MARRABLE--MARBLE--MARBEL--MARBELL

That Marble is a name of Spanish Origin is a theory which has its supporters. Marbella is a town in Malaga, Spain, and it is possible that there the surname originated.

Marbell is an early form which has undergone many changes. Marble, Marable and Marrable are perhaps the only orthographies of today in our country. In England the more usual form is Marrable. In old records of this family--as is the case in so many instances--the spelling is varied and interesting. For example, we find Marbel, Marrabla and Mirable.

In Massachusetts records of the family Marable is as frequently used as Marble. A man writes himself Marble one day, and for variety's sake, shall we say?--makes it Marable or Marrable upon another occasion.

Marvel and Marvyle may be variants of Marble.

The "marble," pure and simple, is the word from which the surname is evolved, this can be traced back to the Sanskrit word "marnati," meaning a sparkling stone. The latin word is "marmor", and the French "marbre."

Frederick, son of Sir Thomas Marrable, was a famous architect, who designed the Garrick Club in London and several churches. He was Secretary of the "Board of Green Cloth" to George IV. Andrew Marble was a member of Richard Cromwell's Parliament.

One family seat is at Ringstead, Northampton, where there is a marriage connection with the historic house of Douglas.

Statesmen, diplomats, scientists, antiquarians and authors  
Marbles have won fame, and some have "wandered in quest of  
flowers in the fields of Parnassus."

The first of the name in New England was Samuel, who was  
born in England, but where is not known. One line of Marbles  
came from Scotland, and another is said to claim Holland as a  
birthplace. The supposition is that the family, originally  
English, settled in Holland and then crossed the ocean.

The Scottish line gave us the family of well-known actors.  
Danforth Marble, of the branch, an actor, born in Connecticut,  
married Anna, daughter of William Warren, who came to America  
in 1796 with the second company of English actors to cross the  
ocean.

The Marbles have always been a power and well represented  
in Massachusetts, where they have old family homesteads at Sutton,  
Oxford, Hingham, Worcester, Palmer, Ashburnham, Andover and  
Charlestown; Windsor, Conn., Swanzey, N. H., and Paris and Bethel,  
Maine, and other strongholds.

At Andover Marble Ridge is an old name, and Marble Harbor  
is shown upon a map in the "New England Prospect," about 1640.  
Marble Street in Worcester is named for a pioneer. (Marblehead, Mass.)

Samuel Marble's name appears as early as 1648 upon the  
records at Charlestown. He was afterward at Andover. The line  
of descent, through the eldest sons, from Samuel, the pioneer, is:  
Samuel, Daniel, Samuel, Samuel of the fifth generation. Daniel  
of the third generation married Esther Putnam. Their son Samuel  
married Abigail Hart.

Joseph, son of Samuel, the pioneer, married Mary Faulkner,  
and Samuel of the second generation married Rebecca Andrews.

One of the first settlers of the town of Sutton was Free-  
grace Marble, son of Samuel and Rebecca. He died in 1799, leaving

played her part. She witnessed the battle at Bunker Hill, and as a child drew water at a well for the soldiers. In 1800 they moved to Fayette County, Pennsylvania, and afterwards to Indiana. Their children were pioneers in Ohio and other western states.

If Aaron Marble--the Aaron whose name is found in "Heroes of the Revolution"--is an ancestor of the reader's, he may have it all his own way as far as membership with patriotic societies is concerned. "Founders and Patriots" is one society with which much coveted membership may be claimed. Eligibility to this ~~lies in descent from an ancestor who not only bore an unblemished record for loyalty and patriotism, but who assisted in laying the foundations of our Government.~~

X Although but thirteen years of age in '76, Aaron was an ardent patriot, too young to command, but old enough to fight and endure hardships without complaint. His first enlistment was a noble act, taking as he did the place of an elder brother, who was unable to leave a family dependent upon him. When his term of service expired, he was at West Point. He walked, bare-footed, from there to his home in Massachusetts.

Aaron, who was the son of Enoch and the grandson of Free-grace, married Rebecca, daughter of Captain John Putnam, also a hero of the Revolution. Captain Putnam's wife was Mary, daughter of Jacob and Mary Marble Cummings. There is, therefore, a double Marble lineage here.

