HOWARD AND SARAH GERTRUDE HURIN COX

Howard Cox (October 13, 1869 - July 15, 1956) was the 9th child of Daniel and Elizabeth Little Cox. He was probably born in Washington Township, Hendricks County, near Plainfield, IN. He was reared on the Fairview farm in Liberty Township, Hendricks County about a mile north east of Cartersburg, IN.

He attended school at Cartersburg, about a mile from his home. He has told of ice skating to school over the fields and fences when the snow was deep and ice-coated. During his younger years he was a member of the Cartersburg foot ball team, a picture of which, with names of the team members, appears in the Cox family genealogy book.

In the years 18 to 18, he attended DePauw University. It was his desire to become a dentist. His parents, however, had other ideas, so he became a farmer.

During his youth he took up photography, developing his film and printing the pictures. In 1893, during the World's Fair, he got a job in a restaurant where the owner told the employees they could not eat the cooked oysters. Consequently, they probably ate more raw ones than they would have eaten otherwise. Sometime in the 1890's Howard made a trip to California where he visited some Lindley cousins.

After he married (July 18, 1900) Sarah Gertrude Hurin (Aug. 29, 1869 - Feb. 15 1920), daughter of Enos and Elizabeth Faulkner Hurin, they bought a farm on 10th Street Road, three miles east and one mile north of Danville, Center Township, Hendricks County, Indiana. They lived here until they died except for probably a year when they lived at Cartersburg with Howard's mother while their own house was being remodeled. According to tax records, this was during the year 1904.

Sarah Gertrude (Gertie) Hurin Cox was born south of Avon, Indiana on Morris Street Road. Howard and Gertrude were married at the home of her mother, Elizabeth Hurin. Both Daniel Cox and Enos Hurin had died in 1890.

Howard had 8 brothers and 2 sisters, all of whom, with the exception of one brother, lived to maturity. Gertrude had 3 brothers and 4 sisters. Two brothers and one sister died young.

To Howard and Gertrude were born two children, Gladys Marie and Grace Elizabeth.

Howard was a member of the Clayton Christian Church, eventually moving his membership to Danville Christian Church. Gertrude was a member of the Avon Methodist Episcopal Church, but since Bartlett's Chapel M. E. Church was a mile

and a half from their home, they attended church there.

Howard belonged to the IOOF Lodge at Plainfield. He was also a member of the Crafton Threshing Club, serving as Sec-Treas. most of the time since he was exceptionally adept at figuring what each member owed or was owed for the work, teams and wagons, etc. He was also treasurer of the 20th Century Sunday School Class at the Danville Christian Church many years.

Gertrude was a member of Rebecca Lodge, Avon Girls Reading and Sewing Circle, and Crafton Home Economics Club.

At the end of the threshing season, it was customary for the Thresing Club and their families to have an ice cream social at the home of one of the members at which time the accounts were settled. It was a social occasion, too, and at one of these, Gertrude won a "hobble skirt" race. No prize was mentioned.

Howard was 5'6" tall with brown hair and weighed about 175 pounds. Gertrude was 5'6" tall with black hair and she weighed about 140 pounds.

In the late teens, Howard bought his first automobile, a Model T Ford. To have progressed from the horse and buggy or carriage age to an "auto" which even had a self-starter and shock absorbers extras on it proved to be quite a memorable event in the lives of the Cox family.

Howard and Gertrude belonged to a neighborhood butchering ring. On cold winter mornings, when a member decided to kill hogs, the neighbors came early. The family was up much earlier to get huge iron kettles of water on and boiling, ready to scald the hogs as they were killed. Then followed cutting them up into hams, shoulders, and all the other cuts. All this was done by the men. The women came to help in the kitchen with the meals and to season and mix the sausage. The last task was to render the lard and this fell to the men. Since Howard seemed to have a special expertise in the cooking of the lard, he usually had that last job. Sometimes, if things went quite well, the women got the sausage seasoned and mixed and put into gallon stone jars then baked in the oven ready to store for the year's use.

