

RUAH ANN HOPKINS

Died, at the home of her son, Murat W. Hopkins, 2134 Park Avenue, Indianapolis, Indiana, Sunday, November 24, 1907, at 3:30 A.M., Ruah A. Hopkins, aged 85 years and 29 days. Mrs. Hopkins illness was of short duration. She suffered a stroke of paralysis Sunday, November 17th, and lingered for several days without much change in her condition, if anything a little improvement, but on Friday, November 22nd, she suffered another stroke, from which she remained unconscious most of the time until her death. All the love and care that skilled physicians and anxious relatives could devise and apply for her comfort and assistance were brought into play, but the fiat of Him who rules our incomings and outgoings had been issued, and after a brief struggle, despite the prayers and entreaties of all who knew and loved her, their appeals were overruled and before the beautiful Sunday morning of the 24th inst., was kissed by the rising sun, the sufferer's spirit took its flight to that home which the Christian believes is the fulfillment of the life everlasting.

Ruah Ann Harding, the daughter of Aaron and Hannah Harding, was born in Greene County, Kentucky, October 26, 1822. In the year 1833 she removed with her father to the farm north of Brownsburg, which she still owned at the time of her death. She was married to William Hopkins, October 26, 1841, the marriage being solemnized by the Rev. Benjamin Harris. To this union was born six children - five boys and one girl, viz: Edward E., Lyston P., Wyatt S., Everett T., Murat W. and Sarah C., and with the exception of the husband and Wyatt S., all survive the mother to mourn her departure.

She became a member of the Christian Church in early life and has been a faithful, earnest member ever since her acknowledgment of that faith. Throughout her whole life, the intervening years have been full of consistent plan and wise action. This was the fountain of the maturity of her character. For upon the white canvas of her life she drew no uncertain lines which needed to be erased. And with the hand of ~~the~~ a master she delicately spread the colors of life and made them blend with promise. Therefore we mourn, but not without hope. Through this gloom there comes back a bright beam of sunshine which turns our tears to jewels of promise. Through the mists which gather we hear the tumult and the roar of the Niagara, but her God has set the bow of his promise. He leaves us not alone in the presence of the unknown. For the Sabbaths of earth she now enjoys the never-ending Sabbath of heaven. She awaits our coming and watches near the gate. And, remember, that mornning is not farr off when the love of Christ shall bid us all enter in and share with her unending, unalloyed joy.

The last services were held at the home of her son, Everett T. Hopkins, Tuesday, November 26th, at 10 o'clock A.M., Elder Starr officiating, after which her remains were brought to Greenlawn cemetery where interment was made.

In the name of God Amen - I Abraham Harding of the state of Ky. of Greene Co. calling to mind my mortality being sick and weak in body, but of sound mind and memory constitute and ordain this my last will and testament.

And first I recommend my soul to God who gave it to me, and my body to the earth there to slumber until the morning of the resurrection. And as touching my worldly possessions, wherewith it has pleased God to give me, it is my desire they be disposed of in the following manner to wit:

Item 1st. I give unto my beloved daughter Hannah Dawson, one hundred and twenty two acres of land out of the northeast corner of my survey on the waters of Robinson and Pitman Creeks, as now laid off.

Item 2nd. I give my beloved daughter Ruhannah Rice 115 and three fourths acres of land out of the South East end of the above mentioned survey as now laid off.

Item 3rd. I give to my beloved daughter Mary Ball one hundred and thirty (130) acres of land out of the East Side of the above mentioned survey known by the name of the Ween tract as laid off.

Item 4th. I give my beloved daughter Lavina Pruyer 121 acres of land on the north corner of the above mentioned tract of land as now laid off.

Item 5th. I give to my beloved daughter Sarah Rice 132 acres of land lying between Ball and Pruyers land, and running across the end of the above mentioned survey as laid off.

Item 6th. I give to my beloved son Aaron Harding one hundred acres of land including three fields on the East side of the above mentioned survey, these being the fields he has for some time occupied. Said one hundred acres to be laid off as to exclude my dwellings and other houses, my barn, orchard, meadow, and all other improvements, except three fields mentioned above.

I also give to my son Aaron Harding at the death of my beloved wife the residue of my tract of land as also my waggon and gears thereunto belonging and all my farming utensils.

Item 7th. I give to my beloved wife Sarah Harding all the remaining of my land and tenements. Also, all my slaves together with my waggon stock of every kind, household and kitchen furniture, farming utensils and all debts due and demands to me owing (out of which however it is my wish she pay any debts which may come against my estate as also all expenses to hold and enjoy the same during her natural life or widowhood). But should my beloved wife marry then it is my wish that she enjoy no more of my estate, real or personal than one third of the land and slaves during her life and one third of the personal estate absolutely.