The coat of arms reproduced is blazoned: Quarterly, or and gules, a fesse ermine; first, second and third, a lion passant guardant, the dexter forepaw resting on two keys, wards down, or.

Crest: A lion rampant guardant or holding between his paws a chaplet of oak vert, encircling a key in bend sinister, wards up, or surmounted by a staff in saltire argent.

The ring and key are unusual charges. The key denoted dominion and guardianship, the ring felicity, and it is also a

children, Mary, Jacob, Enoch, Rebecca, Malachi and Samuel. Free-  
grace built the old Statehouse on State Street, Boston. Samuel,  
son of Freegrace, married Patience Gale, and they were the parents  
of a large family. He spells his name indifferently Marble or  
Marable.

Captain Gershom Marble--whose descent is not clearly shown--  
was a mariner, living at Charlestown, where his first wife Mary  
died in 1694. His second wife was Waltstill Ingle or Ingalls.  
Gershom died in 1725, and left several children--John, Ephraim,  
David, Nathaniel and Mary, who married a Vinton. Other marriage  
connections of this branch of the Marble family are the Bates,  
Towers, Morses and Hobarts.

In Maine the Marbles have been prominent in affairs since  
the beginning of things. Samuel S. Marble, great-great-grandson of  
Freegrace, was the Governor of Maine, where he died <sup>several</sup> a few years ago.

No family can show better war record, for the Marbles were  
always among the first to prove their patriotism. Revolutionary  
rosters give the names of 65 privates and officers. The colonial  
wars records are probably even better. Massachusetts archives  
give: Captain James, Lieutenant Jonathan, Corporal Benjamin and  
Isaac, David, Cyrus, Enoch, Ellis and Joseph.

Lieutenant Henry Marble of Massachusetts served from 1777  
until the end of the war. He died in 1841. John Marble of Brockfield  
Mass., was mustered in May 1, 1775, and Jabez and Oliver Marble, <sup>x family name handed down by</sup> one of  
twins of Ashburnham, were other soldiers. A cannon ball brought <sup>the daughter</sup>  
home by Jabez is now in the possession of his great-grandson, <sup>who married</sup> a Mitchell--  
Warren E. Marble. Solomon Marble of Milbury was at Bunker Hill. <sup>Had a son</sup>  
He was an ancestor of Manton Marble, author, editor, and diplomat. <sup>named</sup>  
Nathan Jonathan Marble, was also among the first to respond to a <sup>Oliver</sup>  
call to arms, and his wife (afterward), Christian Bishop, nobly <sup>Mitchell</sup>

TO A LOVELY PERSON:

We did not realize the serious condition of our loved one until after she was taken to the hospital. After the first week, she showed very little improvement. Then we began to realize just how serious her condition was. At the same time, we were totally unprepared for the news that came from the hospital, saying Mrs. Taylor had smilingly passed away very suddenly. No one on earth can, or will, understand the pain and loss we suffered at her passing.

Now, after many days and nights of lonely reflection, we are beginning to understand the great loss the Taylor family has suffered. To her, our home was her castle, and made to be lived in. She needed no stage to act on; her life was an open book for all to read. Her greatest happiness was when she could do something to make life a little more pleasant for others. She loved life and people. To me she was sweet and kind at all times. Her place with me will always remain vacant and the days and nights will be long and lonesome. I am certain now her lines are drawn in pleasant places. She is now free of the great pain she suffered so many years, without complaint. (And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes! and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain, for the former things are passed away. Rev. 21:4).

I have no fear of where she will spend eternity, but I am sorely troubled whether I will be permitted to join her there when I am called from my bed of pain. (And I give unto them eternal life and shall never perish. John 10 - 28).

Now, looking back over the long road we traveled together, there was never a minute or a day that our love for each other did not grow stronger. We felt it between us always. I feel I am a better man and father for having been permitted to live in her gracious presence for so many years. You have only to read and listen to what her friends and neighbors say of her to know I am speaking the thoughts of all who knew her.

