Dear Ms. Carter,

First I want to express my appreciation and thanks for the opportunity of copying 176 pp. from the Henry Hart Beeson — MENDHALLS: a genealogy book when we were in Plainfield on the afternoon of 2 May. When I worked with the book in July 1979 I was so new in the genealogy work that it never occured to me that I could make copies. Since that time I've found that I needed more information.

During the past year I have found MILLS FAMILY HISTORY by Paul Milks. In it my great grandparents, Daniel and Eliza Epperson Mills are listed.

Now I have a complete lineage from the first immigrant to America for both Mills-Mendenhall. The children of Daniel and Eliza Epperson Mills were born near Bradgeport, Ind.

I am enclosing documents for the purpose of correcting some of the entries in the Beeson book. You are welcome to keep all of these if you like but if not please return them and I will remit the postage. There are errors on some of the death certificates.

The last page which I copied was 262. My grandfather 4724 William Mendenhall is listed with a middle initial Q and it should be I(Ira). On his death certificate the place of his birth is Indiana but it should be Richland, Keokuk, Iowa. I can remember that he gave this as his birthplace. On this same page his wife should be Sarah Elizabeth Jones.

On the same page the **RENTE CORRECT spelling of the wife of Asa Meddenhall 2382 and the initial to read Sarah C (Catherine) Efner. Also, on p. 141 under 2382 the name is also misspelled.

On the same page the second marriage for Ira Mendenhall is not entered

MENDENHALL FAMILY

but on page 62 for 998 Ira Mendenhall it is correctly entered. As of yet I have never found Ira Mendenhall's place of burial. But a few months ago I found a clue that he is buried in Iowa. I hope this summer to drive to Iowa and try to find it.

THE JOHNSONS AND THEIR KIN of RANDOLPH

JESSIE OWEN SHAW

514 - 19th Street, N.W. Washington 6, D. C. October 15, 1955 The history of the Mendenhall family has been traced back to 1067, the year after the Norman Conquest of England. It was begun by the late William Mendenhall of Bath, England and continued to a much later date by Edward Mendenhall of Cincinnati, Ohio. Since 1932, it has been enlarged by Henry Hart Beeson, a g-g-g-grandson of Richard Beeson who was a brother of Charity Beeson (Beason) who became the wife of Mordecai Mendenhall. The earliest record we have of the Mendenhalls is that they lived at Marridge Hill, par Thanesbury, Wiltshire, England.

The name, originally Mildhale, has undergone three changes, to wit, Mildenhall, Mendengall, and Mendenhall. In England it is Mildenhall, there being a town by this name in each Suffolk and Wilkes counties. Of the sixteen families reported in the 1790 census of Guilford and Randolph counties, fifteen are listed as Mendengall; the other one, Aaron, is shown as Mendingall. As described in family tradition, the typical Mendenhall is darkskinned, large in statue, energetic, and sturdy.

The first land record we have of the family in America follows: "On September 5,. 1685, in the reign of our Sovereign Lord, King James II, of England, Scotland, France and Ireland, a deed for 500 acres of land was made by John Ewen of Draycoff of the one part and Moses Mendenhall of Marriage Hill, Parish of Reusbury, of the other part. The said five hundred acres was a part of 'Penn's Woods' which extended twelve miles west of the Delaware River and had been deeded or granted to William Penn by King Charles of England. This five hundred acres of Penn's Woods had been deeded by William Penn to Robert Ewen who in turn, for the sum of 15 pounds, deeded the tract to Moses Mendenhall." When the above-mentioned Moses Mendenhall came to Penn's Woods he was accompanied by his two brothers, John and Benjamin and his sisters, Margery and Mary. Of these five, Moses who, on March 2, 1690, married Elizabeth Bacon, returned to England. John settled in Chester county, Pa., and married Elizabeth Mores, or Mares. Benjamin settled on the Delaware River and married Ann Pennell of Middleton. Mary became the wife of Nathaniel Newlin. Marjory married Thomas Martin (N.C. Bible Records and Genealogies, p. 161).

