## THE LEAK FAMILY, OR LEAKE FAMILY

It is probable that the Leake family came to England from Normandy with William the Conqueror or soon after as the name is first spelled "deLoc". A Luke deLec is spoken of in "Cathedral Charters" in 1208 and in the same book Robert de Lek is spoken of in 1272, as being presented to Levertan church of Lincolnshire, England. The English Geneaologist, book 4, names several Leakes in trees of Lincolnshire families. Simon de Lake is mentioned nine generations back of 1562 making it about 1275 to 1300. We see from this that the name Leak was gradually undergoing a change. In the record of Tax Collections in Langaster County, England, John de Leek paid five shillings (V B) in 1332.

We find record of many Leake's in England about this time. Robert, William, John, Francis, Richard, Walter, Elizabeth, Mary, Susan are common names in the family. Leake, Leek, and Leak are spellings used but Leake is most common.

The name was rather prominent in English History in the 17th century. Sir Robert Leake is mentioned as living about 1400 and we take it that he was the ancestor of some of the 17th century Leake's.

Sir Francis Leake lived about 1550 to 1611. He was probably the father of Sir Francis Leake, first Earl of Scaradale - 1581 to 1655. (He was made Earl in 1645.) He was also the father of Richard Leake who lived about 1590 to 1660, making Sir Francis II and Richard brothers. Sir Nicholas, second Earl of Scaradale, 1635 to 1681 was son of Sir Francis II and Sir Robert, third Earl of Scaradale who lived 1659 to 1684 was son of Sir Micholas. Sir Francis II married Anne Carey. Sir Micholas married rady Francis Rich, 3rd daughter of Robert Rich who was 3nd earl of Warwick.

Richard Leake (1590 - 1660) was the father of capt. Richard Leake who lived 1620 to 1696. He was a gunner in the Brittich Navy. His son Sir John Leake who lived 1656 to 1720. He was a noted Brittish Admiral. He was knighted by Queen Ann, Feb. 3, 1703 and was made Vice-Admiral. In 1705 he defended Gibralter, defeating the French fleet, for which he was made admiral and later First Lord of the Admirality. In 1708 he captured Minorca.

His only son Richard lived 1683 to 1720, dying a few months before his father leaving no hears. He probably did not amount to much. Sir John Made Stephen Martin Leake, his nephew, his heir. Stephen Martin Leake was the son of Stephen Martin who married a sister of the wife of Sir John and he was such an admirer of Sir John that he took the additional name of Leake.

puring the early settling of the States a number of Leakes imigrated to America. There were Leakes in New York as early as 1640 also others in Massachusetts at an early date.

In Green's "Early Virginia Immigrants" 1623 - 1666, we find the following names and dates; John Leake, 1625; Andrew Leake, 1642; Richard Leake, Accomach Co., 1636; Richard Leake, Norfolk Co., 1637; Richard Leake, Lower Norfolk Co., 1643; Christopher Leake, Northumberland Co., 1654 and Fra. Leak, Northumberland Co., 1655. We know very little if anything about the descendents of these. There are many people in the United States bearing the name Leake who do not connect with either family we know at least there are no proofs at present.

There are two familyes of the Leake name that have fairly accurate records. One of these is headed by william Leake who settled in Goochland Co., Va. in 1685. He married Mary Bostick and they came direct from England. This family is known as the "Goochland Co.Family". The other family is headed by Samuel Leake who with two sons came from England about 1770, and is said to have settled in the Valley of Virginia but the family a few years later was living in Albemarle and Orange Counties. Several of the Goochland Co. family later (about 1785) moved to Albemarle county.

Samuel Leake married a Miss Raner. Their sons who came to Virginia were william and Robert. It is said by some of the present descendents in Virginia that there was another son who stayed in England.

We are given some information on this family thru a copy of a sketch written by Robert Sharp Leake in 1897. He lived in west Jefferson, Ohio. Information about the Goodhland Co. family comes through a copy of the "Richmond Times-Dispatch" of Feb. 14, 1905, and also from John Marion Leake of Richmond, Virginia, and others.

Those two families were surely rather closely related through the English Leakes and surely knew their relationship and visited each other in Virginia. This theory is proved to some extent by the fact that county records of those two Va. Counties show dates and names

and marriage records of the two families in the same county.

