Dear Sharon,

Your June 22 letter arrived a week or so after a trip we made to Indiana..I had a good visit with Susan Carter, during which she mentioned you had written her for obituaries for Obed Dennis and his wife, Aradella Fogleman Dennis. At that time you had not responded to my April 30 letter so I did not know you were interested in the Dennises or I could have sent you their obits as well as the family group sheets of Obed and his father, Burr Peyton Dennis.

It was a profitable visit for I found a biographical sktch of Burr Peyton D. in the 187 8 Hendricks Co. Illustrated Historical Atlas. Three of us agreed on dates of this poorly printed copy, and when I got home I typed it to be sure they are correct. I enclose a copy of that as well as a number of other documents which should be of interest to you.

Four years ago when I was just beginning family research I took notes from a document in the Hendricks C. Clerk's office at Danville. I should have made a copy but I learned better later on. It was a settlemtn of BPD's estate and was the source of some of the family data- I'm not sure just which. Ny notes contained salient data, but you could write for it if you want it.

Family lore has it that BPD was a "second cousin to the late Benjamin Harrison, and the second William Henry Harrison was his great-uncle". It may have been the other way around. I worked on the Harrisons for a long time but never made the connection. In the Plainfield library his biography gave information about his parents which brings me closer, and it also enabled me to find his marriage record at the IN State Historical Library 3 days later. (See correction on copy of biography.) I would have copied page 9 on which it was said to appear except that page 9 was blank on the film I read. I was terribly disappointed but consoled myself that the preceding and following pages were utterly illegible, and no information could be got except for the name of the groom. The in-house expert couldn't do any better with it. But a card had been filled out in their marriage records catalogue with the data I gave in the correction. What was more maddening was that only that morning I had been in the Bartholomew Co. Library without knowing of any Dennis-Appleton interest in that county. Their film might have been clearer but I couldn't go back there. Our plane was due to leave shortly.

At the Mormon Library in Salt Lake City two years ago I searched KY, VA, and MD for the Harrison-Dennis lines, and I'm thinking Loudon Co. VA is a good guess as BPD's birthplace. I am intrigued by the marriage record of "Mary Ann Harrison of Loudon Co. to Obed Waite, Winchester, Frederick Co. 3 Mar 1794." I think it likely that BPD named his son Obed after Obed Waite, whatever the relationship.

Back to the Foglemans. I have scraped the bottom of the barrel in Indiana, except for Parke Co. And I think I have worn out my welcome in NC where I've corresponded for several years with living Foglemans. They have given me all they had, I have hired professionals to search court records, have ordered wills, and deeds, and am no farther along to learning which family was Samuel's than when I started. So the Fogleman material is about to go in my inactive file,

awaiting a serendipitous finding from a Canadian lady or other correspondent to pique my interest again.

There was a query in the Oct 1984 GH which I answered immediately but never heard from her. Of course, at the time I didn't know the names of Burr's parents:

"EVELAND, Elaine WILLIAMS, 215 E. Wood, Brookfield, MO 64628 (LINN). Need info on 1. HARRISON, Elizabeth b. Berkeley, Charles City Co. VA (likely a grand dau of Benjamin HARRISON of Surry) her father was? - she married John DENNIS II (Loudon Co (?) VA. Moved to near Lexington, KY Woodford Co. in 1819 (?) Was there then. 9 miles sw of Lexington. Elizabeth was a cousin of Wm H. HARRISON, pres.

"2. Need info on MCDAVITTE, Nancy, married Wm. Harrison DENNIS in Lexington KY 1820-1824 (?) She born 15 Sept 1807 (Woodford Co. KY (?) (Died in Randolph Co. MO? ) Had 23 children, many died in infancy. Her father was? His father was?"

If you're interested in pursuing the Harrisons you could ask her if she ever acquired any more data on Elizabeth Harrison and John Dennis. It has been going on two years since her query was published, and some of the responses may have borne fruit. You don't need to mention my name. If she'd been interested she would have written.

Question about the William Fogleman you spoke of: do you know the names of his wives? The Hendricks Co. marriage record gives (1) Sara Jane Hadley, and the Hendricks Co 1860 and 1870 census confirms the "Sarah". But an obit gives "Mary" Jane Hadley. (2) Lydia Hutton from Mooresville obt and confirmed by 1880 Hendricks Co. census. Do they agree with your records? We are talking about William, son of Samuel and Polly, aren't we?
