new Castle Ind. Oct 30, 1829.

Copied from a paper written by Eveline Ridgings Elihu Ridging, the grandfather, the great grandfather of most of us here today, was torn June 6,1779 in Monongalelia Co. West Va. The accidental death of his father, while he was a small boy, thrust him upon relatives + friends for a home, where he remained writing the age of 24.

In the year 1823 he was married to Mancy hour well, who was then 22 yrs. of age + who had been born + rearred to the age of I bin Frince Williams County Va. after marriage they remained in W. Va. until the year 1834.

With a family of beniedren, together with Levi Jones & family & Jaber hervelland framely they started their journing to dud, to seek + wake forthemselves homes in which to rear their families.

Their conveyance for trust of the 3 families consisted of one wayon + 5 houses, four of which were hitched to the wayon to built the load, the other horse being use a for some member of the families to ride.

Reached their destination laterine, The Eldest daughter of Eliku Ridging, talk from the horse of fractured a leg, coming a long delay in their journey until she could recover.

Levi Jones located in Delaware Co, while the other two families came to Henry County. Levellens settled near Rodgersville, n.E. of town now called Mooreland, while Ridgrays located at about The N.W corner of the tract of land now Known as the Epileptic Village. When This place was reached he only had 1.00 left for support of his family. Being surrounded by good neighbors, he soon had plenty of work which furnished a mesare support for the growing family. Their teds were constructed by toring holes in the logs of their cabin into which they would drive a pole with the other End extending out into the room + setting a fooken stack under it to carry the weight. On these potes they haid chapboards and " the boards they laid a strawlick + thus they rested. after only a few months. at this location, the family moved & miles north + remained there 6 years. Then they moved to Delaware Co, later to Blackford Co. Then is 1846 Eliku R. entered a piece of lund in Jay Co. neur the Blackford Co line, built a cabin of round logs, using for a floor half logs, called punckeons + for a roof they made classoards. For a door a quilt was hung to keep out wind + rain. The cabin was surrounded with timber

which was inhabited with wild turkeys, other game, + wild animals, Especially wolves, which the dogs would chase away to a certain distance + on their return the wolves would chase the dogs + they would come touring under the quilt into the Louise. Many times This chasing & Lowling of the wolves would

continue a good part of the night.

The cleaning of the ground was Kept up until sufficient was cleared that a field of corn could be planted but after planting it was necessary to guard it to prevent the Equirels from digging it up so the children were stationed around the field to guardit. They had no pasture land for their cows or other stock so They were permitted to roam at large in the roods with bells on them that they might be easily found. On one occasion when Hancy Hidgway, the mother, was in the woods after the cows, a lynx followed ter, sereaming as it approached, I was only a short distance tehind her when she reached home In this way they worked & raised a family of 12 children who grew to mankood + woman tood + were married as follows -1. His widow lived on her farm near Redkey for several years, died at newcastle, Oct 29,1200 at the age of 98 yrs + 2 mo. She had been very active until at the age of 82 she troke het tip x walked only with crutches afterward. During her marriage She always raised flax + work nearly all the clothing worn by her large family. At the age of 91 she tayan the task of piecing a quelt for each munder of her family & continued until she had made 12, all of the same pattern + completed the task without the aid of spectacles. Her mental faculties svene very alert, she was remarkably free of any Evidence of senility until the end of her life. may we hever forget the toils, Kardships + sacrifices our ancestors endured comforts + blessings of today.

When we visit each other we do not have
to ride in a hig magon, with a yoke of oxen

as the motive power, over mud roads, thus
ponds of water + over pole tridges.

I fear we are not thankful enough for the
luxuries + pleasures we have today.

Ridgway Family Tree

Copied from Ridgeway-Ridgway descent, "Doomsday Rook", by Dr. Geo. C. Ridgway. This unique and invaluable document was drawn up in pursuance of a decree passed at Christmas Assembly, 1085 to 1086 and the necessary survey was rade in the first 7 mo. of 1036. The immediate object of the survey was a fiscal one to instre tax on land and was known as Dave-geld. In it we are told, in all cases, by whom the land was held, at the time the survey was made and by whom it had been held at the time of King Edward. From that period to the present, by the transfers, wills and other recorded documents, a landed family can be followed thru the rain and if a titled family, thru their Coat of Arms into the collateral branches to the present period. "The Ridgways were a titled family. The Ridgway Coat of Arms evidently appears first here."

- 1. Leofric I, born about 680. 1st Earl of Leicester, Earl of Lincoln and Earl of Chester. He was a member of the royal family of Mercia and bore the same Coat of Arms as Ethelbald, King of Mercia and other Kings, "Or, an eagle displayed, sable" signing with him in 716 the charter of foundation of the famous monastery of Croyland as Leofric, Earl of Leicester.

He was Knighted in 1599 by Queen Elizabeth, Member of Parliament in 1st P. called by King James in 1603; Vice-Treasurer for Wars; created Baronet 1600-12; was created Baron of Galen Ridgway in 1616. Created Earl of Londonderry 1622. Born 1550 or 51, died Jan. 24, 1631, married Cecily, daughter of Henry Mac William.

ed in Delaware River on ship "Jacob & Mary." After going to Burlington for a short stay he removed to Crewcorne in what is now Falls Twsp., Bucks Co., Penn., where we find him on Apr. 12, 1680. He bought 600 acres in Maidenhead. On Feb. 7, 1697, he purchased a farm in Springfield Twsp., Burlington Co. where he afterward resided. He gave one acre to the Society of Friends for a Meeting House. He was appointed Judge of Burlington Co. on Aug. 8, 1700 and held the office until April 1720. Elizabeth died at Crewcorne Mar. 31, 1692. He married for 2nd wife Abigail Stockton, had seven children by each wife, last marriage not approved by Quakers. Sir Richard died Sept. 21, 1722. Josiah I, son of Richard born in Crewcorne Penn. Sept. In 1717 he was Constable of Springfield Twsp. Burlington Co. He married Sarah ?, children were - Lott born Aug. 9, 1718, died Dec. 30, 1784, Josiah II and Noah. Proof - Ref. Hist. Soc. of Penn., 1300 Locust St., Philadelphia, also Hist. Gereaology of N.J. - pages 1173-1174. Josiah II, son of Josiah I, married Rachel Brown, Aug. 28. 12, 1736. They lived at Northingston, Burlington Co. Penn. They removed to Frederick Co. Va.

