Nash Family Settled In County In 1826

The name Nash has been a familiar one in Brownsville for over 140 years. Margaret Nash was one of the first persons to buy a lot when the town was first platted by William Harris.

The stately bearded gentleman in the above picture is Isaac C. Nash, pioneer of Lincoln Township who was born March 27, 1817 in Madison County, Ohio. His parents were Thomas and Hannah Nash, natives of Pennsylvania and Virginia respectively. They emigrated to Indiana in 1825 and lived one year in Marion County. They then came to Hendricks County, locating on White Lick Creek in Lincoln Township where they entered eighty acres of land.

About 1845 they moved to Missouri, remaining there until their death. Of the nine children born to Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Nash, these six were living in 1885—Margaret, Elizabeth, Isaac C., Mary S., Sarah A., and Daniel George, Jeremiah, and Richard were deceased. Richard was the great-grandfather of Harry H. Hopkins of Brownsville.

Isaac C. Nash came to Brownsville with his parents when nine years old. He was reared to maturity here. He was first married January 28, 1841 to Cecelia Wilson, daughter of William and Nancy Wilson, residents of the present White Lick Church area. They were parents of nine children. Mr. Nash settled on section 2 of Lincoln Township in 1838 and eventually owned 220 acres of land. They lived in a log cabin and later in a brick home that stood back of farm buildings now owned by Pat Wynne on 86th Street.

When, in later years, Mr. Nash's sons were married, he gave each a 40 acre farm. This was one way to keep a family close by. In fact, each son today has descendants close-by in and near

married John Hufford and they were parents of Floyd, Loren, and Esther (Mrs. Orville Baird). Mabel was unmarried, made her home with her father, a widower, in a beautiful farm home on the property now owned by Mrs. Elizabeth Warrick of State Road 267 North. Miss Nash reared Loren and Esther Hufford after their mother's death. The Nash home burned in later years, but was not occupied by any of the Nash's at the time of the fire.

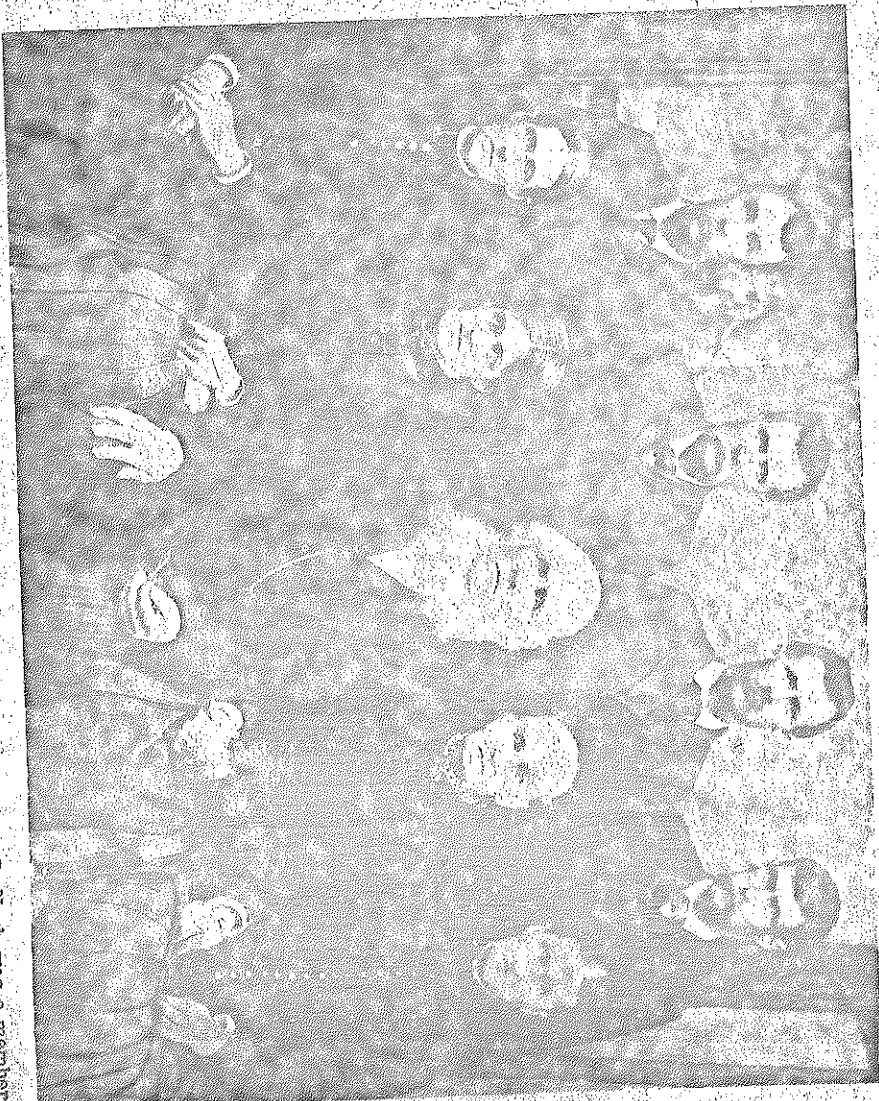
Floyd Hufford married Mrs. Margaret (Turpin) Schenck. He operated a service station and a hardware store in Brownsville for many years. He was employed by the Brownsburg Record and will be remembered for his unique column 'On the Record'.

