#### HOLTZCLAW KNOB

Holtzclaw Knob is five and one-half miles north of Somerset, Kentucky, east of Highway No. 27, and is an isolated promontory that can be seen for miles. There is a geodetic survey marker on top of the Knob and one on the south side of an east and west county road, east of an old school house at the southwest foot of the Knob. The elevation of the Knob is 1,340 feet. Lieutenant Marshall Holtsclaw from Pittsboro, Indiana, son of John Holtsclaw, Jr., a Civil War veteran who was born on Holtzclaw Knob, visited the Knob in 1903. letter to his brother, Green Lee Holtsclaw, my grandfather, he described the Knob thusly: "The Knob contains about 300 acres of as good land as there is in that County, with the Holtsclaw Branch running on the north side of it. The Knob is a gradual slope to about 200 feet high with a small grove of timber on the top. The balance is in cultivation. known as the Holtsclaw Knob all over that country. There is a railroad that runs within three quarters of a mile of it and a nice station called Science Hill."

In the 1890's, a railroad was built through this area and stones for the bridges were quarried from the east side of the Knob. The stone is a very good grade of gray granite. Most of the south and west sides are now covered with bluegrass.

#### THE NAME

There was a parish (a district) named HOLTZKLAU first mentioned in 1089. Through this parish there is a gully or ravine and a brook called "KLAV". Holtz in German means "wood". So, the name "HOLTZKLAU" means "the woods of the Klav".

Our name is found spelled many ways even in the oldest records, but the modern German spelling is HOLTZKLAU and in America, HOLTZCLAW is correct. In church records, school records, county records, and other records, the name is found spelled many ways. I don't know when our line of the family first started spelling their name HOLTSCLAW, but all members of the family in Indiana spell it this way. I found one recording of a deed in Hendricks County, Indiana Courthouse where John Holtsclaw bought 40 acres of land and his name is

spelled HOLSCLAW. In the 1820 census of Pulaski County, Kentucky, the name is spelled HOLTSCLAW. In the County Courthouse records of Pulaski County, the name is spelled many ways. In the recording of a hundred acre grant of land in 1823 on Holtzclaw Knob to Elizabeth, her name is spelled HOLSCLAW. Then, in 1825, her son, Jacob Holtsclaw, sold his share (14 acres) of this tract which he inherited and his name is spelled HOLDSCLAW, and it is described as "his part of 100 acres signed and patented in the name of Elizabeth HOLDSCLAW". On October 17, 1834, John Holtsclaw, Jr. and wife, Anna, sold 74 acres of land on Holtzclaw Knob before they moved to Indiana. certification of the County Clerk spelled the names JOHN HOLS-CLAW and ANNA HOLDSCLAW. In one of the recordings, the name is spelled HOLDSCLOUGH. . I did find that in a majority of times the name would end "SCLAW" instead of "ZCLAW". In the will of John Holtsclaw, Sr. dated December 12, 1819, his name is spelled HOLSCLAW.

I have a hobby which is interesting and amusing to me. I clip addresses bearing my name spelled these ways: Holtsclaw, Holtschaw, Haltschaw, Haltschaw, Haltschaw, Haltschaw, Holtschaw, Houslow, Hootschaw, Joltschaw, and Soltschaw.

#### EARLY HISTORY OF THE HOLTZCLAW FAMILY

The earliest records we have of the Holtsclaw ancestors show them living in two villages, Ober (Upper) Holtzklau and Nieder (Lower) Holtzklau, northwest of Siegen, Germany. Siegen is on the Sieg River which runs into the Rhine River and is about 50 miles southeast of Cologne. Information given by Benjamin Clark Holtzclaw in his "Germanna Record Number 5" is that the origin of the Holtzclaw Family dates back to 1089 (page 212) when the ancient Parish of Holtzklau was first B. C. Holtzclaw spent much time and research tracing the Holtzclaw genealogy and has written a number of books on the genealogy and history of the Holtzclaw Family and other families who migrated to America during the early life in Virginia. His books very thoroughly cover the Pioneer life of these immigrants and the early history of Virginia where the Pioneers settled.

