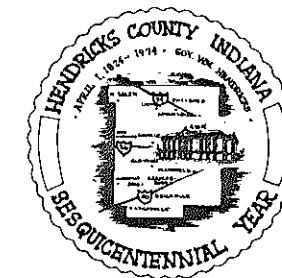

Hendricks County

Born—Feb. 9, 1760, Cumberland Co., New Jersey.

Service—While a resident of Cumberland Co., N. J., he enlisted in 1776, and served 1 yr. as drummer in Capt. Joseph Bloomfield's CO., Col. Dayton's 3rd N. J. Regt. He enlisted in 1778, as pri. in Capt. Patterson's CO., Col. Dayton's 3rd Regt., N. J., was in the battle of Monmouth and discharged at the expiration of 9 mos. He served subsequently about 6 mos. in the militia, one tour under a Capt. Garrison.

Proof—Pension claim S. 32261.

Died—March 4, 1835. Buried Stilesville Cemetery. Stone.

Married—Christine ———. Ch. Josiah, m. Abiah Bosley.

GAY, JOHN

Wayne County

Born—1762, Rockbridge Co., Virginia.

Service—Pri. in 2nd Vir. Regt. and 6th Vir. Regt. Commissioned as an Ensign, May 4, 1779. Was with Washington's Army at siege of Yorktown.

Reference is made to your letter in which you requested information regarding Joel Garrison who served from New Jersey in the Revolutionary War, a descendant of Union County, Indiana.

The record of Joel Garrison is furnished herein as found in the papers on file in his claim for pension, S. 22821, based upon his service in that war.

Joel Garrison was born February 9, 1760, in Cumberland County, New Jersey; the names of his parents are not known.

While a resident of Cumberland County, New Jersey, he enrolled in 1776 and served one year as drummer in Captain Joseph Hissawfield's company, Colonel Ingham's 3d New Jersey Regiment. He enlisted sometime in 1778, served as private in Captain Patterson's company, Colonel Dayton's 3d New Jersey Regiment, was in the battle of Germantown and discharged at the expiration of his term of enlistment. He served subsequently about six months in the militia, was then under a Captain Garrison, dates of this service not stated, nor relationship between the soldier and said Captain Garrison shown.

After the war, the soldier resided in Cumberland County, New Jersey, until about 1818, when moved to Indiana.

Joel Garrison was allowed pension on his application submitted September 8, 1832, at which time he resided in Union County (formerly Franklin County), Indiana; he had lived there almost forty years.

The soldier made no reference to wife or children in his
