The undersigned Commissioner
appointed at the August Term 1865 of this Court to take testimony herein and report to this Court
at the present Term.

- First. The names of the heirs of Benjamin and Hannah Owen deceased with --- degree
of kindred.
- Second. The amount of money paid into the hands of John Irons deceased by Jonathan
Owen Commissioner for the Sale of the real estate and administrator of the estate
of Benjamin Owen deceased.
- Third The Amount paid out by said Irons and to whom, and to which he he is entitled to
Credit and the amounts allowed or adjudged by the Courts against him and in
whose favor. And to report the balance due each.

Would Report that after having examined the proof adduced, finds that the said
Benjamin Owen deceased, had four Brothers, to wit: Samiel Owen, Ephraim Owen, Joseph
Owen, and Asa Owen all of whom are decd, but each of whom left heirs-them surviving That
Hannah Owen the widow of said deceased had eight brothers and sisters to wit: Moses Farmer,
Rebecca Sanders, Rachel Bradley, Sarah Smith, Phebe Pearson, Mary Creen, Nathan Farmer, and
John Farmer - the names of all of whom, or their heirs, and their degree of kindred so far as said
Commissioner has been able to ascertain from the evidence and set out in the statement, hereto
appended, which is a made of part of this report.

If further appears that the said John Irons now deceased in his life time, as the clerk of the
Court of Common Pleas of said County, received of said Jonathan Owen Commissioner
aforesaid the sum of Five thousand nine hundred and sixty dollars
\$5960.00

And that said Irons is entitled to credits for fees due him as clerk and for fees assigned to him in
the proceedings for the real estate belonging to said estate.

Amounting to the sum of One hundred and seventeen dollars and thirteen cents \$117.13

And for amount paid Elies Jessup attorney 25.00

Making his Credits 142.13

Leaving the sum \$5817.87

Said Commissioner further finds that the sum of 217.87

of said sum should be paid into Court for the purpose of paying the balance fo the costs in the
proceedings for the sale of the real estate belonging to said estate, and in the administration of
said estate, leaving to be distributed among the heirs aforesaid, the sum of Fifty six hundred
dollars. \$5600.00

proceeds of the real estate belonging to said estate, which according to the last will and testament
of the said Benjamin Owen, deceased, should be distributed as follows, One half to the
decendants of the brothers of the said Benjamin Owen, decd, and the remaining half to the

heirs of said Hannah Owen decd. the amounts to which said several heirs and each entitled and the amounts said to each fo Owen by said Irons, together with the balance due each, and set out in said statement Said Commissioner also finds that said Irons has paid out to said heirs or their attorneys the sum of three thousand three hundred and fifty six dollars and ninety four cents \$3356.94
 in which is included One hundred and twenty four dollars and sixty cents. 124.60
 over payments made by him to said heirs, leaving as a credit to him of the sum \$3232.34
 which deducted from said sums of \$5600.00 leaves the sums of \$2367.66
 due the heirs of said estate as set out in said statement.

Said Commissioner further finds that on the day of September 1864 the Court of Common Pleas of said County found that there was due from the estate of the said John Irons decd, the sums of Four hundred and eighty nine dollars and seventy three cents (\$489.73) And on that day rendered a judgment against the said James Burgess administrator aforesaid in in form of a portion of the heirs to the estate of said Benjamin Owen, decd, for the sum of Two hundred and fifty dollars and ninety six cents. (\$250.96) which has been fully paid by said administrator, the names of the heirs in whose favor said judgment was rendered, and the amounts which each were entitled, and the several amounts, still due the remaining heirs aforesaid are fully set out in said statement - leaving still due from the estate of said John Irons, due on account of the proceeds of the personal estate of said Benjamin Owen, deceased, the sum of Two hundred and thirty eight dollars and seventy seven cents. (\$238.77)