Both families claim to be descended from Capt. Richard Leake (1630 - 1656) and claim relationship to Sir John Leake. The Goochland Co. family says Sir John and the William who settled in Va. in 1685 were first cousins. The goochland co. family claim relationship to the Earls of gearsdale and the Orange Co. family claims close relationship with Dr. John Leake, noted surgeon, who established the Westminister Lying-in-Hespital. He lived 1739 to 1792. The goochland family also claim to be related to him. The Orange Co. family claims that Samuel was a grandson of a Richard.

Dr. John Leake had two brothers and a sister, so we are told in English History. One brother was a doctor, Dr. William Leake of St. Philips Hospital, Minorea Islands. The other brother is not named in history but we are cure Samuel who was also a doctor and practiced madicine in Va. was the other brother of Dr. John.

The father of those brothers was William Leake, a clergyman of the English Church. He lived about 1705-1775. He in turn was a son of Richard Leake as we have it and Richard was either son or nophew of Walter Leake who lived about 1635 to 1700. We are sure it was son as the two families in America claim kin and visited each other. Walter was the father of William who came to Va. in 1685 from Nottingham, England. So he and Richard were brothers, Richard having stayed in England. Now Walter seems to have been a brother of Capt. Richard Leake (1620-1696). This would make William who came to Va. in 1685 a first cousin of Sir John Leake (1656 - 1720).

There are a few names peculair to each of these families. William, Samuel and John are used in both. John is more common in the Orange family. Walter, Mask and Josian are peculaar to the Goochland Co. family, while James and Robert are seldom used in this family and are often used in the Orange Co. family.

William Loake, son of Walter, who married Mary Bostick and settled in Goochland Co. in 1685 was the father of Walter, born in 1686. This is the only child named in the family history but there is the term "and others".

In William and Mary Quarterly, 6:198 we have extract from the Registrar of St. Peter's Parish, New Kent County, Va. giving children of William Leake, Mary and William, baptized 1694; Peter, baptized 1697; Jano and Richard, baptized Dec. 1711. This is one of the old churches of Virginia. It was here that George Washington and Martha Custis were married. William Leake lived at "Rocky Spring" in Goochland Co. about 35 miles above Richmond. New Kent Church is about 25 miles below Richmond, making about 60 miles between. But in that day of long distances and few churches they could and probably did go there to have their children baptized. And the fact that two were baptized at one time on two occasions would go to prove that they were seldom there. Jone and Richard were baptized in 1711 and the records show that Jane was born Jan 11, 1700. Then another item says: Josias, son of William and Sarah Leake was born Nov. 1, 1738. This William must have been the one paptized in 1694. yet this could have been of a different family.

A John Leake seems to come in here somewhere, as a "History of Albemarle Co." says Walter Leeke, Jr. entered land on the south fork of the Hardward River in 1748. Were these two men brothers? They probably were.

Walter Leake inherited the old homestead called "Rocky Spring". He married Judith Mask. They had ten children according to his will dated Oct. 31, 1757 and probated May 16, 1758, recorded in need and Will Book No. 7, page 279. The children wore Samuel, Josiah, who inherited the homestead, John, William, Mask, Elicha, Mary Christian, Christian Johnson, Judith and Elizabeth.

The name in this will is spelled Leak - without the final E.

Josiah Loake was a Revolutionary Soldier, as given in the Virginia State Library list. John M., Mask, and Elisha are also listed.

According to family historians there was a son Samuel who was a Presbyterian minister.

3.3 - Josiah Leake, son of malter and Judith Leake is given by sone as the fourth shild and by others as the sixth. He inherited "Rocky Spring" estate.

Josiah Loake had seven children according to the Goochland family history but we think we have excellent proof that there were eight children, Susamah Leake who married Robert Leake in 1784 being one of the oldest, a daughter of Ann Fenton.

We will first take up the discussion of Walter Leake's family. Walter was the oldest son of Josiah Leake. He married gueannah Jones March 26, 1791 and migrated to Mayaville, Kentucky. Walter is mentioned in his father's will, which was probated in 1795, as having previously received land by deed. It is evident that he had gone to Kentucky sometime previous to 1795 and after 1791. As kentucky was co far away in time at that early date it is very certain that Walter had received his share of the estate while his father was

This would be living and before he left for Kentucky. much more convenient for all concerned.

Walter Leake was a man of high standing in his adopted state as is shown by his having been elected to the state legislature at one time.

