The earliest records of the Pike family are found in membership records of the Quaker church . The Pikes were members of Quaker meetings in Ireland and North Carolina .

In Volume I of the "Encyclopedia of American Quaker Genealogy" as compiled in 1936 by William Wade Hinshaw, we find the records for most of generations 3, 4, 5, and 6 of the Pike families as listed here . Page numbers refer to that Volume I, and notes concerning Quaker Monthly Meeting minutes are from that book .

My mother, Mary Esther Pike Copeland, and father, Russell Ely Copeland, were married April 14th, 1934. I, John Joseph Copeland (better known as Johnny Joe) was born on June 2nd, 1942.

I was about $3\frac{1}{2}$ years old when grandpa (L. L.) Pike passed away. I can remember three different times about him very vividly. First, I remember sitting on his lap in a big wide backed rocking chair in the living room of the old home place. Grandpa liked to sit in this chair and peel apples. I would climb up on his lap to help him eat them. He could peel an apple so that you could see through the peel and yet it would never break. Those pieces of apple really tasted good coming off the blade of his pocket knife.

Another time I remember was when the old maple tree on the west side of the house split and part of it fell over onto the roof of the house. I helped grandpa clean up the mess. He would fill up his wheelbarrow with bark and large sticks, while I filled up my just my size wheelbarrow with twigs. We would then push our wheelbarrows down the road and dump them along the creek bank. When grandpa died in 1945 I can remember the casket being in the front room of the house. This room is now an extra bed room.

Staying all night at grandma's house was an adventure in its self. The noises in the country were different than those in town. I lived on Avon Ave. in Plainfield and was lulled to sleep by all kinds of street noise. Trucks would roll down Avon hill like 60 miles per hour, and if they were empty they would bounce all the way to US40 downtown. At grandma's house it was so quiet that no matter how tired I was I'd just lay there eyes wide open unable to fall asleep. Sometimes boards would creak or an owl would hoot and it would be country dark. Dark enough to be too scared to get up to go to the bathroom (which was a chamber pot or thunder mug under the bed if it was too cold to make the trip outside to the outhouse). Yes, country dark is a lot darker than town dark.

Grandma would get up when the first rooster would crow. It wouldn't be long after that the smell of ham or bacon frying on the stove would float up the stairs and wake me with the promise of another adventuresome day. A few minutes later grandma would come to the bottom of the stairs and call me to breakfast. Not only would there be ham or bacon, but biscuits, gravy, oat meal, eggs, milk and sweetrolls a real country breakfast.

Grandma always made pies and cakes on Saturday to have on hand for whoever would come to see her on Sunday. Her speciality was custard pie and prune cake. She made many other goodies, but these two were the most requested. She kept them in the oven and everyone knew where to find them. That oven door had a sound all its own. A very distinct squeek. Whenever someone would open it there was a loud squeeeeeeek. Her eyes would light up when she heard the door open and say, "Did I hear someone open the oven door?" And in reply, "Yes, grandma." She would then smile and say, "Well, if you see any thing you like just help your self."

I think she would have been disappointed not to hear that squeeeeeeeky oven door. Family dinners were always big occasions. A lady at the newspaper (The Friday Caller) would call grandma on Monday after a special Sunday dinner to find out who came and what we had to eat. Uncle Hezzie and Aunt Lillian would come out from Indianapolis. There would be more food brought in than the big table could hold. The biggest of these days was Christmas day. Usually around forty or so people would gather around the table and then after the dishes were done Uncle Hezz would play Santa Claus for everyone.

In the spring and summer when everyone would get together the main activities were horse shoes, basketball (barn yard style dodging chicken stuff), and last but not least a good old corn cobb fight. I can remember one corn cobb fight in particular. We chose up sides and took our positions. Things went ok for a while with corn cobbis flying all over the place. A hit was scored now and then, but none serious enough to stop the fight. About the time things were going good I took the game ending hit. I was up in the hayloft of the barn and I could see Jerry below as a good target. (Anyone as tall as Jerry was bound to be a good target. How could I miss.)

I stepped out into the open hayloft door and drew back ready to throw my corn cobb. (At this point you have to realize that speed and agility in this kind of play have to be perfectly timed. Steping out into the open throwing and getting back under cover befor your corn cobb hits its target. This takes all of about three seconds if its done right.) Picture in your mind my movements and just as I'm ready to throw WHAP! I was hit square in the mouth by a water soaked corn cobb thrown by Norman. After the initial shock wore off there was an agonizing scream of pain. This of course brought all of the adults running to see who was delt the game ending blow. By this time the lips are already beginning to swell and I can't talk too good because it hurts and the lips won't work right to form words. If you have never been hit in the mouth with a water soaked corn cobb you don't know what your missing. The next time we got together there was another corn cobb fight and another game ending hit. Hopefully to somebody else this time.

There was the old swimming hole in the creek that changed every time the creek got up and ate away part of the high bank. Once Mike and I went swimming skinny style and Uncle Hezz just happened to be tipped off about it and caught us in the act with his movie camera. I can hear him now "HA HA HA!" I have this piece of evidence and have shown it a few times. As I watch it I can still hear Uncle Hezz "HA HA HA!"

On one such family gathering I accidentally shot Judy Pike Coy in the rear with a BB gun. The gun belonged to her brother Dick. It was a Daisy pump type having the BB's leaded into a tube with a heavy spring forcing each BB to be fed into the chamber when the gun was pumped. When shaken back and forth the BB's do not rattle as they do in the Red Rider Lever action BB guns. I was used to this latter type. So when I saw Dick's BB gun leaning against the wood shed I picked it up and shook it. There was no rattle of BB's whatsoever. Empty was my thought. I cocked it and saw Judy running across the yard and pulled the trigger. She had on a pair of blue jeans and I caught her in mid stride. She let out a scream that brought the adults much quicker than when I was hit with the corn cobb.