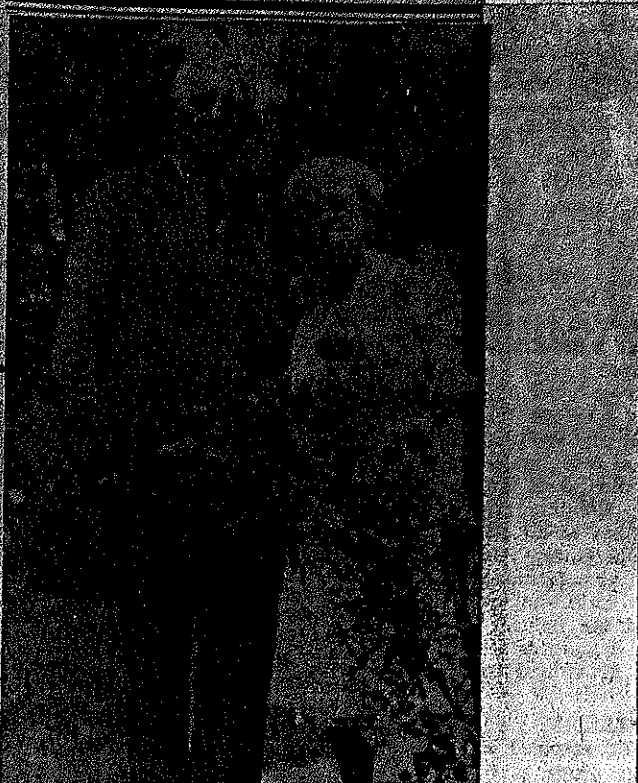

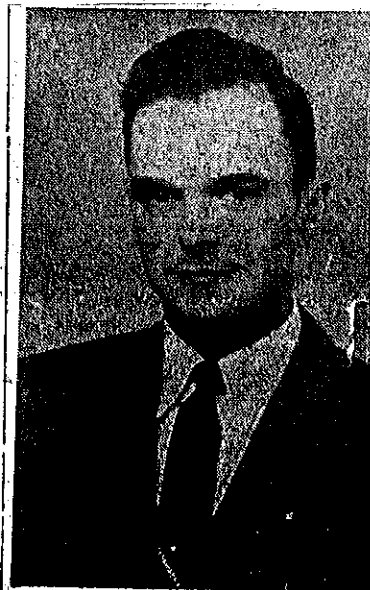
Death was due to toxic poisoning and apoplexy, and occurred at the family home, four miles north of Crawfordsville, on the George Enoch farm.

Injuries received last Saturday night when she was struck by an automobile proved fatal early Tuesday to Mrs. Lola B. Hole, 65, R. F. D. 6, Crawfordsville.

Mrs. Hole, who had both legs fractured and suffered head injuries, died at 4:30 a. m. at Culver hospital where she was taken immediately after the accident.

She was injured shortly before 8 p. m. Saturday when she was struck by an automobile driven by Samuel E. Stanley, 21, of 203 west Market street. She was walking across Market street when she was hit and knocked to the pavement.

A light rain falling at the time was believed to have obscured the vision of both Mrs. Hole and the driver of the car, who was not held.

Capt. Charles Curtin and Officer Robert Dinwiddie investigated the accident.

Mrs. Hole was the twelfth person killed in this county this year in accidents involving motor vehicles. The same number of traffic deaths were recorded in the county all of last year. She was the fifth pedestrian victim.

Mrs. Hole was born north of Crawfordsville on Jan. 11, 1875, the daughter of David Wesley and Anna Hughes. Her marriage to William N. Hole took place on July 23, 1893, at Crawfordsville. She was a member of the Young's Chapel church and had spent her entire life in that community.

The survivors include five children, Virgil W. Hole, Mrs. Flossie M. Cummins, Mrs. Bessie Vanette, Lester Hole and Raymond K. Hole, all of this city; and a brother, Homer Hughes, also of Crawfordsville. A daughter, Ruby, preceded her in death in 1920. Also preceding her in death were the husband, a sister, a brother and both parents.