Both Howard and Gertrude had musical talent. Gertrude played the organ while Howard played the Jew's Harp. Both were well known for their singing voices and were often called upon to sing at funerals. Howard's father, Daniel Cox, was a singing teacher. Gertrude and her sister, Tillie Hurin, were in his classes. At one time he reportedly said Gertrude was the best bass singer in his class. She sang bass in a quartette at one time. Both Howard and Gertrude were active in all community affairs.

INTERESTING INCIDENTS THAT HAPPENED IN HOWARD & GERTRUDE'S LIVES

One Sunday night, as the family went to church by way of horse and carriage, they ran over a skunk, much to the dismay of all concerned.

One day, when automobiles were rare, Gertrude, with the girls, was driving "Old Sol", the buggy horse, on the way to visit her sister, Louisa Kocher. Much to the horse's consternation, they met an automobile on the "Alva Smith" hill and the horse refused to go on. The men got out of the automobile and led the frightened horse past, a very difficult task indeed. The horse remembered the incident on the way home, too.

Another occasion when the neighbors worked together was during the haying season. At these times, they gathered at various homes and the women came to help cook for the "hay hands".

Christmas trees were not a frequent treat at the Cox home. One that is remembered was first used at the school and brought home afterwards. Another time Howard cut one from the Charlie Gorrell place. The girls had longed for that tree as they passed by and were devastated when they saw it was gone. Of course they were delighted later when they learned that it was their father who had cut the tree.

Periodically for several years, Gertrude took Gladys to Dr. Adams in Indianapolis. Usually Grace was left at a neighbors, Charlie and Gertie Gorrell, to play with their grandchildren, Helen, Ruby and Laura Mae Marker. At other times, Grace went with them on the interurban to Indianapolis. When she did, Dr. Adams gave her a little bottle of many colored pills, about the size of a pin head...probably sugar pills.

Howard, Gertrude and the girls often attended the Cartersburg Old Settlers Picnic. The Merry-go-round might have been the only ride available to the girls, but they were never allowed to ride, probably because there was not enough money for such things.

Another favorite outing, usually an annual one, was the basket dinner at the Plainfield Friends Yearly Meeting. All the relatives spread their contributions to the dinner on a table cloth on the ground near where the horses were hitched at the hitching rack. Of course food was taken for the horses, too.

Shortly after Howard bought the Ford, the family went to the State Fair. This, again, required a picnic dinner. This was spread out near the parked

auto. Other outings that required a picnic dinner most years were the Little Family and the Ross Family reunions.

Another event to be remembered was going to Avon at night to see Mrs. Wiggs of the Cabbage Patch performed by local talent; and there also was the Womanless Wedding acted by the men of the Clayton (Indiana) Community.

When Howard was about four years old, his sister was being married, but the family thought he was too young to attend the wedding. He was so upset by that decision that the family caught him just in time to prevent him from pulling the table cloth off the table which was set ready for the wedding reception.

As men were building a barn at the Daniel Cox farm, they had to carry a heavy timber to be used next. Before they started, they told Howard to watch to see that "Coddle", one of the workman was not riding. When they had gone a short distance, Howard yelled, "Coddle's riding! Coddle's riding!" This proved almost disastrous for the timber carriers!

When Howard was a youngster, he was out where men were putting up hay and someway his finger was caught in the hay rope. Today that would have caused no serious problem, but it wasn't taken care of properly then, so it grew together in such a way that the finger was bent at a right angle from the first joint.

When the threshers decided to do away with the big threshing dinners, they each carried their dinner with them. After that Gladys and Grace enjoyed driving the Model T to the place where the threshers were to take a hot meal to their father. Fodder shredders, however, continued eating where they were working, as did the silo fillers.

The one wedding that the Howard Cox family attended together was that of Gertrude's nephew, Arthur Paul Jordan. He married Hazel Anna Price at the home of her parents located on the west side of the Hendricks-Marion County road.

Other interesting events which the Cox family took in were the Dog and Pony Show and the Circus, held at the Fair Grounds which was then located on the west edge of Danville in the vicinity of where the high school stands in 1984. Other outstanding events were the Chatauquae which were week-long yearly programs held in a large tent on East Broadway Street in Danville. The tent contained a large stage and had saw-dust aisles. Programs were put on by mostly imported talent and the Cox family enjoyed some of these.