There I was standing there holding that BB gun trying to explain that since the BB's didn't rattle like mine that it wasn't supposed to be loaded. Let me tell you I was one scared boy. No place to go and hide. Even the dog Shep knew something was wrong as he hid under the porch and wouldn't come out. I survived though and tearfully told Judy I was sorry.

Another experience I had with a gun happened when I was 16. This turned out to be quite a pleasant experience though. Cecil Winsted ran a turkey shoot at the corner of Vestal road and US 40 on weekends in November and December. I decided to try my luck and paid \$1.00 for my target and .05¢ for a shot gun shell. I took my turn and had a feeling I had done pretty good. They had to measure my card and the card of Cecil's brother Billy Winsted and my shot was closest to the cross section of the X. Cecil Winsted handed me a frozen 2.5lb. turkey. Was I ever proud of that.

I graduated from Plainfield High School in 1960. In August of that year I joined the U.S. Army and went to Fort Leonard Wood, Mo. for basic and advanced training in field communications. In February of 1961 I arrived in West Germany at the port of Bremerhaven, rode by train to Baumholder and my new home for the next 2½ years the Headquarters Co. 1st Battle Group 16th Inf. I returned to Plainfield in August of 1963. In September of 1964 I married Janice Hallatt. We had three children; John Russell 4/3/68, Sean Michael 7/8/69, and Carla Rae 7/18/71. Janice and I were divorced in February 1977. In July of 1977 I married Nancy Dayhuff Wiley and I also gained a daughter Angela Danette Wiley 11/1/67.

I have always been interested in history and I belong to a Civil War living history and reenactment unit. I am also a licensed official in the Indiana High School Athletic Association active in basketball and volleyball. For the past 16½ years I have been employed by Chrysler Corporation as a plant protection patrolman. John, Sean and Carla live with thier mother and attend George Washington High School and School #61 in Indianapolis. Nancy, Angie and I live at RR1 Box 69 Clayton. Angie attends Cascade High School.

Grandma and Grandpa didn't leave us any money. They had none to leave. What they left us was a family much more precious than gold or silver.

PIKE

1627 - 1949

RICHARD PIKE was born about 1627 in the town of Newberry, Berkshire, England, of parents of good reputation, "and having some estate in houses there"; and about 1648, he came over to Ireland a Corporal in a troop of Horse in Cromwells army." He married Elizabeth Jackson, born in London about 1636, of "parents of good repute, some of her connexions having been chief magistrates of that city," and they settled near Cork in southwestern Ireland. Richard and Elizabeth were among the Friends convinced by the ministry of Edward Burrough at Cork in 1655. In 1664 they moved from the farm of Kilreagh to Cork and kept a shop. Richard died fourth month 1668 while a prisoner for his Quaker principles and was the first Friend interred outside the south gate of Cork. Elizabeth died in 1688. Their children were : Elizabeth, married Henry Wheddon a merchant, and died 1693; Joseph; Ebenezer; Richard; Sarah; and Benjamin, who died the same day as his father .

JOSEPH PIKE, author of several works relating to Friends, son of Richard and Elizabeth (Jackson) Pike, was born eleventh-month, 15, 1657 on a farm called Kilreagh, seven miles west of Cork. He was married in 1682 to Elizabeth Rogers, the eldest daughter of Francis Rogers, a minister of the Society of Friends. After his marriage, he joined his brother, Richard, in opening a linen-drapers shop in Cork, the first of the kind in the city. His business frequently took him to England, Holland and Flanders (Belgium). On one of these journeys, he accompanied William Penn to Holland and attended the Yearly Meeting at Amsterdam. Thomas Story writes in his Journal that, in 1716 while on a religious journey to Ireland, he visited Joseph Pike of Cork, among whose guests one day at dinner were the young Countess of Kildare, her maiden sister and three others of the gentry .

Joseph and Elizabeth (Rogers) Pike had fourteen children, seven of whom died young. The seven who survived were : Richard; Mary, married Thomas Beale, son of Joshua Beale of Mountmellick, Queens Co.; Elizabeth, married Joshua Beale, Jr., brother of Thomas; Rachel; Samuel; Benjamin; and Anne. By patent dated Dec. 3, 1705, William Penn "granted to Joseph Pike, wealthy Quaker merchant of Cork", a tract of over 10,000 acres of land in Chester Co., Pa., which was organized under the name of Pikeland Township, and in 1838 was divided into East and West Pikeland. Joseph Pike died in 1729 and by his will dated 1727 and proved in the Perogative Court of County Armagh, devised Pikeland and a tract of over 1500 acres in Caln township, on the southern part of which Caln meeting house stands, to his wife, Elizabeth. The widow Pike held these lands till her death in 1733, when they came into possession of her son, Richard Pike. He died about 1753 or 4 (made his will Sept. 2, 1752; proved April 5, 1755) and bequeathed all his estate in Pennsylvania to his kinsmen Samuel Hoare and Nathaniel Newberry, merchants of London. In 1756 Hoare purchased Newberry's interest and became sole owner. The land was then offered for sale in smaller tracts. Among the first settlers were Samuel Lightfoot, a surveyor and builder of the first mill in that neighborhood; Michael Lightfoot; Thomas Milhous and Timothy Kirk of the Kirks of Lurgan in County Armagh. Richard Pike, the son of Joseph, had left Ireland and gone back to England where lived at Stoke Newington, Middlesex, England. In his will he mentions his nephews, Joshua and Joseph Beale, sons of Joshua, also Joshua's daughter Sarah, (they were his sister Elizabeth's children), also his nephew Samuel, son of his sister, Rachel Beale .
