I was born in Georgia, Co. in
 the State of Georgia living with
 my father's raised eleven children and
 when had a brother I was well to
 the youngest I had to wait till I was
 eighteen years of age before I could
 then it was in 1855 Crawford and me

 and his father being wealthy he took us
 in to labor on his farm for a short
 we labored there for (3 or 4 years) and
 having no time for study I did not
 know a few that it was with weight
 in my mind it was a thought
 that showed me that to sacrifice all
 of my dear friends for they were
 the poor nations I got of coming
 to Indians we succeeded at once
 to come on forward being afraid
 would give us nothing because we would
 have to try for what and leave the
 party of being not much for
 I did not want to say two things
 then we filled and left them we
 to Indiana arriving for the National
 Road in 1857 the National Road
 come to take the animals from me of
 the Old Settlers we could not get on the
 Road for they were grading it

we went one mile farther west coming
to the Road coming to the very spot
of ground when we settled and where I
came to the edge of the Road I looked
each way and there came an impression
~~upon me~~ this was how we show in
to the colors found which is known
now as Starling Wood how and the
we landed our family only eight of us
on Wednesday in three days from that time