Howard grew fine corn for seed and displayed at the County Fair. He usually won blue ribbons, some red, and his corn was for sale.

In addition to grain crops, Howard raised cattle, sheep and hogs. Gertrude raised chickens and turkeys. She also made butter which she delivered to families in Danville and sometimes to the groceries. When the huckster wagon came by, she sold butter, eggs and chickens to him. One time, when the huckster came to the door, Gertrude, thinking it was Gladys and Grace, called out, "Come in if your nose is clean." Of course she was embarrassed and apologetic!

For a number of years the Atlantic and Pacific Tea Company horse-drawn wagon stopped at the Cox house. He was called the "Teaman", and from him Gertrude bought spices, baking powder, tea, coffee, etc. With each purchase, she received tickets according to the amount of purchase. As they accumulated she exchanged them for Bavarian China dishes ... plates, cups and saucers and sauce dishes ... what appeared to be a mahogany rocking chair, another sewing-rocking chair for Gladys, and a throw rug.

The Cox family had a wall telephone in the early years, with a crank on the side. To get "Central", one rang one long ring. Also, one could ring one or two longs and one or two shorts to "Ring up" persons on the party line. Listening in on calls was a common practice. One person on this particular line listened in more than any one else, but when she thought someone was listening in on her, she was furious and let it be known in no uncertain terms. She used the line more than anyone else on the line. In fact, she kept others from using their phones. For Gertrude to call her folk at Avon was a toll call, except at specified times in the morning and afternoon, providing someone else didn't get the line first.

Bartletts Chapel Church held an annual Sunday School picnic at Cartersburg springs or at Camp Short, events which the Cox family enjoyed when they could go.

Howard taught Gladys and Grace to drive the Model T Ford. One was not required to have a driver's license at that time. The girls felt quite important when they were allowed to drive the car to take the laundry to Beason's, about a mile and a half from their home, or to go pick up the laundry. Neither forgot whose "turn" it was to drive, as neither forgot whose "turn" it was to eat the chicken liver.

Both girls were taught to put in and tend the garden which included a large strawberry patch. That patch was large enough to have neighbors come in and pick on shares. They were early taught to milk cows. Sometimes Howard allowed them to drive the team of horses to the harrow or roller to prepare the ground for planting. Those were the only pieces of machinery the girls were allowed to hendle with the team. Sometimes, during harvest time, the girls helped shock wheat and husk corm.

Some years in the early fall, Howard arose very early, did chores, hitched the team to the big wagon, with box bed on it, and drove to the coal mines near Brazil, Indiana. There he loaded the wagon with coal, after which he drove home. This was a long tiring trip. The next day the family helped to transfer the coal from the wagon into the coal bins. The family thus were warmed twice by that coal. It was used in the cook stove as well as in the heating stove. Sometimes wood was used to supplement the coal

Another morning that required early rising was on days when stock was ready to take to the stockyards. Someone who had a stock rack for their big wagon came and the stock was loaded into the wagon. Then a long drive to the Indianapolis stockyards. Howard generally rode along with the person driving and stayed until the stock sold, then returned home via Interurban. In later years when trucks came into use for that purpose, he hired the truck driver for the chore.

When Gladys and Grace came down with the measles, Howard became ill, too. The consternation at that time was that the family doctor was sure <u>his</u> illness was smallpox. The County Health Officer was called for consultation. They finally diagnosed Howard as having measles, too.

Howard had acquired a Samson tractor. It had iron wheels. One time the tractor was out of running order, so he hitched the team of horses to it to pull it. For some reason the horses stopped with a wheel on Howard's foot. Impossible! But Howard and Grace moved the tractor which two horses found hard to move. Luckily no bones were broken. Since Howard immediately put the team into the barn, went to the house, heated a vinegar and salt solution and soaked his foot in that several times that day, his foot showed very little bruise and was not very sore. He did limp a little.

