

## FOREWORD

This brief IMEL and SELCH families history has been written for the Plainfield Roots Project of 1988, and it has been given to the Plainfield Public Library.

This history will also deal with the family lineage of PETER IMEL to ORA MAY (IMEL) SELCH.

I trust anyone using this history will improve on it, as many SELCH'S and HAITT families lived in Hendricks County from around 1850 on.

In doing family research, a person MUST rely on certain information, such as:

1. Birth Records.
2. Death Records.
3. Marriage Records.
4. Newspaper account of birth, death and marriage.
5. Tombstones from burial locations.
6. Family known traditions.
7. United States Census Records.
8. Military Records.

In doing the Selch Family, I didnot find any military records at the State Library.

One can notice a difference in ages from one census record to another, this happens in most families.

In doing this history, I have taken all of the above into account to arrive as close as possible as to the correct dates.

CHARLES WOODROW IMEL

IMEL FAMILY HISTORY--- PETER IMEL THE HESSIAN SOLDIER

FROM HESSE KASSEL, GERMANY TO ORA MAY IMEL SELCH.

A full history of the "HESSIANS" can be found in a book intitled "HESSISCHE TRUPPEN IM AMERIKANISCHEN URABHANGIGKEITSKRIG" (HETRINA), it is an index of the Hessian soldiers who fought in the American Revolutionary War.

Various Germany noblemen provided troops for the British Crown as "mercenary" troops. These troops were used between 1776 and 1784.

The landgraveship (which was a ruling baron of that period), Frederick II of Hesse Kassel provided 15 infantry regiments, four grenadier battalions, one courier corps, which totaled about 15,000 men to George III.

The Americans called them "HESSIANS". With replacements for casualties, and A.W.O.L. men the total reached 25,000 men.

The first Battalian Block arrived in America on July 25, 1776, and the majority of the units arrived in the middle of August 1776.

Early family history that 5 IMEL brothers came to America as "Hessians".

While doing my research I also found a MICHAEL IMMEL, listed in General Morgan's Riflemen of Virginia. A group that all of the above brothers joined up with after going A.W.O.L. from the British, so its possible that 6 brothers might of came to America.

NOTE: I never found Michael Immel, after the group was demobilized at Winchester, Virginia in 1782.

PETER IMEL

Family tradition says that all of Peter Imel's children were born in Greenbriar, Shenandoah County, Virginia. I believe this to be incorrect. His son Henry Imel, buried in the Imel Cemetery, Spearville Kansas his tombstone states he was a native of Maryland.

Peter Imel has been found using different spellings, which include the following: EMMUEAL (this spelling was found during his term with General Morgan's Riflemen, he served as a drummer boy), IMELDT---IMEL---IMMEL---IMMELL---EMAL---EMMAL and YMMEEL.

The YMMEEL can be found when his first daughter MARIA was baptized April 13, 1789 at the German Reformed Church in Frederick, Maryland. The listing shows "YMMEEL, MARIA--daughter of PETER YMMEEL/SUSANNA. This record can be found at The Church Of Jesus Christ Of Latter Day Saints, Batch number C507711, Serial 2116.

Peter spelled his last name EMMEL, when he was married August 12, 1787, in Frederick, Maryland.

The IMEL spelling started up regular around 1820, in Wayne County Indiana.

THE LIFE OF PETER IMEL OF HESSE KASSEL GERMANY

1. PETER IMEL BORN MARCH 30, 1764 IN HESSE KASSEL GERMANY.
2. Arrived in America 1776, age 12 years.
3. Served the British Army, length unknown.
4. Went A.W.O.L. and joined up with the Continental Army, serving with General Morgan's Riflemen Of Virginia, as a drummer boy.
5. Was demobilized at Winchester, Virginia in 1782, age 18.
6. Was married August 12, 1787 in The Evangelical Lutheran Church-- Frederick Maryland, age 23. Married SUSANNA KIRKWOOD PUL. She had been married before, nothing about her first marriage is known.
7. 1790 son Henry was borned in Maryland.
8. 1800 in Greenbriar, Shendoah County Virginia.
9. 1810 In Rockingham, Virginia
10. 1820 listed in Wayne County Indiana, along with Samuel and Henry, his sons
11. Between 1820 and 1830 his wife Susanna death happens, she is not listed in the 1830 census.
12. 1830 Fayette County, Indiana, living with son Samuel
13. 1840 Johnson County Indiana, living with his son George.
14. Death of Peter Imel, January 3, 1849, age 84 years 9 months 5 days. He was first buried on the farm of George Imel. In 1940 three of his great grandsons moved his body to Rocklane Cemetery, Rocklane Indiana. His remains were interred in a grave of his son George. PETER IMEL'S original marker is still standing in the Cemetery.