The country around Siegen where our ancestors lived is hills, green valleys, and streams, and was an iron mining country. The Parish of Holtzklau was, and is, exclusive

Feb. 1970. Since writing the account of our branch of the Holtsclaw Family; Prof. B.C. Holtzclaw with the help of his friend, Mr. Flender in Germany checking old tax records, has found some very interesting information and found three ancestors of Johann Holtzklau.

In those times surnames were not fixed and a man might use a surname which indicated where he came from or connected with his place of work.

Johann Holtzklzu was from the village of Niederholtzklau in the district or county of Holtzklau which was first mentioned in 1085. This was in the Province of Nassau Siegen.

In a Siegen record of 1564 Johann is called Johann von(from) Holtzklau. His father was Heit Grimm. Johann had a brother, Hans Grimm of Niederholtzklau, and a brother Keppelhein of Osthelden. In Germany names are reversed so Keppelhein would be Hein Keppel. Keppel was the name or estate or farm with which he was connected.

Any of the inhabitants of Oberholtzklau or Niederholtzklau might have been called von Holtzklau(from Holtzklau)or just Holtzklau. It appears that the surname Holtzklau or Holtzclaw stuck with Johann from Holtzklau and all his decendants and that he was the first of our ancestors using that name.

Now a brief review of the history that concerns our ancestors:

There were numerous farms or estates owned by the Keppel Convent which was founded as early as 1239, all over Nassau Siegen

At Niederholtzklau there was a Manor farm owned by the Keppel Convent near Hilchenbach as early as 1306 called Keppel Hof(Manor Farm). The name Keppel was borneby people whose famelies were connected with one of the farms or estates of the Keppel Convent, which explains the brother of Johann Grimm or Holtzklau, Hein Grimm using the name Hein Keppel. A Hofman was a manager or renter of one of these estates or farms.

Our previously unidentified ancestors:

- 1. Heinchen(Hein)Grimm. Born abt. 1435-40. Died 1505-10. He was Hoffman of Keppel Hof)farm)1461 to abt.1505-10.
- 2. Hein Grimm, son of Heinchen Grimm. B. abt.1460-65. d. abt.1525 He succeeded his father as Hoffman of Keppel Hof by 1511. He was Hoffman in 1529.
- 3. Heit Grimm, son of Hein Grimm. b. abt. 1490-1500. d. 1550-55. He succeeded his father, Hein, as Hoffman of Keppel Hof.
- 4, Johann Grimm or Holtzklau of Siegen, was son of Heit Grimm of Siegen. Born abt. 1525. He was Hoffman of Keppel Hof in 1599.

Dear Mr. Holtsclaw,

Your letter with corrections about your Holtzclaw ancestry came this morning and I was glad to hear and to get the information. One mistake you made at the end of the sheet about the Grimms of Nieder-holzklau. Our first Holtzclaw ancestor, Johann Holtzclaw of Siegen, died at Siegen in 1578. The Johann Grimm who was Hofmann of the Keppel farm at Niederholzklau in 1599 was Johann Holtzclaw's nephew, son of Hans Grimm and grandson of Heit Grimm. Johann Holtzclaw never had anything to do with the Keppel property after he moved to Siegen. It seems obvious that the 1566 record, which shows that he was owed debts by his two brothers, Keppelhein of Ostablden and Hans (Grimm of Niedrholzclaw), indicates that Johann Holtzclaw had soled his part of the Heit Grimm estate to his two brothers, and that they owed him for it still.

agriculture, but the surrounding country at Weidenau where Jacob Holtzclaw lived was, in addition to farming, engaged in iron mining and iron works. Our ancestors were engaged in the iron industry. Some of them were also bakers and teachers.

Our ancestors in Germany were iron workers and for that reason were induced to migrate to Virginia in America where Governor Spotswood had discovered iron ore deposits. The immigrants first went to England where they worked for a while. Then, in 1714, they sailed to Virginia where Governor Spotswood settled them in what is now the extreme northeast part of Orange County. Here our ancestors set up the first iron furnace in America and manufactured the first pig iron. They also established the first German Reformed Church in America to which they belonged.