The following is from the post script of J.T.Leake's letter of W.J. Leake, Ashland, Va. 1889, containing the foregoing about Walter Leake and descendents:

"Uncle Walter died at the home of his nephew Andrew Brockman, in Iowas in 1865. He was buried on the Brockman farm. His wife and Aunt Betsy returned to Missouri at the time of his death. His nephew, Andrew Brockman lived in Linn (?) Lusie Co., Iowa.

"Grandpa, Walter Leake, married his let, 2nd, or 3rd cousin, Susannah Jones. He was born in 1769 and died in 1853. She died in the summer of 1848. They were buried on the olf farm near Mayelick, Mason Co., Ky.

"I have a letter from James Brookman dated 1881 in which he states cousin Mary E. Emery, daughter of Aunt Sallie Leake lives in Fredonia, Wilson Co., Kaneas.

"Aunt Kitty Brockman and Uncle Franklin Leake were neigher of them dead the last we head of them. Uncle Franklin lived in Roy Co., Missouri, but do not know his Post Office."

#### J.T. Leake

This completes the list of descendents of Walter as far as we know them. Some historians give Walter as the third child, the oldest of the marriage of Josiah Leake, Sr. and his second wife, Anne Minter, but we put him fourth and oldest in the second marriage.

- Of the children of Josiah Leake, Sr. and Ann Fenton 1.3 Lucy Leake is given as the oldest. She was born about 1760 or 1761, m. Frederick Jones. She died in 1813.
- 2.3 Judith Leake, second daughter of osiah Leake, Sr. and Ann Fonton b. about 1762 or 1763. m. Charles Woodson, Sept. 23, 1780. The had children, Tarbeton, William, Lucy, Frederick, Nancy and Charles, b. 1784.
- 3.3 Now comes susannah Leake, third daughter of Josiah Leake Sr. and Ann Fenton, born about 1764 or 1765. It seems that her mother died soon after she was born. Then we believe that she at that time or later went to live with her Uncle Elisha Leake. She is not mentioned in Josiah Leake's will, neither is she mentioned in Elisha Leake's will. Since Elisha simply took care of her until she was able to care for herself it is natural that she is not mentioned in his will. The reasons we think she lived with Elisha is that she named one of her sons Elisha and a daughter Fanny. These two are the only Elisha Leake's we have ever found in the Leake family.

She nemed one daughter Fanny, and the second wife of Elisha was Fanny Curd. Fanny Curd was married using the name "Fanny" but Elisha speaks of her in his will as Frances.

Now Fanny Leake, daughter of Susannah and Robert Leake entered land in Hendricks Co. Indiana, Nov. 11, 1834 as "Fanny" Loak and she was married to James D. Brockman in Hendricks Co., Indiana, Fob. 11, 1835 as "Frances" Leak. Dr. E.K. Leake of Collierville, Tenn. a great grandson of Elisha Leake says he thinks he remembers the older people talking of a Susan Leake in the family of Elisha Leake.

3.3 - Susannah Leake and Robert Leake were married in Orange Co., Dec. 21, 1784 and went to Kentucky about the time the Walter Leake family went. being in the neighborhood of 1794 as we have it from her family. Josiah Leake Sr. died in 1795. His will was probated sept 21, 1795. It was dated July 10, 1794. Josiah in his will gives his other three daughters each a negro woman and a few household effects so he had surely given susan the same when she left for Kentucky and it was not deemed necessary to mention her name in the will.

The main proof to us that Susannah Leake was a daughter of rosish Leake, Sr. is that our father told us that his father, one of the oldest grandsons of Robert and Susan Leake, told him that (1) Susan had a "darkey" brought from Virginia to Kentucky. (2) that she had a brother whom he (my father) thought was Walter. (3) that this Walter had children. We remembered hearing about three, two sons and a daughter, and that one son was Chesloigh and the other Walter and that he thought they married Brockman's. (4) That children of Walter (brother of Susan) went south, he thought to Texas.

Now going to the above record of Walter Leake, son of Josiah Leake, Sr. we find that - (1) Walter Leake went to Mason Co., Kentucky, while Robert and Susan went to Bracken Co., just over the line from Mason Co., (2) they went to Kentucky and lived there simultaneously. (3) Walter had sons, Chesleigh and Walter. This Chesleigh is Walter had sons, Chesleigh and Walter. This Chesleigh is the only one of that name we have found in the Leake family. It is an unusaul name. (4) Two of Walter's daughters married Brockman's. Also three of Robert and Susan's children married Brockman's. (5) Most of the Gusan's children married Brockman's. (5) Most of the descendents of Walter Leake of whom we have learned lived in Texas, while some lived in Missouri and California.

