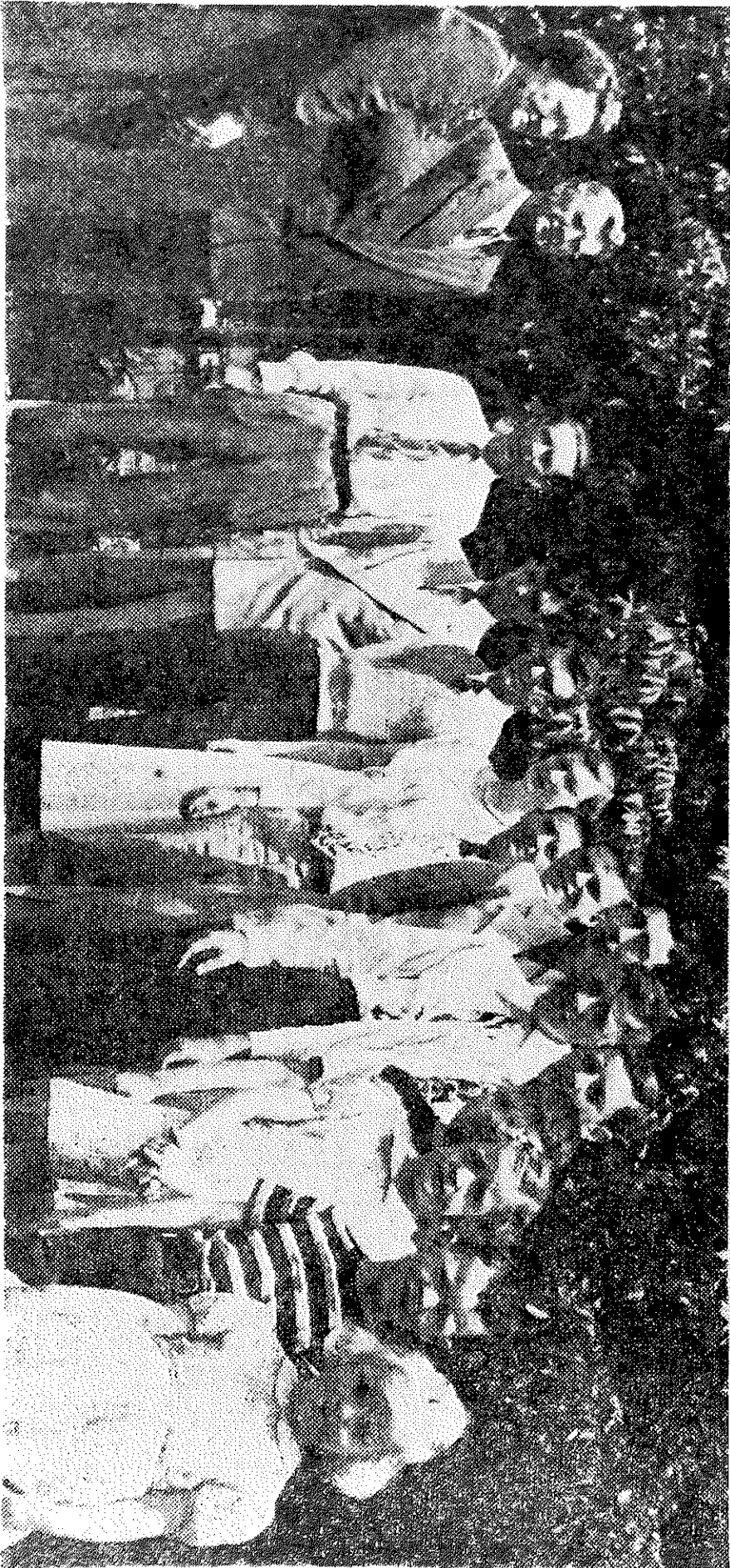

GEORGIA LONG RITES HELD MONDAY A.M.

Although a native of Lexington, Kentucky, Mrs. Georgia Curtis Long, had lived in Plainfield since infancy, the family having moved here about fifty years ago. She was 51 years old when she passed away last Thursday following an illness which began with a cerebral hemorrhage last February.

Funeral services were held at the Hampton Funeral Home Monday morning at 10 o'clock with the Rev. Warren Robbins conducting the service following which interment was made in Maple Hill cemetery.

Mrs. Long was the mother of a large family, most of whom survive but tragedy struck about five years ago when a son, William, then 13, was killed while riding his bicycle on East Main street in Plainfield. Other children, who survive are Richard, Raymond, Russell, Ralph, Mrs. Lois Maxwell Robert, Roy, Roland, Mrs. Ruth Fountain, Rollis Rex, Rosemary, Roger and Rita.

WE KNOW THAT THEY MOVED TO INDIANA WITH THEIR CHILDREN. BY THE TIME OF HIS DEATH IN JULY, 1862, THE CHILDREN WERE SCATTERED AS FAR WEST AS WASHINGTON TERRITORY. THEY DID NOT KNOW THE WHEREABOUTS OF TWO OF THEIR DAUGHTERS.

WILLIAM HAD DIED SOMEWHERE IN MISSOURI LEAVING A WIDOWN ELIZABETH AND A NINE YEAR OLD SON JAMES.

THEY MUST HAVE BEEN PROUD OF THEIR SON ELIJAH WHO BECAME A MINISTER AND WAS KNOWN AS SUCH THROUGH OUT THE STATE OF INDIANA, MINISTERING TO MANY THOUSANDS.

THEY MUST ~~BE~~ HAVE BEEN PROUD OF NANCY WHO REMAINED TO CARE FOR THEM IN THEIR ~~LATTER~~ LATER YEARS.

THEY MUST HAVE BEEN SADENED BY THE CIVIL WAR, BUT THEY DID NOT LIVE TO SEE JAMES GO TO WAR OR KNOW HE WAS KILLED AT LA GRANGE, TENNESSEE, APRIL, 1863.