Item 8th. In case of the marriage of my beloved wife it is my desire that two thirds of my slaves and two thirds of all my Personal estate be sold and the proceeds to be equally divided among my five daughters. As also the other third of my slaves at the death of my wife. In case my beloved wife should remain a widdow during life it is my desire that the whole of the slaves as well as all the personal estate which may be on hand at her death, except that part of the same given to Aaron Harding, be sold and the proceeds be equally divided among my five daughters. It is my wish in ether case of the sale of the slaves that they be sold in the family.

Item 9th. I appoint my beloved wife Sarah Harding my sole Executor of this my last will and testament.

In testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this 15th day of May 1818.

WILL OF WILLIAM HOPKINS

I, William Hopkins, of the County of Hendricks and State of Indiana, being of sound mind, disposing memory, and of lawful age, and desirous of disposing of my estate in a just and equitable manner, do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and words, as follows:-

Item I. It is my will and I expressly direct that the expenses of my last sickness-funeral expenses and expenses incident thereto, and all just debts that I may be owing at my death, be first paid by my executrix of this will, first exhausting personal property in the discharge of said expenses and just debts.

Item II. It is my will, and I do hereby devise to my wife, Ruah Ann Hopkins, for and during her natural life-time, all the real estate of which I may be the owner at the time of my death.

Item III. It is my will and I do hereby devise all my real estate, after the death of my said wife Ruah Ann Hopkins, to my children, namely - Sarah C. May, Erastus E. Hopkins, Wyatt S. Hopkins, Everett T. Hopkins and Muratt W. Hopkins, in fee simple, share and share alike.

Item IV. It is my will and I do hereby expressly direct, that all the real estate devised to my wife Ruah Ann Hopkins, for life, and to my children, named in item three, in fee simple, shall forever stand and remain charged with the burden of maintaining and keeping in good repair, one half acre of said real estate, which I have and do hereby reserve and set apart as a burial ground. Said half acre described as follows:-Commencing forty-two (42) poles due East from the North west corner of Section thirty-five (35) Township Seventeen (17) North, Range One (1) East. Thence running south Eight (8) poles. Thence East ten (10) poles, thence North Eight (8) poles.-Thence West ten (10) poles to the place of beginning: It is my will that my said wife, and my said children, named, and their heirs, grantees, and assignees forever, shall maintain around said half acre burial ground a good and substantial fence, and that my said wife and my said children their heirs, grantees, and assignees, shall never use said half acre for any other purpose than that of a burial ground.

Item V. It is my will and I do hereby bequeath to my wife Ruah Ann Hopkins all my personal property of which I may die the owner.

Item VI. I have kept a full and complete account of the advancements made to my children, and it is my will and I expressly direct that my wife, Ruah Ann Hopkins, pay to Sarah C. May, Erastus E. Hopkins, Wyatt S. Hopkins, Everett T. Hopkins and Muratt W. Hopkins, out of my personal property, the sum of Six hundred dollars. If any one of my children have been advanced more than the sum of six hundred dollars,-said child or children are to pay back to my estate any excess thereof over the said six hundred dollars. If any of my children fail to pay back said excess, then the same shall stand against them as a continuing advancement and such child shall receive less real estate in value upon the death of my said wife.

Item VII. It is my will and I expressly direct that my son Liston P. Hopkins take nothing by this will.

Item VIII. It is my will and I expressly direct that at the time of taking effect of this will, that if any of my said children be dead, without issue living, then in that case, the share of that child or children shall go to the survivors, share and share alike. But if at the time of the taking effect of this will any one of my children be dead- leaving living issue - then in that case the share of such as may be dead, shall go to the issue thereof.

Item IX. It is my will and I do hereby empower and appoint my wife Ruah Ann Hopkins, as my executrix of this my last Will and testament, and that she be not required to give bond as such.

Item X. I hereby revoke all former wills made by me.

Witness my hand this the 28 day of April 1887.

PARTHENIA ANN (NASH) BURNS

Parthenia Ann (Nash) Burns (b. 5-11-1837 d. 6-12-1920) was the daughter of Richard and Frances (Smith) Nash. Richard Nash's parents were Thomas and Hannah (Brown) Nash. Richard was born 2-29-1812 and died 7-4-1860 while Frances, his wife, was born 1-15-1814 to (Joel or Bailey) Smith and wife.

Parthenia Ann (Nash) Burns was married to John Thomas Burns on 3-18-1859. John Thomas Burns was born 7-18-1833 and died 1-22-1885. He was the son of Henry F. and Sarah (Thomas) Burns. John Thomas Burns was a member of Legislature in 1865 and was file clerk in House of Representatives in 1867. John Thomas and Parthenia Ann (Nash) Burns had four children: Maria Frances, Eudora Jane, Walter Landor, and Lucretia. Maria Frances (b. 1-27-1860 d. 2-11-1932 2-11-1932) was married on 3-2-1879 to Everett Twilley Hopkins (b. 1-19-1854 d. 11-22-1937) who was the grandson of Richard (b. 9-18-1774 d. 6-30-1810) and Elizabeth (Twilley) Hopkins (b. 3-12-1779 d. 8-5-1835). He (Everett) was the son of William (b. 1-17-1809 d. 12-31-1891) and Ruah Ann (Harding) Hopkins (b. 10-26-1822 d. 11-24-1907).