Our own branch of the Family is first found in the records of Siegen and Weidenau which is just north of Siegen. This family was members of the Evangelical Reformed Church of Siegen. In the "30 Years War", 1618-1648, there was a struggle between the Catholics and Protestants. "John, The Younger", who inherited the Nassau-Siegen area in 1623, put Jesuits in the churches and tried to convert all the people to Catholicism. Some of the Holtzklaus were converted to the Catholic Church though all members of our line of the family that we have records of were Protestants.

Jacob Holtzclaw, our first ancestor in America, was a teacher for the Colony. He was active in land trading and Colonization. He got a Grant of 1,728 acres in Orange County, Virginia, and was instrumental in bringing over Colonists from Nassau-Siegen, Germany, to settle on it. In 1731, he with nine other Germans received a Grant of 50,000 acres in the Shenandoah Valley on which they were supposed to settle 50 families in two years.

Jacob was a Justice of Prince William County, Virginia, in 1740. When he died he left 3,797 acres of land to his ten children and their heirs. Jacob was naturalized by Governor Alexander Spotswood July 11, 1722. From Spotsylvania County Records, 1721-1800, edited by William Armstrong Crozier, published originally in 1905, page 54:

"Governor Alexander Spotswood's Proclamation naturalizing Jacob Haltxclow, a native of Nassaac Siegen in Germany, having settled and inhabited for several years in the County of Stafford, dated at Williamsburg this 11th day of July, 1722."

Jacob sealed his will with a double-headed Eagle Signet. Benjamin Clark Holtzclaw also gives information in his "Germanna Record Number 5" of a German Holtzclaw Coat of Arms with a double-headed eagle on it sent his brother which indicates that the Coat of Arms of our ancestors in Nassau-Siegen, Germany, was a double-headed eagle. I wish to say that this information about our line of the Holtsclaw Family which I have assembled was not written or assembled for sale, but was assembled for other members of my family and all interested members of our family line who I hope will find pleasure in reading it and knowing who our ancestors were and who of the people with our name are members of our family line. It has been a great pleasure and satisfaction to me to get as much information as I have been able to get about the lives and activities of all of them. There is a little good and a little bad in all of us, but I like to think all members known in our family were and are wonderful people.

I would like to dedicate this to the memory of my father, Walter Elliott Holtsclaw, who was very interested in our family line, but who was a poor man and a hard working man all his life and did not have the time or means to gather the information I have been able to get. I am so grateful to B. C. Holtzclaw because without information in his books, "The Holtzclaw Family, 1540-1935" and "Ancestry and Descendents of Nassau-Siegen Immigrants to Virginia, 1714-1750", I wouldn't have been able to get far.

I have assembled all information in loose leaf binders and hope each and every member of our family line who has one will add to it and keep their family line up-to-date. For others who would like to have this record, they can have the sheets from a binder available reproduced on a duplicating and copying machine which are common and available for service most everywhere now.

KNOWN ANCESTORS IN GERMANY (From Germanna Record Number 5", Chapter 12)

The earliest known ancestors of the HOLTZCLAW, HOLTSCLAW and other ways of spelling the name in America were:

- 1. Johann Holtzklau of Siegen. Born about 1525. Died in 1578 at Siegen. Johann was a baker and was connected with an Inn. He first married an Ohl or Ahl about 1550 and perhaps lived at Klafield till 1558 when he moved to Siegen. By this first marriage, he had Franz Holtzklau.
- Franz Holtzklau, son of Johann.
   Born about 1545-1550.
   Died between 1595-1619.
   He lived at Weidenau and it is speculated that he was a teacher. He had Wilhelm Holtzklau.

- 3. Wilhelm Holtzklau of Weidenau.
  Born about 1572-1573.
  Died about 1630-1636.
  Probably married a daughter of Henrich Flender of Hardt Ironworks. Also, probably was a teacher of Weidenau.
- 4. Johann or Johannes Holtzklau, son of Wilhelm. Born 1609-1610. Died after 1664. He was a school teacher of Weidenau. About 1629-30, he married Hebel, probably a daughter of Flender Muess of the Scheppenkauten Ironworks.
- 5. Hans Henrich Holtzklau, son of Johann.
  Born 1646-47 at Weidenau, Germany.
  Died 1711 at Oberfisch, Germany.
  He was a school master; also, a smelter and hammer smith. He married Gertrude about 1666.
- 6. Hans Jacob Holtzklau (spelled Holtzclaw in America)
  Son of Hans Henrich.
  Born 1683 at Trupenbach, Germany.
  Died 1760 at Germantown, Virginia.
  Jacob was a school master at Oberfisch, Germany.
  He migrated to Virginia as a school master of
  the New Colony. Jacob was married twice; first
  to Anna in Germany; second to Catherine, our
  ancestor in Virginia.