At the dissolution of the Monasteries in King Henry VIII time, Torrwood Grange, a noble Manor House, situated on the Hill termed Torrwood Wount and which at that time belonged to the Abbey, was granted to John Ridgway Esq. #21 in 1540. Prince (that indefatigable searcher of records) says a "Ridgway was one of the stewards of Exeter, 1466." From this period riches and honor accrued to them in no slight measure, as this same John Ridgway purchased the Manor of Torre and his son, Thomas #22 also bought from the Seymours the dissolved Monastery of Torre.

Sir Thomas Ridgway of Londonderry established the first
Protestant Colony in Ireland and where members of his own family
were colonists. "Sir Thomas Ridgway - ye Golden Knight - ye first

A Sketch of our Forefathers (copied from a paper written by Eveline Ridgway, age 85.)

Elihu Ridgway, the grandfather, the great-grandfather, and great-great grandfather of most of us here today was born June 6, 1779 in Monongalelia Co. West Va. The accidental death of his father, while he was a small boy, thrust him upon relatives and friends for a home, where he remained until the age of 24.

In the year 1823 he was married to Nancy Cornwell who was then 22 yrs. of age and who had been born and reared to the age of 16 in Prince William County Va. After marriage, they remained in W. Va. until the year 1834.

With a family of 8 children, together with Levi Jones and family and Jahez Lewellan and family, they started their journey to Ind. to seek and make for themselves homes in which to rear their families.

Their conveyance for travel of the 3 families consisted of one wagon & 5 horses, four of which were hitched to the wagon to

pull the load, the other horse being used for some member of the families to ride.

Sometime in their journey and long before they reached their destination, Catherine, the eldest daughter of Elihu Ridgway, fell from the horse and fractured a leg, causing a long delay in their journey until she could recover.

Levi Jones located in Delaware Co. while the other two families came to Henry County. Lewellens settled near Rodgersville, N.E. of town now called Mooreland, while Ridgways located at about the N.W. corner of the tract of land now known as the Epileotic Village. When this place was reached he only had \$1.00 left for support of his family. Being surrounded by good neighbors, he soon had plenty of work which furnished a meager support for his growing family.

Their beds were constructed by boring holes in the logs of their cabin into which they would drive a pole with the other end extending out into the room & setting a forked stick under it to carry the weight. On these poles, they laid clapboards and on the boards they laid a strawtick and thus they rested. After only a few months at this location, the family moved 6 miles Morth and remained there 6 years.

Then they moved to Delaware Co., later to Blackford Co. Then in 1846; Elihu R. entered a piece of land in Jay Co. near the Blackford Co. line, built a cabin of round logs, using for a floor half logs, called buncheons and for a roof they made clapboards. For a door a quilt was hung to keep out wind and rain.

The cabin was surrounded with timber which was inhabited with wild turkeys, other game and wild animals, especially wolves, which the dogs would chase away to a certain distance and on their return the wolves would chase the dogs and they would come bouncing under the quilt into the house. Many times this chasing and howling of the wolves would continue a good part of the night.

The clearing of the ground was kept up until sufficient was cleared that a field of corn could be planted but after planting it was necessary to guard it to prevent the squirrels from digging it up so the children were stationed around the field to guard it. They had no pasture land for their cows or other stock, so they were permitted to roam at large in the woods with bells on them that they might be easily found. On one occasion when Nancy Ridgway, the mother, was in the woods after the cows, a lynx followed her, screaming as it approached and was only a short distance behind her when she reached home.

In this way, they worked and raised a family of 12 children who grew to manhood and womanhood and were married as follows -

- 12. George was married to Mary Taylor

Elihu, the father, died in 1872, ared 73 yrs. His widow lived on her farm near Red Key for several years, died at New-castle, Oct. 29, 1900, at the age of 98 yrs. & 2 mo.

She had been very active until at the age of 82 she broke her hip and walked only with crutches afterward. During her marriage, she always raised flax and wove nearly all the clothing worn by her large family.

At the age of 91 she began the task of piecing a quilt for each member of her family and continued until she had made 12, all of the same pattern and completed the task without the aid of spectacles.

Her mental faculties were very alert. She was remarkably free of any evidence os senility until the end of her life. May we never forget the toils, hardships, and sacrifices our ancestors endured that we might be permitted to enjoy the comforts and blessings of today.

When we visit each other we do not have to ride in a big wagon, with a voke of oxen as the motive nower, over mud roals, thru nonds of water and over note bridges.

I fear we are not thankful enough for the luxuries and pleasures we have today.

John Ridgway - son of Plinu and Nancy Cornwell Ridgway was was born in Monogahelia Co. W. Virginia on March 21, 1834. Fig parents came to Henry County Indiana when John was about 3 mos.

of age. After six years, they moved to Delaware Co. then later to Blackford Co. In 1846 entered a piece of land in Jay Co.

John came to Brownsburg, Hendricks Co., in 1856. He enlisted in Co B. 7th Regiment of Indiana Volunteers August 30, 1961, for 3 months, then reinlisted for the duration and was honorably discharged on September 20, 1864.