GLADYS MARIE COX SHEPHERD 1904 - 1984

Gladys Marie Cox was born April 9, 1904, the first child of Howard and Sarah Gertrude Hurin Cox. It is thought that Howard and Gertrude were living with his mother, Elizabeth Little Cox at the time, at Cartersburg, Indiana.

Gladys attended grade school at Jordan School about a mile and a half from the Howard Cox Tenth Street home. Jordan School was located about half a mile west of the Gale Road on the south side of the Rockville Road, now known as U S Highway 36. She usually walked to school until she was ready for the eighth grade. At that time, for some reason, a school "hack" took Gladys and her sister, Grace, to Brown School, which was two miles from their home.

She attended Danville High School, walking one mile to the interurban most of the time, but when Floyd and Geraldine Jones were in high school, she rode into Danville with them in their automobile.

After she graduated from high school, in 1922, she attended Central Normal College where she acquired a teacher's license. Her first year of teaching was spent at Wolf Run, Ohio and the second year she taught at Monroeville, Ohio.

It was during this time that she met William McClave Shepherd at Circle Green Methodist Episcopal Church and they were married April 29, 1926, at the East Springfield M. E. Church. Their post office address was Bergholz, Ohio, Jefferson County. But after a time, Circle Green was no more and they attended East Springfield M. E. Church. In 1957, they sold their farm, which had been the Shepherd family homestead, and moved to Cavallo, Ohio, near Danville, Ohio, where they attended the Methodist Church.

To them were born seven children: Sarah Anna, b. 2-17-1927 d. 12-28-1927 who was fatally burned in a fire caused by a spark from the fire place which ignighted the clothes in her baby buggy while her mother, Gladys, was out doing chores; Howard Simon, b. 12-28-1928; Myrtle Alice, b. 5-4-1930; Alva Metro, b. 5-2-1933; Florence Marie, b. 5-11-1936; Beulah Elizabeth, b. 10-27-1938; Josephine Louise, b. 6-4-1940

After William (Will) Shepherd quit farming, he was employed by Carrol Co. Electric. from which he retired in 1956. At their Cavallo home, they raised a

few stock, but Will suffered a ruptured appendix, from which he never recovered and he died September 7, 1962.

Throughout her married life, Gladys was a saleswoman for different companies, the last of which was the Stanley Products Company. Following this, she worked at Mt. Vernon State Institute as a foster grandmother, a work she enjoyed until her eye sight became so impaired that she had to give up driving.

A light stroke which affected her right side, caused her to have to spend her winters with her daughters, Florence and Myrtle, and some of the time with a son, Alva. In 1982, she was forced to have a leg amputated below the knee, a condition caused by poor circulation. Undaunted, however, she soon learned to walk quite well with an artificial limb until a spur formed on the end of the bone which prevented her from continuing the use of the limb.

A severe stroke came on October 3, which caused her death on October 6, 1984. She is survived by 6 children, 20 grandchildren, 17 treat grandchildren, and one sister, Grace Cox. Two grandchildren, Rebecca and Brenda Uhl, preceeded her in death.

SOME INTERESTING EVENTS IN THE LIVES OF WILL AND GLADYS

While in grade school, one of Gladys' teachers, Anna Lockhart, refused to give her a perfect attendance record when she had to be sent home on the last day of school with the mumps.

Will sang in the choir at church and was tenor in a barbershop quartette.

Gladys and Will didn't get out much because means of transportation was usually "shanks mares." They did take the children to Grange meetings at times.

One very exciting meeting which they attended was an REA meeting at Montgomery School, at which it was decided to run the electric line past their place so they could have electric lights. What a difference those lights in each room made! In the early 1940's, Will had their house wired for lights. When Gladys returned from the grocery store, she hunted and hunted for the lamps. Finally she asked Will where the lamps were, and he told her to turn on the lights! What a thrill!

Will, who had very long legs, used to walk three and a half miles to church and take 5-year-old Florence and a neighbor girl with him. Imagine those little girls trying to keep up with Will's long strides!

After Gladys' eye sight became badly impaired, one of her greatest joys was her talking books, which she enjoyed for about two years before her death.
