The Leach Family

Our earliest record of the Leach family is found in the following article written by Elias Leach of Pittsboro, Indiana, Hendricks Co., in 1879

My great grandfather was a minister of the so called High Church of England. Three of his sone, my grandfather being one of the three, migrated to the U.S.A. in or about the year 1760. Grandfather took up his residence in the state of Virginia either in Culpepper, Farquer or Shenandeah counties, I do not remember which as I have heard father speak of living in all three, where he married my grandmother, a Dutch English woman whose christian name was Sarah, her maiden name I do not remember. They had five children, four daughters and one son, John Leach who was my father.

The oldest girl, Aunt Jane never married but lived an old maid and died near where she was raised. Aunt Elizabeth married Roland Smith and removed to Scott Co. Ky. near a post office called the Stamping ground. Sarah married Thomas Holmes, who, the last I over heard from them, they were talking of moving to west Tennessee. The fourth married a man by the name of Short. Neigher of their christian names do I remember.

John Leach, my father, the only son married Mary Hall, who was my mother, a woman of Dutch English descent but mostly Holland Dutch as I have heard her say her mother was born in Holland and never spoke a word of English during her life, and indeed there were a great many words my mother could never speak plainly in English.

As to the two brothers of grandfather Leach I have no knowledge where they settled. I find the name scattered protty well over the U.S.A.

As to the Hall family I nover got very much information. Mother's parents died while she was small. I remember hearing my parents talk about the old Revolutionary Soldiers, especially my mother, she being six years older than father, and have heard her speak about how hard the soldiers fared and of seeing them marching over frozen ground, numbers of them bare footed, and after the war was over they was well acquainted with some of the officers and lived neighbors to General St. Clair, Captain Mallary and others.

The date of the birth of my father and mother and their marriage I have somewhere I think but cannot find it now. (John Leach,b. Fob.19, 1777, died Oct. 9, 1837. Mary Hall Leach b. 1771, died 1850.) Though they were married in the latter part of 1795 or perhaps in 1796 and settled in Farquer Co. Virginia untill about the year 1802 when they moved to Bath Co. in

the state of Kentucky where they resied until the fall of 1836 when they moved to the state of Indiana where they resided until death released them from the toils and cares of mortality.

Father died Oct. 9, 1837 about one year after coming to the state of Indiana, aged 60 years 7 months and 20 days and was buried on the place he had bought. Mother died in 1850 near thirteen years after father and she not being satisfied with the place where father was buried requested that he be taken up and removed to another place which was done and they were both buried in one grave about one and one half milres west of south from Lizton. They both lived and died fully pleaged to the Regular Baptist faith. Father was leader in singing in church example that where they belonged from my earliest recollection and was a singer among singers and all his children except two could do their own singing, but somehow or other the tune has run out with some of the later generations of the family.

Now I will return to the geneology. Father and mother had born unto them nine children, eight sons and one daughter, whose names and dates of birth are as follows, to wit,

William Leach married Judith Chasteen, settled in Morgan Co. Kentucky, died there leaving a widow and four or five children.

Sucan married John Hines who died leaving her with four children, one of whom died afterwards, who with the other three moved to Hendricks Co. Indiana.

Enos married Elizabeth Montgomery, settled first in Morgan Co. Kontucky, then moved to Hendricks Co. Indiana near Lizton and died leaving a widow and six children all of them married except the youngest who still laves with her mother.

Peter married Mary Ann Trumble, removed to Morgan Co. Ind. and then to Hendricks Co. Ind. From some cause best known to himself, left his wife with four or five children and went west, perhaps died somewhere in the state of Missouri. Ho was a carpenter and bridge builder by occupation und was chief boss in constructing the old wooden bridge across White River at Indianapolis.

John married Namey Dale, removed to Putnam Co. Ind. lived there some years and removed to Bath Co. Ky., remained there several years and removed to Boone Co. Ind. and now in 1879 has removed to Kansas.

James married Mahala Montjoy and lived and died in Bath Co. Ky. He had several children. Two of his sone I think were killed definding the Stars and Stripes in the Missouri caealry in the late rebellion.

Meredith married Eliza Allison, removed to Hendricks Co. Ind and died there leaving a widow and several children. Thexatileaxiates

Anderson migrated to Hendricks Co. Ind while single and there married Matilda Montgomery, died near Lizton, leaving a widow and five children. The widow is now dead and two of the children occupy the old homestead one living a short distance south of the old home, one in Missouri and one unmarried lives with Mrs. Vieley, widow of Jesse Veiley.

