Noah Reagan was a charter member of Bridgeport Lodge, No. 152, F.A. & M. that was chartered May 24, 1854. He was the First Senior Warden of Bridgeport Lodge and was Worshipful Master in the years 1868-1869.

Noah Reagan died January 11, 1881, at about 69 years of age and was buried in Fairfield Cemetery, Quaker Burial Ground, Marion County, Indiana.

Noah Reagan married Mary Jessup at Friendswood, Indiana. Mary Jessup was a sister of Joel Jessup at Friendswood. Mary Jessup was also a sister of Jackson L. Jessup, a Quaker preacher that lived just East of Friendswood, Indiana.

The children of Noah Reagan were

1. Robert Reagan, oldest son who died in Albuquerque, New Mexico.
2. Sarah Reagan, oldest daughter.
3. Racheal Reagan.
4. Worthington Reagan, born December 9, 1840 and who died an infant.
5. George W. Reagan, born December 4, 1845, and died August 13, 1913.
6. Reason Reagan, born October 23, 1848, who went west among the Indians and was never afterwards heard from.
7. Joseph Reagan, born January 3, 1851.
8. Mary Reagan, born September 20, 1852.
9. Noah (Sam) Reagan, born November 21, 1855.

Brothers and sisters of Noah Reagan were Lot Reagan, of Bridgeport, Indiana, who has a minument and is buried in the Quaker Cemetery, Northwest of Bridgeport, Marion County, Indiana; Amos Reagan, of Mooresville, Indiana; Sarah Mitchell, of Mooresville, Indiana; and Lizah Thornbrough, of Mooresville, Indiana.

Noah (Sam) Reagan and Julia E. Robinson were married September 22, 1880 and are the kind source of the above genealogy through an old family Bible.