THOMAS IMEL

Born 1795 in Virginia. Died between 1832 and 1839 in Henry County Kentucky. Was buried in Monterey, Kentucky. His grave was lost during a flood.

The family tradition says that Thomas Imel, moved to Kentucky to fight the Indians with Daniel Boone.

THOMAS IMEL married HULDAH LITTLE, born 1797 in Pennsylvania. They were married eather on February 17th or 18th, 1815 in Wayne County Indiana.

They had 10 children all of wich were borned in Henry County Kentucky.

After the death of Thomas Imel, the family moved to the vicinity of Madison, Indiana.

Huldah remarried John G. Tardy on November 4, 1839 in Switzerland County Indiana.

Huldah died between 1850 and 1860, she is buried in Ruel Cemetery Jefferson County Indiana.

WILLIAM HENRY IMEL

Born June 13, 1824 in Henry County, Kentucky. Married ELLEN GERARD on October 1, 1845.

All 12 of their children were borned at Bee Camp--which is 5 miles east of Madison, Jefferson County Indiana.

Bee Camp is a road that was made, that runs between State Highway 56 and Pleasant Ridge Road. Its setting is a valley between two ridges. At first only the "IMEL'S" lived on this "road".

The houses they built for themself's are still standing today. They also built a church, school and a meeting hall. They reportly built many many homes in the area.

ELLEN died Janurary 2, 1897.

WILLIAM HENRY died March 4, 1907.

Both are buried at the Pleasant Ridge Methodist Church Cemetery, Jefferson County Indiana.

NOTE: A Great Grandson-- first child of James William and Sarah Emmline Imel is buried at the foot of their grave. The name of the child is WILLIAM HENRY.

Both, are buried at the Pleasant Ridge Methodist Church Cemetery, Jefferson County, Indiana, (next to his father and mother).

He suffered a stroke around the later part of the 1940's, he came back to Indianapolis to live with his children.

James William Imel died at the home of his daughter Hazel Irene Imel Ford on August 27, 1951.

Married Roy Byrum on June 24, 1918 at Indianapolis, Indiana.

They had one son ROY BYRUM JR. born March 21, 1919, he died August 1, 1919 at Indianapolis. His father Roy Byrum died May 20, 1927. Both are buried at New Crown Cemetery Beech Grove Indiana.

Ora May remarried the second time to AUSTIN HIATT SELCH on septmeber 10, 1928. AUSTIN HIATT SELCH was borned May 6, 1899 at Middle Township Hendricks County Indiana.

At one time Austin and May owned an ice cream store in Indianapolis, Indiana.

They also operate a large farm just south of Plainfield Hendricks County Indiana.

They moved to New Winchester Hendricks County Indiana, where Austin farmed, they lived there until Ora May's death September 23, 1957, At New Winchester, Hendricks County Indiana.

Austin Hiatt Selch died May 12, 1958 just south of Plainfield, Hendricks County Indiana.

Both are buried in Greenlawn Cemetery Brownsburg Hendricks County Indiana.

## AUSTIN SELCH, 59, DESPONDENT, TAKES OWN LIFE

Leaving a note explaining his act, Austin H. Selch, 59, took his own life some time Monday night by attaching a hose to the exhaust pipe of his car and closing the windows. The body was not found until about 10 o'clock Tuesday morning when Harold Quinn of Cartersburg went to the gravel pit on the Quinn farm and noticed the car parked near the pit, which is located just south of the bridge at the Cartersburg Springs.

Mr. Selch had been making his home with a nephew, Emsley Lowry, R. R. 1, Box 111, Plainfield, since the death of his wife, Mae, several months ago and had been despondent. On Monday he went to New Winchester, where they lived at the time of her death and when he failed to return, Mr. Lowry and his brother started a search for him. Mr. Lowry told the Messenger Tuesday that they had crossed the bridge three times last night in their search.

Mr. Selch has suffered two or three strokes and worried about the fact that he was unable to work and felt that he was a burden to the Lowrys. Mr. Lowry's mother, who lives with them, is a sister and the only member of his family surviving.

Mr. and Mrs. Selch had no children of their own but had reared two sisters, both of whom are married and reside south of Belleville. They are Blanche Rogers and Lillian Mitchell.

The note which was turned over to Coroner Kofmit Hiberner read: "I am sorry this is the way it had to end, but Mae wants me to be with her. Goodbye and thanks for all you have done for me. Give all my love to all. Call Emsley Lowry, R. R. 1, Box 111, Plainfield, TE 9-0692."

The note also asked that the body be taken to the Hampton Funeral Home and that the same services be carried out for him as were given his wife.

Mr. Selch was a member of the Christian church here, the family having resided in this community many years. He was a man of fine character and worried over the fact that he was unable to work. Said Mr. Lowry, "If he could have worked, this wouldn't have happened."