All the Holtzclaws in America, regardless of how they now spell their names are descendants of this JACOB HOLTZCLAW.

  Died October 21, 1812 in Mercer County, Kentucky.
- 9. Joseph Jacob (our ancestor) Born 1739-1740 in Prince William County, Virginia.
- 10. Eva (daughter of second wife, Catherine) Born 1735-1745 at Germantown, Virginia. Died 1812 in Culpepper County, Virginia.

Jacob's first wife, Anna Margaret, probably died between 1724 and 1729. He probably married Catherine, his second wife, in 1729.

In the Name of God Amen. I Jacob Holtzclaw of the Parish of Hamilton & County of Prince William, being of Perfect sense and memory do make & ordain this my Last Will & Testament as followeth.

Imprimis. I Give & bequeathe to my son Joseph Holtzclaw three hundred and seventy five acres of land more or less being the land I bought of Warner Toward. To him & his Heirs Lawfully begotten of his Body forever & in default of such Heirs to fall to my son Jacob Holtzclaw & his Heirs forever Lawfully Begotten of his Body.

Item. I Give & bequeathe unto my Son Jacob Holtzclaw and his Heirs forever Lawfully Begotten of his Body all that tract of Land on Licking Run & containing Two hundred acres more or less being the Land whereon I now live including forty acres I bought of Harman Kemper & also that forty acres bought of Harmon Button, being all the land joining the said Tract.

Item. I Give and Bequeathe to my son Jacob Holtzclaw all that Tract of Land which I bought of Thomas Barton in Prince William County containing one Hundred & fifty Acres more or less, to him & his Heirs forever Lawfully begotten of his Body, only reserving to my son Joseph Holtzclaw the liberty of taking as much timber off of the said hundred and fifty acres of Land as he shall have occasion for in Building a Dwelling House for himself.

Item. I Give & bequeathe to my son Harman and his Heirs forever Lawfully Begotten of his Body two Hundred acres

of land more or less being the Land I bought of Thos Hone (?) whereon the said Harman now lives.

Also I give & Bequeath to my son Harman Holtzclaw and his Heirs forever one Hundred acres of Land, being part of a Tract of Land containing three hundred & thirty seven acres and lying on the Branches of Hunger Run in Prince William County and hereafter given to my grandsons Henry & Joseph Holtsclaw.

Item. I Give & Bequeathe to my Daughter Eve Wiley the Wife of Allen Wiley and her Heirs Lawfully begotten of her body Three Hundred Acres of Land lying in Loudon County on Gooss Creek Granted to me by Patent in the year one thousand seven Hundred & fifty. But if my said Daughter Eve should Die without Heirs Lawfully Begotten of her Body or in Default of such Heirs the said Land to fall to my son Jacob Holtzclaw and his Heirs forever Lawfully Begotten of his Body.

Item. I Give and Bequeathe to my Daughter Alice Katherine
Hitt the wife of Henry Hitt three hundred acres of Land where
the said Henry Hitt now lives being Part of a Tract of Land
lying in Culpepper County containing one thousand three hundred
acres and Granted to me by Patent in the year one thousand
seven Hundred & forty eight to her and her Heirs Lawfully
Begotten of her Body forever, and in default of such Heirs to
my son Jacob Holtzclaw and his Heirs forever Lawfully Begotten
of his Body.

Dtem, I Give & Bequeathe to my Daughter Elizabeth Miller the

wife of Harman Miller three Hundred acres of Land whereon the said Harman Miller now lives being Part of the above said Tract of thirteen Hundred acres, to her & her Heirs forever Lawfully begotten of her Body & in default of such Heirs to fall to my son Jacob Holtzclaw & his Heirs Lawfully Begotten of his Body forever.

