MOREY GLADDEN

Morey's great-grandfather, William Gladden, was born in York County, Pennsylvania. The family moved to Maryland where William grew up on his father's farm in Frederick County.

William left home and moved to Ohio. He taught school there for three years. When land became available in central Indiana, William bought land from the government in Wayne Township, Marion County. He went back to Ohio, in Butler County, Ohio and married Eve Negley. They came to make their home in Indiana in the early 1820's. The Gladden homestead was located on West Tenth Street, part of what is now the Chapel Hill subdivision. William was a trustee of the Shiloh Methodist Church, and helped build a log church in Washington Twp., Hendricks County in 1828. The Gladdens were members at Shiloh for many years. Five generations of the Gladden family are buried in Shiloh cemetery.

William and Eve had ten children, Their son George Lester lived all of his life on the home farm, except for time spent in the army during the civil war. After the war, George married Amanda Miller, who was born and raised in Hendricks County.

George and Amanda had eight children, four girls and four boys. Their youngest son, Harry, was the only one of the boys to marry and have a family. Harry Gladden married Edna Mabel Ennis, from Brownsburg. In the early 1920's they bought a farm on south Six Points Road in Guilford Township.

Harry's four sons attended schools at Friendswood and Plainfield. They were active in 4-H and Future Farmers organizations. Edna and the boys, George, Lindy, Morey and Frank became members of

Center Friends Church in the 1940's. Lindy was an active member of the farming community until his death in 1986. Frank presently farms in Guilford Township. George and Morey farm in Liberty Township. Morey has also worked at Allisons for 37 yrs.

Reading the old family obituaries, we get a picture of how different life was then. Quoting from The Barnhill family- Vol I, the obituary of Morey's great-great-grandmother, Mary Speer (1807 - 1893)

"Mary Speer, daughter of Robert and Sarah Barnhill, born in Butler County, Ohio, May 3, 1807. She was united in marriage to William Speer July 19, 1824. There were born to them ten children, six of which are still living. She joined the Methodist Church in 1828 or about that time in a hewn log meeting house at Shiloh. Her husband died when they lived on a farm near Clermont, Indiana. She moved to Zionsville in the year 1870, where she lived up to the time of her death.

The family to which she belonged was large - 13 children of which she is the last one to bid adieu to the many generations that are left. They came to Marion County in the year of 1820. They cut the first wagon road from the city of Indianapolis to what was called Big Eagle Creek, near Clermont. They settled in the dense forest, near, together and among the Indians, around whom the vast multitudes have since gathered."

We found this interesting item about William and Eve Gladden. (Copied from Hendricks County Republican - dated Feb. 7, 1884)

"William Gladden and wife Eve died on Tuesday of last week at their home just over the Marion County line and were both buried in one grave in the Shiloh cemetery in this township on

Thursday. He was eighty seven and she was seventy five years old. They were married when she was only fifteen years old, and for sixty years they traveled the path of life together, sharing each other's sorrows and joys, and living such grand lives that they were known and respected far and near."

Down through the generations, the family has served their country in time of war. William served during the War of 1812. George L. Gladden and James Catterson were in the army in the Civil War. Harry Gladden was a Private in the World War I.

This article from the Brownsburg Record, October 1, 1909, tells of the death of Morey's great-grandfather James Catterson. (1827 - 1909)

"James Patrick Catterson who lived five miles northeast of Brownsburg, died at his home Saturday, September 25 after a short illness. He was born in Owen County, Kentucky. He, with his parents emigrated to Indiana when he was at the age of 4 years and settled near Indianapolis where he grew up to manhood. He enlisted as a soldier in the Mexican War in 1847. In 1861 he again enlisted as a soldier in the Civil War in the 79th Regiment, Indiana Volunteers and was mustered out May 4, 1864 on account of wounds received in line of battle. During his service he acted as Captain of his company."

Morey Gladden graduated from Plainfield High School in 1949. He worked for a while as a farm hand, then began working for Allison Division of General Motors in February, 1951. Later that year he was drafted into the army for duty during the Korean conflict. After basic training and leadership school, he was assigned to

guard duty at the Panama Canal. He lived in Panama for a year, coming home in 1953 when his two year enlistment time was over. Morey and Mary Anne Gladden were married in 1953, living first on South Six Points Road. We began farming in 1955, working for Norman and Rhilla Jared. In 1958 we purchased a farm in the southern part of the county (Liberty township). Our three children attended Mill Creek Schools. Morey, Jr. graduated from Purdue University in 1977. He is a manufacturing engineer in Muskegon, Michigan. Our daughter, Marian K., worked at the Hendricks County Bank for 5 years after graduating from Cascade High School. She is married to Jay Ellis, a Plainfield fireman. They live south of Plainfield and have two children, Jeremy and Josh, attending Central Grade School here. Our youngest, Tim, is at Purdue, studying electrical engineering.

Morey still works at Allison, farming in his spare time. We raise corn, soybeans, wheat, hay, and have a small herd of Black Angus cattle. We are members of Plainfield Friends Meeting.. We have enjoyed being a part of the Plainfield Roots Project.