For these reasons we feel that Sausnnah Loake who married Robert Leaks was a sister of Walter Leaks of Mason Co. Ky. and a daughter of Josiah Loaks, Sr. of Goochland Co. Va. We will leave Susan until we come to the family of Robert Leaks, under Dr. Samuel.

William Leake, son of Walter and Judith Mask, was born in 1720 and by his father's will has given 3.3 land in Buckingham County, Va., as well as a share in the homostead. This latter interest he conveyed by deed dated 1764 to his brother, Josiah Leake. Ho married Judith Mosley in Buckingham Co. subsequent to 1761. About 1765 he moved to Pedce River in North Carolina, where he died. On July 7, 1763 Gov. Francis Fauquir granted William Leak 400 acres of land on both sides of the Banieter River in Lunenburg Co. ddjoining William Gray and william Leak.

This N.C. family of Leake dropped the final E in Leake and have since spelled the name Leak.

Mask had been given land in Albemarle Co. by his father, and this is where he lived. He became a man of influence. During the Revolution he was Captain of an Albemarle company and was at the battle of Yorktown with his sons, William and Walter. He was an elder in Cove Church. He didd in 1813. His will was written in 1806 and probated in Albemarle Co. in 1813.

His son Walter later became Governor of Mississipps. When Lafayette was in that state in 1824 Gov. Leake was finfined to his bed by a disease of which he died later; but sent his aideAdo-comp to bear his respects to Lafayette. As soon as the name was mentioned Lafayette repeated it, "Walter Loake! I think I remember him, is he not from Virginia?" He was told that he was, "Well," "He was a deserter during the Revolutionary said he. War." Then he related an incident which he believed to be authenticated. When capt. Mask Leake was about leaving home in 1781 to lead his company into war, Walter then seventeen years old, insisted on going with his father, but his father told him that he had given up his oldest son to the cause, and that he (Walter) must saty at home to aid in the care of his mother and the little ones. accordingly left him. In two days after the boy's mother, a true patriot, fitted him up and told him to go fight for his country, and that she would take care of the little folks and the farm herself. The boy accordingly went and took part in the seige of Yorktown. On reaching that point his father took him to Lafayette, stated the circumstance and begged an easy borth for his runaway son, which was granted. "And so", said Lafayette. "Walter Leake deserted home to fight for his Country,"

This completes the family of William Leake and Mary Bostick Leake. Though it is brief, we have given all the names at hand and told most of the interesting data given us about the. There is an old Biblo still in existance owned by Suc Howard Leake, one of the daughters of Charles L. Loake, con of Walter Deniel Leake. This Bible was brought from England by Mary Bostick Leake. It was given to her by her grandfather Bostick.

Charles L. Leake was the last of the Loako line to own "Rocky Spring" plantation. At his death it went to his wife and two daughters. Mrs. Loaks operated it for a number of years. It was sold about 1900 or 1905, having been in the family more than two hundred years. house as it originally was is said to have been built by William Leako, who came to Virginia in 1685.

John Marion Leake of Richmond, Va. has this to say

about "Rocky Spring".

"The plantation and mill mentioned in Walter Leake's willis the 'Rocky Spring' tract. The mill in quite near to where the P.O. at Licking now stands. 'Rocky Spring' is a spring in solid rock of exceptionally pure water. The plantation originally was composed of somothing like 1500 or 1800 acros and was on both sides of the River Road. At the point where 'Rocky Spring' is is about two and one half or three miles from the James River. The original house was built by William Loaks and Mary Bostick, I prosume, do not know certainly. The house was originally one and a half story. My Uncle Walter D. Leake added to it and possibly his father before him. Charles L. Leake, the last Looks owner built the front and back florehos thirty-five or forty years ago (1885 or 1890). Since the place has passed out of the Loake's hands it has deteriorated immensely, land as well as buildings.

### Goochland Co. Va. branch

"'Rocky Spring' used to be a vory nice farm. I have heard my father say more than once it was one of the finest highland farms in Goochland Co. River farms, of course were finer. ....It is adapted to wheat, oats, corn and tobacco. Also fruite such as applies, pears, peaches and cherries, and vegetables of all kinds, as well as melons - water and cantalopes, grapes do exceedingly well."