Item. I Leave to son Henry Holtzclaw two Hundred acres of land whereon he now lives being part of a Tract of land of 496 acres lying upon broad Run & taken up in the year 1724 - during his natural Life and at his Death to his son Jacob Holtzclaw and his Heirs forever Lawfully Begotten of his Body and in default of such Heirs said Land to fall to my son Jacob Holtzclaw & his Heirs forever Lawfully Begotten.

Item. I Give & Bequeathe to my Grandson, Henry Holtzclaw, the son of John Holtzclaw, one hundred acres of land lying upon the Branches of Hungar Run, being Part of a Tract of land containing three hundred and thrity-seven acres, to him & his Heirs forever.

Item. I Give & bequeathe to my Grandson, Joseph Holtzclaw, the son of John Holtzclaw, the Remaining Part of of the above said Tract of land of 337 acres, being one hundred and thrity seven acres more or less, to him & his Heirs forever.

Item. I Give & Bequeathe to my Grandson Joseph Darnal, the son of Jere Darnal, three hundred & thirty five acres of Land lying in Loudon County near Williamses Gap joining the Land of George Carter, to him & his Heirs forever.

Item. I Give & Bequeathe to my Daughter, Katherine Darnal,

the wife of Jeremiah Darnal, Three Hundred and sixty two acres of land in Prince William County joining the land of the Heirs of John Fishback, to her and her Heirs forever.

Item. I Give & Bequeath unto my son, Joseph Holtzclaw, above mentioned, one Negro Woman named Nan, one Featherbed & Furniture, one cow & calf, one Pewter Dish & Bason & two Plates & one Desk.

Item. I Give and Bequeathe to my son, Jacob Holtzclaw, one Negroe Boy named Anthony, one Feather Bed & Furniture one Cloathspress, one cow & Calf, one Pewter Dish & Bason and two Plates.

Item. I Give to my Daughter, Eve Wiley one negroe Girl named Hale now in the Possession of Allen Wiley, Husband to \_\_\_\_ Eve.

Item. I Give & Bequeathe to my Daughter, Alice Katherine Hitt, one Negroe Boy named Daniel.

Item. I Give & Bequeathe unto my Daughter, Eliz. Miller, one Negroe Boy named Soloman now in the Possession of Harman Miller, Husband to the said Elizabeth.

Item. I Give & Bequeathe to my son, Harmon Holtzclaw, one Negro Wench named Sarah now in his Possession.

Item. I Give and Bequeathe to my son Henry Holtzclaw one Negroe Boy named Ned now in his Possession.

Item. I Give & Bequeathe unto my Grandson, Jacob Fishback, son of Federick Fishback, one Negroe Boy named Toney.

Item. I Give & Bequeathe to my Daughter, Katherine Darnal, one negroe man named Robin, one Feather Bed & Furniture, & one warming Pan.

Item. I Give & Bequeather unto my Grandson, John Fishback, son to Frederick Fishback, one hundred & seven acres of land lying in

Loudon County on Gooss Creek being the Remaining Part of the Tract of land whereof a Part is Given to my Daughter Eve Wiley above mentioned, to him & His Heirs forever.

Item. It is my Will & Desire that one Tract of Land containing five hundred and Eleven acres in Augusta County being in two Patents, together with all my Personal estate not herein before mentioned be sold at Publick sale by my Executors hereafter mentioned and the money arising therefrom after paying my just debts to be Divided between all my Children herein before mentioned.

Item. I Constitute & appoint my son in law Jeremiah Darnal & my son Jacob Holtzclaw my Executors to this my Last Will & Testament in Witness whereof I have here unto set my hand & seal this 15th Day of January Anne Dom. one thousand seven hundred and fifty nine.

# JOSEPH JACOB HOLTZCLAW (Our Second Generation In America)

Born 1739 to 1740 in Prince William County, Virginia.

Died January 24, 1835 in Madison County, Virginia.

Son of Jacob and his second wife, Catherine (maiden name not known).

First marriage to Mary Thomas, 1761-62. They had no children.

Second marriage to Elizabeth Zimmerman before November, 1770. She was born about 1745 and died February 11, 1839.

Joseph and Elizabeth moved to Culpepper County, Virginia about 1763. Elizabeth was a granddaughter of Christopher Zimmerman and Nichlas Blakenbaker, 1714 Germania colonists.

