too. This leaves us all well."

Genealogy of the Miles Family

John Miles, son of Thomas and Sarah Green Miles was born January 30, 1814, in Pasquotank County, North Carolina. John Miles' parents were born in England. His father came to the United States to get away from an older brother who was domineering. Thomas Miles was a sea captain and settled in North Carolina. Sarah Green Miles died when John was four years of age, and his father died when he was seven. John and his sister Martha were bound out to Quaker families. The family John lived with came to Washington County, Indiana. He drove a cart through when only a boy. Later the family Martha lived with came to Washington County. They always kept in touch with each other, for they were very devoted. The treatment John received from his master was unsatisfactory; if he didn't open the gate for him when he returned after being away, he would get whipped, and if he did he would be whipped for leaving his work, so he ran away. He first hired to a blacksmith, but on account of hot cinders dropping on his bare feet he gave that up, and came to Belleville, Indiana. He met Uncle Tommy Irons coming into Belleville on horseback and inquired of him where he could find work. Uncle Tommy turned in the saddle, and pointing to a house on the hill south of Belleville told him there was a good old lady living back there, to stop and see what she would do for him. He stopped and she took him in, and he worked for Uncle Tommy and Aunt Sara Irons for years at twenty-five cents a day. Uncle Tommy took the contract for digging the Clay County canal and he sent John to oversee the work. They made some money. John took his part, and bought a piece of land three quarters of a mile west of Belleville. He cleared this and on April 6, 1840, he married Elizabeth, daughter of John and Mary Vestal Hollingsworth. They were very prosperous and accumulated a great many acres of fine farming land. John's sister, Martha, married Maxemum White in Washington County. Some years later they came to a farm south of Belleville. They both reared large families. Thomas White of Belleville and Samuel Miles of Webb City, Missouri, are the only ones living. John Hollingsworth, Elizabeth Miles' father lived in South Carolina, hearing Charleston had been fired upon in the War of 1812, he took his family to Ohio. He came to Indiana and settled two miles and a half northwest of Plainfield. He built a log cabin, and their food consisted mostly of wild game. They made their own sugar and molasses from sugar trees. They raised flax and spun and wove their clothing. Elizabeth told her children that she had lain awake at night and heard the big timber wolves run over the roof of their cabin. Money was so scarce in those days that economy was practiced severely. Girls would carry their shoes and hose near the church and then put them on; and when they were out of sight on their way home would take them off and carry them. Hardship was the password in those days. Aunt Lizzie, as she was called, died at her home June 29, 1885. She was laid to rest in the family lot in the Irons cemetery.

After the home was broken up, Uncle Johnnie, as the neighbors knew him, went to make his home with his son Albert, who lived on what was known as the Irons farm. He lacked seven days of living a year after the death of his wife, the date being June 22, 1886. Aunt Martha Miles White, that dear old Quaker lady, remarked at her brother's funeral, "I won't live long without brother," and in August she fell asleep.
