Jacob Smith, son of Malinda (Turpin) and Reuben Smith, was a private in Co. G. 79th. Regiment, I.V.I. during the Civil War. He enlisted in Indianapolis August 15, 1862; fought in Battles of Wild Cat and Perryville, Kentucky, as discharged August 1863. Malinda Turpin was born in Bourbon County, Kentucky March 4, 1813; married Reuben Smith 1828; died in Boone County, Indiana July 18, 1890. Reuben Smith was born in Kentucky December 25, 1804, and died in Boone County, Indiana January 3, 1880. Malinda and Reuben Smith are buried in Mt. Tabor Cemetery north of Fayette, Indiana. They were the parents of 10 children.

## TAVNER NEAL.

One of the sterling citizens of Hendricks county, who is today filling an important position, is Tavner Neal, the efficient superintendent of the Hendricks county poor farm, who was born in Bourbon county, Kentucky. His parents were Charles W. and Emma S. (Bradley) Neal.

Tavner Neal has been one of those self-made men who have risen to prominence solely because of their own industry and perseverance. When he was married he and his wife started to housekeeping in a log cabin, built at the northwest corner of his father's farm. This little square log cabin speaks eloquently of the early days when they started their married life. They lived there for about two years, when they moved to their present home three and one-half miles southeast of Brownsburg, and there lived until March 1, 1914. He then took his present position as superintendent of the county poor farm. Starting out with nothing in life, he has accumulated a farm of one hundred and thirty-three acres in Lincoln township, and has taken a great deal of interest in the breeding of live stock of various kinds. He not only raises live stock but he has dealt largely in poultry. He raises pedigreed Jersey cattle, Berkshire hogs, and for several years has made a specialty of pure bred Barred Rock chickens. He is regarded as an expert chicken fancier and has taken many premiums at various fairs and exhibitions in his county and other counties in the state. He is a member of the American Berkshire Record Association, and for the past twenty years has belonged to the American Poultry Association, as well as the American Barred Plymouth Rock Association. He is a progressive and well informed farmer and lectures frequently at farmers' institutes and has the honor of raising one hundred and six and one-half bushels of corn to the acre at a time when average crops in his community were about twelve bushels to the acre. When he came to his farm it was exhausted from consecutive cropping and in a very poor condition. He has not only reclaimed his land, which was practically useless, but has conserved the food element in his soil. He knows, to be sure, that an ounce of fertilizer as a preventive against soil exhaustion is worth a pound of fertilizer for soil reclamation. On this basic principle he plans his crops and plants in rotation to the end that the continuous growing of one variety of crop on the same ground will not rob it of its plant food elements. Clover naturally follows corn, or some similar rotation, and the land remains fertile and only a minimum amount of fertilizer is required. # Body Of Man Found; Missing 2 1/2 Months

By RICHARD D. WALTON

More than 2 1/2 months of agonizing waiting ended Tuesday for Marie Harmon when the body of her missing husband was found in Grassy Creek in eastern Marion County.

The ordeal was such a strain that Mrs. Harmon, 3547 Moller Road, was hospitalized for several days in February.

At 3 p.m. Tuesday, three teen-aged boys were paddling a canoe when they found Harry E. Harmon's pickup truck, a 1967 Ford, in the three feet of

water under the Brookville Road Bridge. Assuming that it was just another abandoned wreck, the boys continued their journey for another half mile and found Harmon's body floating in the cold water. They informed a nearby resident, who notified authorities.

HARMON, who by age 64 had been through two heart attacks, treatment for diabetic shock and emphysema, might have suffered an attack as he was driving on the road, causing the pickup to veer from the pavement and tumble 15 feet down an embankment to the water, according to Marion County sheriff's deputy Greg Monroe. The truck, hidden from motorists passing overhead, remained there until Tuesday.

"It looks like it took a nosedive," Monroe said of the truck.

Deputy Coroner Harry Lovell said Harmon probably was dazed by the impact and died trying to ford the creek. However, Lovell said, the impact of the crash might have killed Harmon.

LOVELL said Harmon had been dead for at least a week. An autopsy was scheduled for today to determine whether he has been dead since January.

Harmon held several jobs with Indianapolis trucking firms. He gave up his latest job as garage supervisor for one of those businesses five years ago when he went on total disability because of emphysema. He suffered his second heart attack in October and was hospitalized again in November for diabetic shock.

He left home on an errand the afternoon of Jan. 12 but left his medication behind. He didn't return, and two days later, his wife reported his disappearance to police.

Services for Harmon are pending at Conkle Speedway Funeral Home.

Survivors, besides his wife, include two sons, Larry and Robert Harmon, both of Indianapolis, and four daughters, Mrs. Linda Green of Apple Valley, Minn.; Mrs. Cheryl Whisman of Cler-