Elias Leach migrated to Hendricks Co. Ind. in the spring of 1836, married Susan Leak, May 17, 1839, who departed this life Sept 23, 1875, having borne me six children, four girls and two boys, three of whom have long since gone to the spirit land and no doubt are enjoying the felicity of celestial peace, while the other three are still here, one with me and the other two near by as sojourners and pilgrims in a foreign land waiting the appointed time to leave the shores of mortality.

Now I am through with the family history and it being requested that I should give some account of myself in particular of my youthful days I will proceed to give a short sketch. I suppose like most children and young people when I was growing up, full of mischief as a matter of course, but I preceive a vast difference in the way children are raised and privileges given now and when I was a youth. I never than saw boys running around with a cigar in their mouth and a bottle of whiskey in their pockets. Such a thing so a boy being drunk was unknown. There was a few and but few middle aged and old men in my knowing drank to excess. Now as to how I was employed and what I was doing in general from my earliest recollection is as follows, to wit, —

About the first I distinctly recollect was sitting on my father's knee learning songs or hymns. I know several songs and tunes that I well remember his taking me on his knee and have me repeat the words until could repeat all clearly, and while too small to do much on the farm, I had to stay at the house und help my mother, she being rather an invalid or cripple so that at times could walk but little.

Father owned a black women but mother persuaded him to sell her, that she would rather do with what I could help hor. So after I could help on the farm I helped about the house of morning and nights, done the

milking and very often washing and cooking. During the fall and winter I went to school.

In the fall and winter I put in a good portion of time in filling quille and assisting father in putting warps in the loom as he used to weave almost all of the time during the fall and winter, also during the spring and summer. I generally went fishing once or twice a week, there being a good sized creek running along one side of the farm, which here would be called a river, it being almost as large as White River and afforded water for a good part of the year for two or three iron work mills. About five miles off was what was called State furnace where they melted the crude oar as it was dug out of the ground, Some was melted in kettled and all kinds of iron vessels, and some was run out in plugs about three feet long and weighing about one hundred pounds which was sent to the forge. This was drawn out into bar iron by a hammer, weighing about a hundred that was run by water power.

And by the by for pass time I wont with the girls considerably of Sunday and odd times, such as Maria Thompson a beautiful blond, her hair being red enough to light a candle. Julia Kincaid a beautiful brunett, and a number of others such as Casander Nichols, Rebecca Robertson, Julia Ragland, Tabitha Stepens &. U

In the spring of 1836 I concluded to come to Indiana, father having been here the fall before and confluded to come to out and make arrangements to move the next fall. So we started the first of March and landed in Hendricks Co. the first day of April. There being no railroads and but little of any kind except mud. Making the journey on horse back most of the way we had a very pleasant time until we crossed the Ohio River at radison on Monday morning. Soon after a steady rain commenced. We still traveled on to a town called Marion; there we put up and still it rained until next day about 11 o'clock. We again journeyed and landed at brother Enos Leach's on the first day of April, having been through and over lots of mud and water.

In a few days after I went to teaching school. Taught three months and then took up for six months in a babin near Lizton, I think about the south east corner of the yard where the Alexander house burnt, west of the creek. Having taught for about four months was taken down with inflamitory rhoumatism and had to quit. Father having moved out and settle near Eel River about two miles below where Lizton now is. I went there it being about the twentieth of December 1836, and was never able to get out until the middle of March 1837. As soon as able I went over on White Lick east of where the widow

Warrick now lives. Father having died a short time after my school was out, I went there and stayed that winter and during the summer of 1838 and worked on the farm and officiated as constable, being elected to that office in April 1838 and having taught the first school ever taught in the north part of Hendricks Co. on the cast for of 331 River, and the second on the west fork of White Lick.

Having entered the land where D.A. Baker now lives and also where Abe Strickland lives, I concluded after crop time in 1838 I built a cabin where Baker's stable lot now is and kept batch about eight months becore I married, which as before stated was the 17th day of May 1839.

Now to return to what I was doing for a livelihood after marriage. I generally worked on the farm in summer and taught school in winter, cleared some ground and hired some cleared. And severa years officiated as constable until 1848. Having learned the use of tools, commenced work in a cabinet shop in Pittsboro with Aaron V. Keith for one year. In 1849 moved to Pittsboro and ran a cabinet shop and sometimes done jobs of house carpentry. Was justice of the peace for four years and constable sixteen years. ... (few lines mutilated)

The first two items must be completed to obtain a certificate. Additional information helpful is occupation of pioneer, public office held, political party, where educated, church affiliation. If descendancy can be traced to more than one ancestor other blanks must be used. Ask for them.