I John Holtsclaw of the County of Pulaski, being in a low state of health, but of sound mind and disposing memory and calling to mind the mortality of human life and being dissiarous to dispose of all such worldy Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with: 1st. I give my soul to God, and my boddy to be deasently buryed in a human like manner. Secondly I give and bequeath unto my son John Holsclaw one mare and saddle, price Fifty Dollars. 3rdly, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Holsclaw all my Estate both Rail and personal indoring her natural life or 4thly, my desire is that my land which I now live on be equally divided between my two sons John Holsclaw, and Jacob Holsclaw, price, six hundred and fifty Dollars. My desire is that my two sons above mentioned make my five daughters, Peggy, Elizabeth, Polly, Sally, and Nancy, at or before the final distribution of my personal Estate be made equal to themselves in value. Be it also understood that the above mentioned fifty Dollars to John Holsclaw is to be brought into an equal divide with all my children.

Lastly, my desire is for all my just debts to be paid. Also my desire is for no part of my Estate to be sold at Public auction.

Also I do a nominate and apoint to this my last will and testament Samuel Hendrickson and John Newby Executors thereto.

#### JOHN HOLTSCLAW OF HENDRICKS COUNTY, INDIANA

John Holtsclaw, first son of John, Sr. and his first wife, (name unknown to us) was born in Pennsylvania in March, 1798. It is not known when his mother died, but his father, John, Sr., moved to Rockingham County, Virginia the same year and married Elizabeth Berry, there, December 11, 1798.

John, Jr. was raised in Rockingham County, Virginia, and moved to Pulaski County, Kentucky, in 1810 at the age of twelve with his father, step-mother, Elizabeth Berry; half-brother, Jacob; half-sisters, Margarett (Peggy), Elizabeth, Mary (Polly), Sarah (Sally), and Nancy. It is presumed that the family moved in the vicinity of what is now called Holtzclaw Knob. There is also a brook called Holtsclaw Branch at the north side of Holtzclaw Knob running in a southeast-northwest direction.

John Holtsclaw, Sr. left a Will when he died in December, 1819, in which he willed, among other things, "that my land which I now live on be equally divided between my two sons, John and Jacob". I could not find a courthouse record describing this land owned by John, Sr., but there are other records showing land at Holtzclaw Knob that was owned by John, Jr. and Jacob, and record of a Grant of one hundred acres on Holtzclaw Knob made in 1823 to Elizabeth Holsclaw. Therefore, all indications are that John Holtsclaw, Sr. and his family settled at the "Knob" when they moved to Pulaski County and all lived there till after Elizabeth Berry Holtsclaw died. John, Jr., Jacob and other members of the family sold the land they owned and moved to Indiana in 1834.

In 1828, John Holtsclaw, Jr. was deeded for \$300.00 cash, seventy-five acres by Lewis Morgan and his wife, Francis, and it is supposed that this Lewis and Francis were the father and mother of Anna Morgan, John, Jr.'s first wife, since they named their first boy and girl Lewis and Francis. This same tract of land and all improvements were sold by John, Jr. and his second wife, Anna Newell, in October, 1834, the same year they moved to Indiana. All these events make it most certain that the Holtzclaw Knob area was the home and residence of our ancestors from the time they left Virginia and went to Kentucky.

From Kentucky, John Holtsclaw, Jr. and his family first went to Montgomery County, Indiana. Then, in 1835, they moved to the Maplewood Community about three miles south of Pittsboro in Hendricks County where John, Jr. bought land, raised his family and he and his wife lived and died.

This was a timbered and swampy country when they came, but has since been cleared and drained and is a prosperous country raising bounteous crops. A railroad was not built through this country till 1869. It was built across the land owned by John Holtsclaw when he died in 1866. When he died,

he owned approximately two hundred acres where he lived, south of Pittsboro, and four hundred and forty acres near Collins, Iowa, in Jasper and Story Counties. He purchased two 40-acre tracts of this land in 1854, got a government grant of forty acres and one of one hundred and sixty acres in 1854, and another grant of one hundred and sixty acres in 1858. However, I have found nothing to indicate that John, Jr. ever lived on any of this land in Iowa. His sons, Lewis and John William, did though and his son, Marshall, three years. After John's death, the land was divided among his living heirs except eighty acres south of Pittsboro, the home, which was deeded by each of John's living children to John's wife, Anna, for as long as she lived. After her death, it was then divided among the living heirs.