"Rocky Spring' is five miles west of Goochland City and three miles from Irwis on the Mases River

division of the Chespeake and Ohio Railroad.

"East Leake is 13 or 14 miles from Rooky Spring. It was built by A.K. Leake, brother of C.L. Leake the last male owner of Rooky Spring."

This branch of the Leake family coming from Walter Leake and Judith Mask Leake is composed, as far as we are able to learn, of the best class of Old Virginia citizenry. Though not as rich as some they were always leaders in their communities, people of high honor, high moral standards, and were good Churchmen. They filled high offices of community and state. The present generation shows the same sterling characteristics. The principal occupations have been planters, lawyers, doctors, and clergymen, and in these they have been leaders.

Branch headed by Dr. Samuel Leake

The other branch of the Leake family in America, that headed by Dr. Samuel Lonko has been harder to trace and prove relationships for the reason that so many of them went west in the early settling of the Central states. They were always looking for a better place to live and consequently did not accumulate much wealth. They were less interested in keeping records and it was harder for them to keep in touch with each other because of the lack of adequate communication. If is said by geneaologists that the families who migrated west and lived for a time in Kentucky are the hardest to trace of any.

As well as we are able to learn, Dr. Samuel Leake, father of William and Robert Lenke, came with those two sons from England to America about 1770 and settled in Virginia, he thought near Staunton. But from what we have been able to learn through county records the family lived in Albemarle County before 1800 and we have concluded this may be where they first settled, though we have not found any records concerning Dr. samuel there, but only records of William's family.

Dr. Samuol Leake marriod a Miss Raner. We have been told by one person that he had heard from his father that there were three sone of Samuel and that one stayed in England.

. At least three or four of the children of William Leake secured marriage licenses in Albemarle Co. from about 1795 to 1815.

We will take these names separately. Dr. Samuel Leake, we feel sure was a Revolutionary Soldier. There are two Samuel Leake's on the list of Revolutionary soldiers and we are not able to tell who the other Samuel was, as all of whom we find record as living at that time seem to have been too young.

William, son of Samuel was a Revolutionary soldier and was in the battle of Yorktown. Robert, son of Samuel was probably too young. Many of the descendents of William went wort. Robert Sharp Leake, son of William, and his family went to Ohio about 1826. There seems to be some uncertainty about James Leako son of William. A James Loake, born 1789 is the ancestor of the large family living mostly in Orange and Albemarle counties of Va. Ho married Emily Mahanes in 1810. Ho sooms to fit in here as a son of William, just older than Robert Sharp. But several of this family claim that they are of the Goochland Co. branch of the Leake's and that they are related to the noted Shelton F. Leake, grandson of Mask Leake. They claim as further evidence that James and family lived in Goodhland Co. But there are others of the family who think as we do that they are descended from Dr. Samuel Leake and his son William Leake. There does not seem to us that there is any place in the Mask Loake family whore this branch will fit in. The only thing we see to do with this branch is to outline it here, tructing that it will not be entirely out of place.

Robert Sharp Leake, Jr. wrote to Mancy Leake Baldwin in 1897. He said in part, - " ... Dr. Samuel Leake came to Virginia and settled in the Valley. I only know two of his ohildren, my grandfather William and Grand Uncle Robert, who died many years since, at a great age. He lived near Mayaville, Ky. My grandfather was in the Revolutionary War and fought in the Battle of Yorktown. I have a five dollar continental note that was paid for his services."

Robert Leake, youngest son of Dr. Samuel Leake, and Susannah Leake, daughter of Josiah Leake of Goochland Co. Va. wore married in Orange Co. Virginia, December 21, 1784, with Lewis Willia as abourity. They lived in Culpopper County, Va. until about 1794. It is very probable that they and her brother Walter Leake and family went to Kentucky about the same time. Robert and Susan settled in Bracken County close to Minerva, just over the line from Dover in Mason County. They were buried in a grave yard near Minorva.

Walter Leake lived near Maysville, Mason Co. Ky.

They were buried in the Mays Lick grave yard.

Robert and Susan dropped the final E in Leake. We are told that this was caused by the fact that the people in Kentucky where they lived called the name "Leakey", trying to sound all the letters. This may have been the reason the William Loak family of North Carolina dropped the final E of the name.

