

The Montgomery Family

William Montgomery was born in Virginia, Dec. 10, 1779. It is thought that his father's name was also William and that he was a Revolutionary soldier on the frontier border. This family was related to the family of the Irish poet, James Montgomery. We know that William (1779) had a brother James and family tradition says that he also had brothers Philip and Joseph.

It is not known from what county in Virginia the Montgomery's came. Following are two records which give family names that might indicate the early homes of the Montgomery's.

In Colonial Militia records of an Augusta Co. Va. company of 1758 show these Montgomery's - Robert, James, Samuel, John, Joseph, James, Jr. and John.

First Census of Virginia - Amherst Co. 1785 gives the following:

Tradition says that Philip Montgomery was in the Revolution and that Joseph was in an Indian skirmish. The story goes that he and some comrades had been on a river and were trying to reach a fort on the bank. While running from the river to the fort one of the comrades was wounded and Joseph stopped to help him and he was himself wounded in the hip but both managed to reach the fort.

William Montgomery married Sarah Gibson and James Montgomery married a sister of here - Elizabeth Gibson.

The parents of William and Sarah were in a fort in Virginia when William and Sarah were babies and the two were rocked in the same cradle.

It is thought that the Montgomery's and Gibsons settled in Kentucky about the close of the Revolution. William Montgomery lived in Morgan County on the Licking River near West Liberty. The Gibson's probably lived in the same neighborhood.

William Montgomery and Sarah Gibson were married about 1800. They had eight children as follows:

1. Mary, married a Howard. They probably always lived in Kentucky.
2. Elizabeth, b. Jan. 17, 1805, d. Feb. 24, 1891. Married Enos Leach. Came to Hendricks Co. Indiana in 1832. Her descendants include Leach's, Scott's, Runnels', Leak's, Keeney's, Burnett's, Ayers', Money's, Skenoh's, Overstreet's, Leak's, Tucker's Davis's, Spangler's, Hall's, etc. For more detail see Leach family of Hendricks Co. Indiana.
3. Margaret, b. Oct., 6, 1807, d. Aug. 11, 1849. Married James Montgomery O'Hair on March 5, 1825. They lived in Putnam Co. Indiana and had many descendants. The O'Hair family was very prominent in Putnam Co. For further details see history of family under Putnam Co. records.
4. Matilda, b. Dec. 20, 1810. Married Anderson Leach, a brother of Enos. They settled in Hendricks Co. Indiana.

William and Sarah Montgomery, the first permanent settlers in Union township, Hendricks Co. Indiana were more advanced in years at this time than most of the settlers who came soon after, he being 53 and she 51. They had been able to accumulate more material wealth than the

young settlers about them. When they came in the fall of 1830 they brought with them a fine clock and a bedstead, articles which were at first rare in the community. (These are now in the possession of a descendent, Roscoe, R. Leak, Lizton, Ind.)

William Montgomery entered 80 acres of land on a small stream one half mile south of where Lizton now is on Oct. 21, 1830. The land office was at Crawfordsville, Indiana at that time.

They built a three-sided hut, covered with bark and lived in this and the covered wagon during the first winter. There were no neighbors for miles. Those were long lonesome days for Sarah, the wife and mother. She had left married children and grandchildren in Kentucky and she was homesick. The story has come down to her descendents of her walking many times over to a high piece of ground and gazing with longing eyes towards Ky.

Two years later her daughter Elizabeth and husband, Enos Leach and family also migrated to Hendricks Co. and Anderson Leach came and married Matilda. Their goods were brought in a covered wagon. Elizabeth rode a horse and carried the baby, Matilda (later Keeney).

These days were indeed pioneer days. The land had to be cleared, the trees cut, the logs rolled and burned and crops put in among stumps as well as possible. All cloth for clothing had to be spun and woven by hand. Salt and the extreme necessities were brought from Lafayette and other river towns.

The Lizton M.E. church was organized at the home of William Montgomery in 1833. The old church was built on the Montgomery farm and called Montgomery Chapel. In the cemetery near the chapel he and Sarah and most of his children were buried.

James Montgomery, brother of William, settled in Putnam Co. north of Greencastle about this time. James and Elizabeth had no children but raised two of William's - Margaret (O'Hair) and Eliza (Johnson). The M.E. church now known as Brick Chapel, Putnam Co. was organized at the home of James Montgomery.