The first Mendenhall to come to North Carolina was Benjamin, born March 5, 1691, son of Benjamin and Ann (Pennell) Mendenhall, who came on a religious journey. From the minutes of Pasquotank Monthley Meeting we have the following account of his visit: "Benjamin Mendenhall came a travelling from Pennsyllvany along with Samuel Hopwood and was taken sick and died May 13, 1743" (Hinshaw, Vol. I, p. 102). Mordecai, son of John and Elizabeth, was the first member of this family to settle in North Carolina. "September 27, 1736, Mordecai Mendenhall and wife got certificate from New Garden Monthly Meeting, Pennsylvania, to Hopewell M.M., Virginia. On March 6, 1751, Mordecai Mendenhall, wife Charity, and children, got certificate from Hopewell, M.M., Virginia, to Cane Creek M.M., N.C." (Hinshaw, Vol. 6, p. 422). "On March 7, 1752, Mordecai Mendenhall, wife Charity, and children were received on certificate at Cane Creek, M.M., N.C., from Hopewell M.M., Va." (Hinshaw, p. 408.)

In 1758, Mordecai Mendenhall and his wife, Charity, of Rowan (now Guilford) county sold to Nathan Dick, 450 acres of land on Horsepen Creek. In 1792, for the sum of 10 shillings, Lord Granville granted to William Armfield, 540 acres of land in St. Luke's Parish. At the same time, and for the same amount, Granville granted to James Mendenhall, 204 acres on Deep River, adjoining the land of Richard Beason (Beeson) (Stockard, p. 22). About the year 1772, Mordecai Mendenhall (son of John and Susannah) deeded two tracts of land to Stephen Mendenhall who had also bought a tract from William Milliken (Court House Records, Guilford Co.). In 1778, Elisha Mendenhall established a water mill on Deep River. This mill was later known as Coltrane's mill (Blair, p. 27). Among the charter members of Springfield meetinghouseof the Quakers, where meeting together for worship began in 1773, were the following Mendenhalls: Dinah, Elizabeth, Isaac, Jane, Marjory, Moses, Phebe, Rachel, Richard, and Sarah (Hinshaw, p. 846).

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Mordecai and Charity (Beeson) Mendenhall were the progenitors of the Mendenhalls who lived in the Bush Hill section, now known as Archdale. James Mendenhall, son of Aaron and Rose, and his second wife, Hannah Thomas, settled at Old Florence, a hamlet of the Jamestown-New Garden section of Rowan (now Guilford) county, in 1772. In 1775, James and Hannah got certificate to Wrightsboro M.M., Georgia; their son George who, in 1774, had married Judith Gardner, remained in Guilford.

In the establishment of New Garden, now known as Guilford College (in 1830) and of Union Institute, the beginning of Duke University (in 1838), the Mendenhalls manifested a deep concern in the educational advantages of the communities in which they lived. George C. Mendenhall, son of George and Judith, and State Senator from Guilford, was instrumental in securing a charter for New Garden. Nathan, brother of George C., was one of five men, including Dougan Clark, who were appointed to prepare addresses to be delivered in behalf of this school (Stockard, pp. 85-87). Joseph Mendenhall, great-grandson of Mordecai and Charity (Beeson) Mendenhall, was one of the four men who started Union Institute.

The 1790 census for North Carolina shows sixteen families of Mendenhalls (spelled with a "g") as residents of that part of Guilford county that adjoins Trinity township, Randolph county. The sixteen households included 95 persons, but no slaves. Listed approximately in the order in which they appear in the census report, these households with their respective members follow.

FORMER LANSING Guard Dies at 75

W. I Mendenhall, Who Came From Ft. Scott in 1909, Passed Away Friday—Services Monday.

W. I. Mendenhall, for many years a familiar figure on the streets of Leavenworth and an active worker in the Republican party, died Friday evening at his home in Lansing. He was 75 years of age. He had been ill three weeks.