John Holtsclaw died at his home in the Maplewood Community, three miles south of Pittsboro, Indiana, and was buried in a little cemetary about one hundred feet by two hundred feet on top of a little knob in the middle of a little creek valley on the north side of Highway No. 136 and just east of Pittsboro water station and a high line less than one-half mile east of White Lick Cemetery. Beside him is buried his son, Jacob Newell, who was kicked by a horse and killed just five days after John died. Next to Jacob is buried Anna, wife of John, who died March 29, 1881. She was born in North Carolina on March 24, 1805.

Among Anna's relatives were brothers: Lundy, Hendricks County, Indiana; Jere, Wrightsman, Minnesota; John and Asbenne, Williamsburg, Kansas; and Sandra, also in Kansas. There were sisters: Minerva Spiry, Palmyra, Illinois; Elizabeth Ramsey, Vernon City, Missouri; and Nancy.

Anna had many relatives at Somerset, Kentucky. In 1903, there was a cousin named Newell, who was a doctor there, and two preachers, one a Methodist and one a Christian, though most of her relatives were Methodists and Republicans.

age 12, Lewis moved with his father, step-mother In 1834, Anna Newell Holtsclaw, and sisters and brothers to Montgomery County, Indiana. Then in 1835 they settled in the Maplewood community, three miles south of Pittsboro, where he was living in 1850. Probably between 1850-54 he moved near Collins, Jasper County, Indiana where his father John Jr. acquired considerable land by purchase and government grants. There Lewis raised his family and lived till 1887, when because of failing health he sold his home and other land and moved to Peoria which is now an old ghost town about three miles south and two miles east of Maxwell, but at that time There Lewis bought a 20 acre it was a thriving little town. tract with a small two-story frame house, which is still standing. His daughter Sarah lived just North of Him. Dan his grandson, and his daughter Clara Etta lived with him. In 3/10/1892 Clara married and moved just north of Sarah. Lewis was a small man. He was a farmer and owned 200 acres of land in Jasper County where he lived and raised his family. This land he had inherited from his father's estate and acquired from the other heirs. Lewis's unmarried daughter, Mary Ellen, Daughter Martha L. Burgess and Martha's son Dan and until she married, his daughter Clara Etta lived with him. Lewis raised Dan Burgess the son of Martha after she died in Lewis was a clean shaven man till he contracted a cancer of the lip. It ate away one side of his face causing his death.

Most of Peoria was destroyed by a tornado in 1964.

William (Bill) Marshall Holtsclaw was a farmer, trader and teaming contractor. He built inter-urban grades at DesMoines, Iowa. He lived a number of places. He went to Kansas in 1885 and lived at Oberlin where his daughter, Elizabeth was born in 1886, and his daughter Eva, was born In 1893, William Marshall and his family were liveing in the Maxwell or Collins, Iowa area, and his uncle, John William Holtsclaw, visited them there. In 1895 he went to Indian Territory, near Muskogee, for a year. He intended to homestead there but didn't like the country. His son Kuey Ellis was born there. From Indian Territory he went to Baxter, Iowa, where he ran a livery stable. He went to South Dakota in 1899 where he was a wheat farmer. He chartered a boxcar and shipped part of his belongings and drove through in a wagon. The winters were too cold in South Dakota so he traded his farm there for a farm three or four miles south of Dixon, Missouri which he still owned when he It was divided among his children. In 1883, he and his family moved to the Upola, Kansas community in Elk County, Kansas where he filed on 80 acres of land to which he received a homestead grant dated April 11, 1890. also bought 120 acres of land adjoining his homestead. built a house on this land which still stands and is owned and is the home of his granddaughter, Medora Holtsclaw Campbell. Here his three other children, Mary Ann, Burtram and Nora, were born.

In 1896, Green Lee and his wife, Amelia, separated and the younger children and their mother moved to Longton, Kansas. Green Lee went to Missouri.
