

We are still looking for the Job and Mary Gullledge Falkner family, found in Volume 2 of the Folkner Clan, ppg. 120-127. Recently we came across some additional information that might find us another connection in or to the Folkner/Fortner/Faulkner/Falkner Clan.

Job Falkner had a brother named Elijah Falkner/Faulkner, also of Anson Co., N.C.. This Elijah married an Elizabeth Huntley also of Anson Co., N.C.. Elijah and Elizabeth Falkner/Faulkner had three (3) known children. They were Asa Falkner/Faulkner, born 4/Nov./1802 and married a Susannah Myers and had seven (7) children all of Anson Co., N.C., around Wadesboro, N.C.. Asa and Susannah Myers Falkner/Faulkner had: Elijah, who married Caroline M. Huntley, that was a widow in 1856 and was from St. Francis Co., Ark., then there was James T., Joseph, Caroline, William, Elizabeth, who married a Gilbert Grace, and last there was Calvin M., who died before 1837, as a young boy or man. Asa Falkner/Faulkner, the father of these children died 27/Nov./1837 of cholera, in Anson Co., N.C..

Another child of Elijah and Elizabeth Huntley Falkner/Faulkner was Sarah S. Falkner/Faulkner that married William Webb of Anson Co., N.C.. They had seven (7) children. This William Webb's father, John Webb married Sarah's mother Elizabeth Huntley Falkner/Faulkner after Elijah Falkner/Faulkner left and went to Tennessee and Alabama or died as some say in 1806. I don't just yet have any proof of what really happened to him.

The only other child that Elijah and Elizabeth Huntley Falkner/Faulkner had was Job, probably known as William too. He was born ca. 1800 in Anson Co., N.C. but went to the Western Dist. of Tennessee ca. 1820 - 1830 where he also married. It was said or thought that he was the William Falkner in Limestone Co., Al. in 1830 that married Hortanasy Margaret Bishop and they had as many as 14 children from 1821 - 1845. Some of the known children's names were: Mary, James H., Joseph, Margaret C., Benjamin Marlin and Francis Marion. These children moved and scattered from Alabama, to Tennessee, to Mississippi, to Arkansas and also to Oklahoma.

Francis Marion Folkner/Falkner was the oldest known male born in March of 1833 in Madison or Limestone Co., Al.. His wife was Agnes and they had five children. Three were born in Alabama and two were born in Mississippi. Some of the names of these children's spouses were Tharps, Goodins and Parkers.

Back to Elijah Falkner/Faulkner, the brother of our Job Falkner, mentioned up in the third paragraph. We really don't know what happened to Elijah after the time when they had had their three children. Like I mentioned, some say that he died in 1806, soon after possibly the third child was born ca. 1804. My only disbelief to that is that in the 1830 Limestone Co., Al. census where the son of his, William Job was, there was an Elijah Folkner/Falkner, old enough to be his father, living in the next household. So it could have been possible that Elijah just left Elizabeth and came to be with his son in Tennessee and Alabama.???

The Job and Mary Gullledge Falkner family listed in Volume 2, pp. 120 -127, has another update to maybe help find missing family members.

On page 121, the third child of Jab and Mary Gullledge Falkner was only listed as a male born in the 1800's. We now know that this son's name was Elijah and he was born in Madison, Walton or Fayette Co.'s Ga. He married a lady by the name of Nancy ??? born in S.C., ca. 1818. They had at least six (6) known children, starting in Randolph Co.; Al.. Their first three children were daughters, Mary Elizabeth (1842), Martha (1847), and Clarinda (1849). Elijah and his family evidently moved to Coffee Co., Al. in the early to mid 1850's, but by 1860 when the census was taken of Coffee Co. Al.; Elijah's family had grown to six (6). Three sons had been born . Mansil (1852), William W. (1854), and James M. (1858).

Elijah and his family are not on the 1870 Coffee Co., Al. census so I do not know where they got off to but I am looking for their whereabouts. Mary Gullledge Falkner, Elijah's mother died in the 1870's so it is possible that they might have gone back to Randolph Co.; Al. ???

It is also very possible that Elijah Falkner went to war but I have not yet found him on the Confederate soldier lists of Alabama. He had two brothers, Joel and Jefferson Falkner that I know fought in the war. Jefferson was two to three years younger and Joel was seven years younger. Jefferson his brother formed his own company and was Captain. He was also a lawyer and Baptist minister.

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John N. Faulkner and w/ Nancy M. In 1850 this couple was located in Lancaster Co., NC. They Moved to Pulaski Co., AR about 1860. I have been unable to locate them in the 1860 census. Nancy and part of the family has been found in the 1970 Pulaski Co. AR census. The Lancaster Co. SC records were burned during the Civil War, which makes research difficult.