The three children born to Everett Twilley and Maria Frances (Burns) Hopkins were Harry Harding Hopkins, Frank Burns Hopkins and Mary Ludora (Hopkins) Edmondson. Harry Harding Hopkins was born 2-23-1880 and died 5-17-1967. On 1-23-1910 Harry Harding Hopkins married Indiana ("India") McKee (Catterson (b. 8-28-1877 d. 11-18-1924), who was the daughter of James Patrick (b. 3-20-1827 d. 9-25-1909) and Emerine Turpin (McKee) Catterson (b. 7-8-1834 d. 11-15-1913).

Harry Harding and Indiana (Catterson) Hopkins were the parents of the following children: James Howard Hopkins, William Everett Hopkins, Emma Frances (Hopkins) English, and Mary Eloise (Hopkins) Castetter.

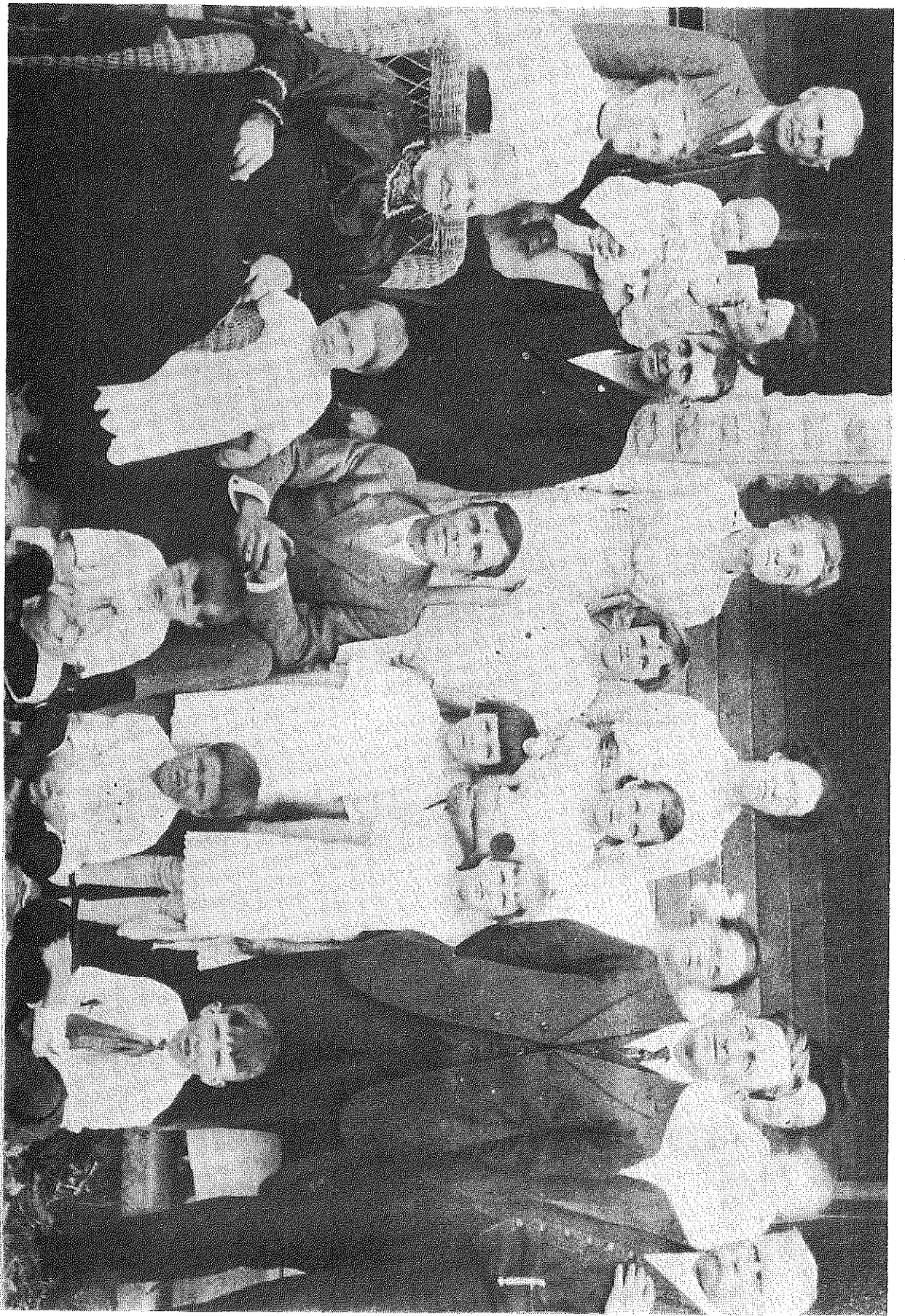