Mr. Mendenhall went to Lansing from Fort Scott, Kas. in 1909, serving as a prison guard at the state penitentiary until his retirement about two years ago. He served in many capacities at the prison and for several years was in charge of the ward for criminal insane. During the last campaign he served as chairman for the Landon for Governor, club, being in charge of the Landon headquarters at Lansing.

Born November 24, 1857, at Richmond, Iowa. Mr. Mendenhall was married April 6, 1881, at Plainfield, Ind., to Miss Sarah E. Jones Later they made their home at Fort Scott, from which place he was appointed to the prison personnel.

Mr. Mendenhall is survived by his widow; two daughters, Mrs. C. A. Mills; Lansing, and Mrs. E. B. Moss. Shreveport, La.; seven grandchildren and three great grandchildren; one brother, George Mendenhall, Plainfield, Ind.

The body will be removed from the Davis funeral church to the residence this morning to lie in state until 9 o'clock Monday when the service will be held, Chaplain Fred Benson officiating. Following the services the body will be taken by motor hearse to Fort Scott for burial.

FIRST FAMILY OF JOHN LINE THROUGH HIS SON JOHN.

And through Mordecai's Sons, Mordecai and Moses. (Known as the Mordecai Line.)

JOHN, one of the emigrants, brother of Benjamin and Mary, came from the same place (Mildenhall, England) to America; he was one of the early settlers and settled in Concord, Pa. In 1685, he was married to Elizabeth, the daughter of George Morris, of Springfield Township, Pennsylvania. He was a 'Friend' and was active and influential in the Society. In 1697, he granted the grounds occupied by the Concord Friend Meeting House and graveyards. In 1708, his wife being deceased, he contracted a second marriage with Hester Dix. He was one of the original shareholders in the first Concord Mills. The lands for the Friends Meeting House and Graveyard at Concord was leased to the trustees by this John Mendenhall in 1697, for the consideration for one Pepper Corn yearly forever; a meeting house was erected that year or the next. This meeting house was destroyed by fire about the year 1787. In the apartment in which the congregation assembled there was no place for fires but before the meeting assembled in cold weather, those wishing to make themselves comfortable, resorted to fires made in open fire places in each end of the attic, and from one of these the building took fire. The large meeting house built lalter, supplied the place of the one destroyed by fire, and since the division of the Society a second one has been built on the same lot. It is not known that John had any children by his second wife, but by his first wife Elizabeth, he had three children, viz. George, John and Aaron.

George, the first child of John, was born 6th mo. 16th day, 1686. Died single, as per the records of history of Pennsylvania.

John, the second son of John the emigrant, was born 4th mo. 3rd day 1688. Married Susan Pierson, a daughter of Thomas Pierson and sister to his brother Aaron's wife. In 1709, he and his brother Aaron settled in East Caln, Pennsylvania, from whence he went to Lancaster County, Pennsylvania and finally to Virginia, and there can be no doubt but that he was the father of Mordecai of North Carolina, as this Mordecai, was a cousin of James, who was a son of Aaron, John's only brother that was married, and if he was a cousin of James, there can be no other way it could be so. He and his cousin James, settled in North Carolina. Some claimed, that this Mordecai was a half brother

FOURTH FAMILY OF JOHN LINE, THROUGH HIS SON JOHN.

RICHARD, son of Mordecai the older, was killed by the Indians while traveling from North Carolina to the west, at a place called Crab Orchard, or Lexington, Kentucky, and another Mendenhall, John, who was a son of Stephen, were attempting to follow Daniel Boone across the mountains, at Cumberlin Gap. He had five children: 1. John. 2. Richard. 3. Benjamin. 4. Joseph. 5. Aaron. Records do not show he had any daughters.

