Dear Sirs:

There is enclosed a check in the amount of \$18.00 to pay for a copy of the 1974 History and a pioneer certificate. A comment on the line of descent may be in order.

Several years ago my wife and I visited Ohio, Indiana and Illinois looking for graves of my great-grandparents. According to a letter written by a first cousin of my mother's, A.F. Bridges, more than 50 years ago, his grandparents and my great-grandparents, George and Susan (Staley) Daves, were charter members of Salem Methodist Church near Belleville, were probably buried in the Salem cemetery.

In Bellevilèe I was fortunate in finding Mrs. Roy Pritchard, a member of Salem Church and a historian, who was unable at that time to tell me anything concerning George and Susan, and I was later unable to find markers for either of these people in the cemetery.

Recently, however, Mrs. Pritchard has written to tell me that she has discovered since my visit a record of the marriage of George and Susan on March 10, 1829, a record of their having bought and sold some land, a record of George Daves having voted at Belleville from 1830 to 1837. I have no information as to dates and places of birth and death of either of these people.

George and Susan, however, apparently had several children. Their oldest daughter Lucinda married D.W. Bridges, father and mother of A.F. Bridges, the letter writer. A younger daughter named Jane married Freeborn Gardner, probably in Brazil and probably in 1867 or 1868. Jane and Freeborn had a daughter Cora in 1869, born in Brazil, my mother. Some two years later Jane died shortly after the birth of a second child and both are buried in the old cemetery in Brazil.

To support these statements I would send you a copy of the A.F. Bridges letter, but all of the family history that concerns my mother's side is in Miami. As shown at the top of this letter I have two homes, shall not return to Miami this year until the end of September.

If the history and certificate are available before September 15 they should be sent to the Mt. Airy address.

In the event you find that dates of birth, marriage and death of my maternal grandparents are essential, I withdraw my application. Unless there is a record of the marriage in Brazil, I should have difficulty in establishing the exact date. The memory of Jane Daves was rather well obliterated by time and Freeborn Gardner's second wife, the Gardner family Bible is in the hands of a grandson of one of my aunts by the half blood who lives in Detroit and who refuses to answer correspondence, and my information comes from the inscription on Jane Daves' tombstone in Brazil which recites her date of death, her exact age at time of death, and states that she was the wife of Freeborn Gardner. photographs of the stone, but they are in Miami.