Funeral services have been arranged for the Hampton Funeral Home at 2:00 o'clock this (Thursday) afternoon. Rev. Warren A. Robbins will officiate and burial will be in Maple Hill cemetery.

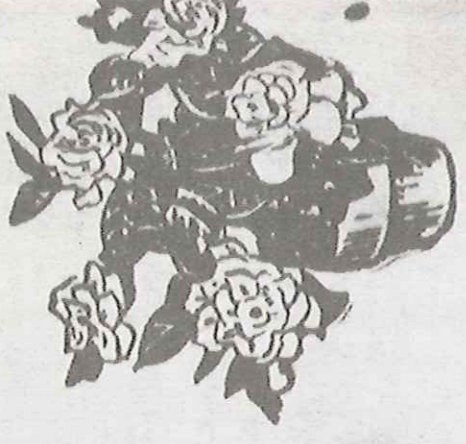

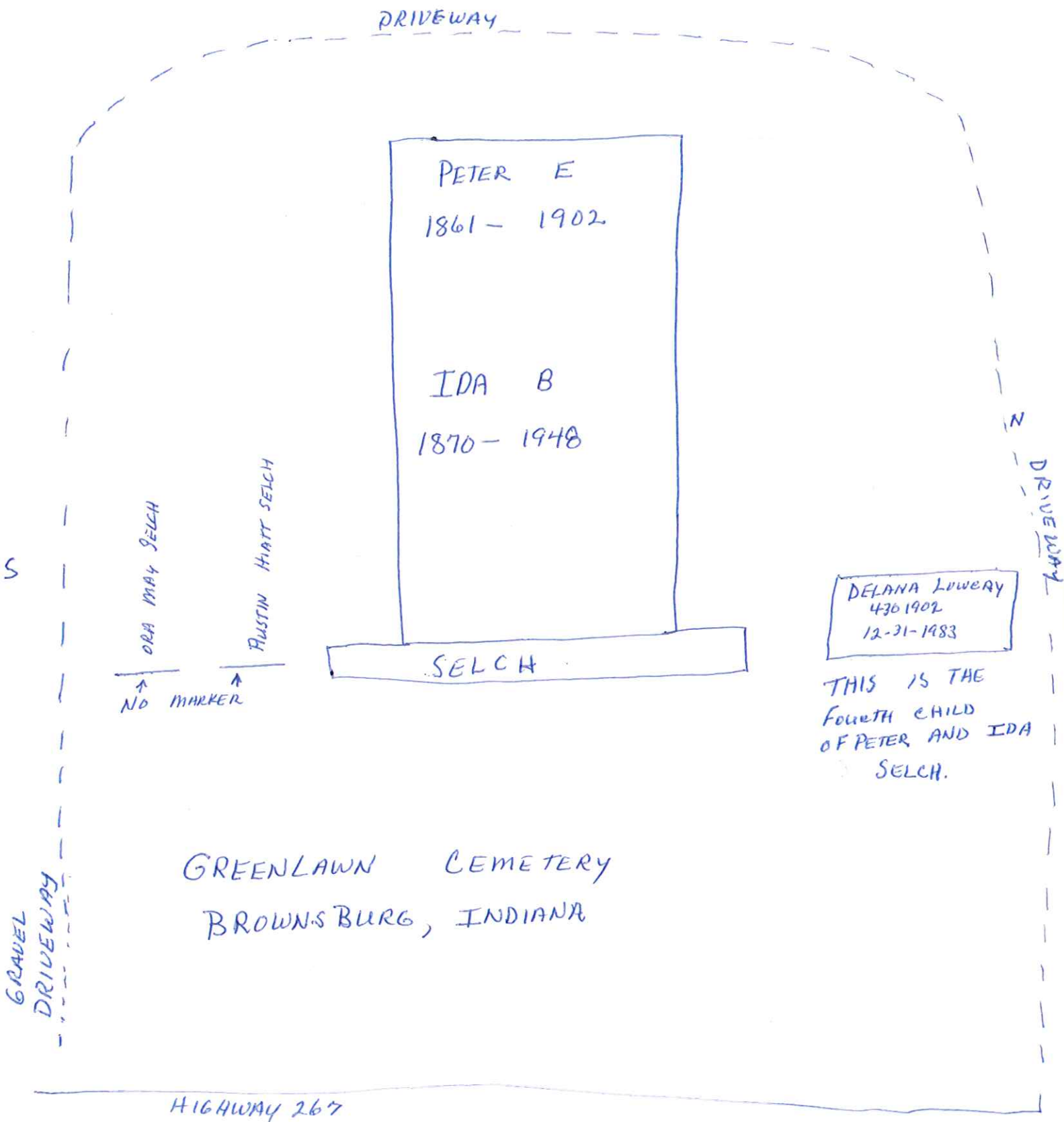