JOHN, son of Richard, moved from Guilford County, North Carolina, to Green County, Ohio, in 1804. He was born March 6th, 1759, and married Ruth Brown, May 6th, 1785, in North Carolina, and had a large family. 1. Richard. 2. William. 3. Benjamin. 4. Nathan. 5. Joseph. 6. Aaron. 7. John. 8. Amelia. 9. Margaret. 10. Ruth. 11. Catherine. 12. Nancy. The descendants of this John were as follows: Richard was born in 1793. Married Elizabeth Barnett, and had eight children: 1. Amelia. 2. William. 3. Isaac. 4. Polly. 5. Nancy. 6. Margaret Allen. 7. Richard. 8. Nathan.

AMELIA, daughter of Richard and Elizabeth, was born at Spring Valley, Ohio, in 1817; married Edward Haworth, 1834, and died near West Newton, Indiana. To them were born six children:

- 2. Mary, who married Claus Wiltorf, of West Newton, Ind.
- 3. John D., who married Fanny Houser, of West Newton, Ind.

of James, but this could not be so, as there is no records that show of any second marriage of Aaron, and also he was deceased six years before his wife Rose, hence Mordecai, the son of John and his descendants; a few unimportant decrepencies may appear between them, such as the number of children born and the order of their names, but in the more important features they are undoubtedly correct. There are no records that I could get that gave to whom this Mordecai married, but to them were born nine children: 1. John. 2. Mordecai. 3. Moses. 4. Thomas. 5. Stephen. 6. Aaron. 7. Isaac. 8. Charity. 9. Richard.

JOHN, the first son of Mordecai; I have no trace of him.

Mordecat, son of Mordecai, the elder, married Hannah Marshall and about 1800 moved from Guilford County, N. C. or Stark County, to Tennessee, where he remained for about twelve years, when he moved to Wayne County, Ohio. To them were born seven children: 1. Mordecai. 2. William. 3. Rebecca. 4. Hannah. 5. Charitha. 6. Ailes. 7. Ruth. All are of Tennessee. (William, Ailes, and Ruth, moved with them to Ohio.

Mordecai, son of second Mordecai, at the age of 17 went with his father to Tennessee and afterwards married Ailse Mills, and had nine children:

JOHN, married Elizabeth Ellmore, and had children: William F., Marshall M., Joseph R. Mary Jane. John was a farmer and has been dead for years. Of this family, I have received no records.

HANNAH, daughter of second Mordecai, married John Haworth, and had Isaac J. Richard H. and John.

SARAH, married Benjamin Woodward and had Nancy, Mary J. and Joseph. Nancy, married Wm. Bates and had no children.

JANE, married Frederick Metzgar, and had Christina E., William, Mary. They moved to Indiana, where Metzgar died and Jane returned to Tennessee.

WILLIAM, twin of Jane, was a merchant and married the widow Mary Branner, who was the only child of Col. John Robert. They were quite wealthy, living near Mossy Creek, Tennessee. She had ten children by her former husband. No record of any children by second marriage.

ELIZABETH, Ruth and Joseph were all single, and lived at the old homestead on the Holsten River in Jefferson County, Tennessee, near Mossy Creek, when the old history was written in 1865. I have received no trace of this family.

WILLIAM, son of Modecai, the second, married Elizabeth Carper at Strawberry Plains, Tennessee in 1803, and went to Ohio with his father, and died in 1840. To them were born 12 children: 1. Isaac. 2. Jacob. 3. Mordecai. 4. Het-

LAYTON, was born 1845. Married Sarah Reagen, 1865, and had the following children: 1. Elmer J. 2. Charles L. 3. Ora Harvey.

ELMER J., was born at West Newton, Indiana, Sept. 19th, 1868, and married Gertrude Cropper, Aug. 12th, 1891, of Sheridan, Ind., and was a farmer; was also engaged in the shoe business at Sheridan. 