Robert and guean Loak had eight children of whom we have record. There may have been one or two or porhaps three who did not reach mature years, as indicated by the dates of those recorded.

Received your packet of material on the LEAK family. Makes you think hard on your Charles Leak family when <u>twice</u> in the family, a LEAK marries a LEAK. Whoa!

Your question on the age of James Leak, son/o Charles and Virginia Leak:

The only Iowa census that I have the family on is the 1880 Iowa Guthrie County census, Cass twp. This states the children's ages as:

James age 17 (born ca. 1863) Henry E. age 15 son (born ca. 1865) Henrietta F. age 11 daug Martha A. age 6 Rebecca J. age 4

A son, Willard S. Leak died 18 Sept 1873 s/o Chas. M. and Rebecca The info you sent has Martha A. born 1873, - I do not know this Willard S. Leak's age, if a twin, or if a year old when he died.

Then of course you have a child, Infant son that died 26 June 1870 in Indiana before they came to Iowa.

Secondly, you asked about the 1860 census that you sent, if the Nancy listed on the census was a sister of Charles. Look at Hiram's family page that you sent. Besides Hiram having a daughter named Nancy, who was born 1823, and should have been 37 on the census. Son, William Leak married a girl by the name of Nancy and they had a son listed as named Jasper Leak. Just maybe the Nancy and children on this census is the wife of William. Just an idea.

Now I know you did not want to know about the Leak side of the family, namely Samuel G. Leak, the brother to Charles M. Leak, but on your papers p. 65, add the following dates and information from Union Co Iowa recorded records, so that you have this LEAK information for the next time you give it to someone.

Union Co , Afton Iowa Cemetery records have Samuel G. Leak's death date as the year 1916. Samuel G. Leak was married a third time to Mrs. Harriet Robinson on 3rd July 1890.

Wife/ 1 Catherine A. Leak died 21 Aug 1880 Afton, Iowa Typhoid fever age 45y 8m 8ds

Add: Samuel and wf/1, Catherine also had a daughter Ida Leak b.ca. 1864 and died 2 Sept 1880, 16 yr from typhoid fever.

Add: Samuel and wf/1 Catherine a daug born 1873 and died 1873 named, Winnie F. Leak

Marriage/2 to Hattie Lawrence on 24 Dec 1881 at res/o Mrs. J. Lawrence.

Add: birth date of Bennett Leak as being 24 March 1884 Afton, Iowa

Add: twins born - both males - 26 Jan 1886 Afton, Iowa
Death of twins - one 1st week of Feb and one 2nd week of Feb, 1886.
[This is what their death certificates state]

Wife/2 Hattie M. Leak died 1 Sept 1886 Afton, Ia 35y Om Ods by wound made by her own hands.

Marriage/3 3 July 1890 to Mrs. Harriett Robinson. She came from Plattsburg Nebraska.

Samuel's oldest son, Frank in 1891 was living in western Kansas. [From a newspaper item] Prior years son, Frank was a merchant in Afton. This son, Frank and his wife, Matilda Workman had a 2nd child born, male child, on 16 May 1884 in Union Co Iowa. [not listed on the family page 65 of what you sent.]

Also want to add, that remember Iowa and Nebraska were settled later than Indiana and Illinois. Guthrie County was formed in late 1851, but our earliest death recorded is 1880, and then it was not until after 1900 that you find all deaths recorded. It was 1880 for any births also. When these were recorded, sometimes the doctor only drove, by horse, to the courthouse once every 6 months or so. And sometimes the information was forgotten or lost.

Marriages, was different, as they had to obtain a marriage license. Quite often going by carriage to the courthouse and married there, etc. If a minister that lived close to the family, lived just over the line into the next county, then he could not marry the couple.

I found one early death, whose obit stated that she was married by the Judge \_\_\_\_\_ who was living in Panora, and this marriage was never recorded at the courthouse. I came across one early marriage that took place in the state of Missouri and was recorded in the miscellaneous book in the land deeds of Guthrie County Iowa after the couple came to Iowa.

For some years, Missouri was different in that you did not have to record all of the marriages like most of the states. This was probably this couples way of recording there marriage. And it could not be recorded in Guthrie Co Iowa marriages because it did not take place here. So funny things do happen.

What a sad tragedy in OK City, OK. Just cannot imagine people being so sick to kill so many innocent people. And with our messed up court systems where money can buy your way, we need a reform of some kind. Even in our little county, some of the things the judges have done --