Loren married Margaret Berry and they operated a grocery store in the building now occupied by the Town Hall. He operated a canning factory during World War II. He and son, Hal, recently purchased the laundromat in the Brownsburg Shopping Center.

Boy Nash married Helen White and to them were born two children, Leon and Gerald. Leon married Carol Linkmeyer and Gerald's wife, Mrs. Frances Nash is employed at Mike's Menswear.

William J. Nash married Elizabeth McCray and their children were Clara, Ollie, Saline, and Ova. Clara married William Everhard and their two children were Chaunday and Edith. Edith died young. Ollie married Elma Smith and two sons, Carl and Clifford, and a daughter, Mary Elizabeth, were born to them.

Carl married Mildred Campbell and is an accountant in business in Brownsburg. He is member at large of the Hendricks County Council. Clifford married Duellie Woodland and was a successful farmer, retiring



weekly livestock auction for many years. The auction was held in a building on the southwest corner of Vermont Street and the alley east of the Christian Church. Mr. and Mrs. Burns live west of Brownsburg and he later operated the auction in a new sales barn near his home.

Laurel lives on the site of an early toll gate on the old Crawfordsville Pike. A township school known as 'West Point' also occupied the same site in the 1890's. Lewis is at home with his widowed mother at 113 North Green Street.

Misses Cecelia and Etta Avery were dressmakers for many years in Brownsburg. Miss Etta Avery was superintendent of the Primary Department of the Sunday School of the Brownsburg Christian Church for many years. She gave unselfishly of her time and talents and today there are dozens and dozens in the church who remember them as 'Miss Avery who taught us to sing, 'Jesus Loves Me'.

Cecelia Nash was unmarried. Clarinda Nash married Sam McCord and lived in Indianapolis.

Isaac C. Nash was a member of the Presbyterian Church and was elder for several years. Mrs. Jane Nash was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church. He was an influential man in the community and has had over 100 descendants, most of whom still live in the Brownsburg area. They, too, are good citizens interested in the welfare and betterment of the community.

Mr. and Mrs. George A. Nash lived on the farm where John Wise is now lives on 18th Street. The College Avenue Gym was built during his term of office. Mr. Nash served as trustee of Lincoln township and was a staunch Democrat.

Mr. and Mrs. Oscar Nash were parents of two children. They are Ralph Nash and Mrs. John Wise. Ralph Nash and Mrs. Brownsburg children, Ralph Nash is a Brownsburg business man and Mrs. Wise is organist at St. Malachy Catholic Church and has taught piano to many students.

Bertha married Benjamin Weddle and they had one daughter, Thelma (Mrs. Wilbur Smith), and two sons, Marion and Paul. Paul died when he was seven.

Marion's wife, Mrs. Viola Weddle, has been one of the cooks in the cafeteria at Brown Township School for several years. Marion farms in Brown Township and is custodian at Brown Township School.

Mr. Benjamin Weddle lives alone on 700N on the farm occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Edward F. Nash. Etta Nash married Thomas Burns son of Mr. and Mrs. James Burns who were early Lincoln Township residents. Thomas Burns was a farmer and livestock dealer. He operated a dairy and delivered milk and butter to many homes in Brownsburg. Their farm now is the site of Dr. and Mrs. Foltz's development at the north edge of Brownsburg.
