"D" is for the Dedication, Diligence, and Devotion of
Mrs. Cassie Swarn of Plainfield. Indiana.

With the hectic pace of the holidays fast approaching it might behoove us all to take some time out and indulge in a little daydreaming of times past. Mrs. Swarn can be our guide.

While the Twenties roared in the big cities, little Cassie enjoyed her childhood growing up amid the slower pace in the hamlet of Mitchell, Indiana. For sure there were chores to do around the house and helping in the garden some but there was also lots of fun with family and friends and yummy tasting surprises from mama's old wood stove to enjoy. Those luscious smells wafting through the air almost made it seem like Thanksgiving every day.

Even though they attended a one-room schoolhouse, Cassie's and the other children's minds were opened and their love for learning blossomed under the capable tutelage of their teacher, Mrs. Hughes, who taught all eight grades. In those gentler times the older children helped the younger ones and parents helped each other and kept a watchful eye out for their neighbors' tykes as well as their own.

Her love of poetry brought celebrity status to young Cassie as the local churches and club groups thought it was just the cutest thing that she could recite so many poems. She knew every one that Paul Lawrence Dumbar had written. Cassie's interest in poetry at a young age was a precursor of the gifted capabilities she would display at a more mature age. The artistic talent that bursts forth from Mrs. Swarn may come from her mother's side of the family (the Terrells) for they were artisans--brickmakers by trade--who owned their own brickyard in Mitchell. Attesting to the fact that they were truly craftsmen is that some of the buildings erected long ago with their bricks have only recently been torn down in Mitchell, Indiana. Mrs. Swarn's green thumb comes from her father's side (the Clemons) as they had been farmers for many generations. Pleasantly, childhood and adolescence drifted by and she was on the threshhold of adulthood.

As newlyweds they settled down on the Swarn homestead in Plainfield, Indiana, and eventually the children came along; four in all. The Great Depression had a tight grip on everyone and Mrs. Swarn worked at various jobs outside the home in order to help her husband make ends meet.

Back in those good old days (which she helped to make better) Cassie Swarn was also an activist for the right of <u>all</u> of Plainfield's citizens to be able to patronize all of the town's business, cultural, and entertainment establishments. Her straight forward approach met with success and service at the local drugstore and entry into the movie theater were accomplished.

Cassie Swarn set many precedents in dealing effectively with those in the majority culture. At a time when those in the majority had little concern for anyone not like themselves, she nobly led the way in showing the townspeople how to rise above the divisiveness of factions and pursue a higher road built on harmonious relations. Her accomplishments are numerous. She has held membership in Plainfield's Women's Club, the Friday Club and as an artist whose medium is oil, Mrs. Swarn has belonged to the Hendricks County Art League and the Plainfield Art League. She has belonged to two historical societies, delivered Meals on Wheels, been Director of Activities at the Plainfield Retiress Home, and a member of Bethel A.M.E. Church of Plainfield for over fifty years. She has been recognized for outstanding service to the community and received awards from the Plainfield Jaycees, the A.M.E. Churches of Indiana, and the Hendricks County Council on Aging. Her motto aptly has been "love and service to others." Mrs. Swarn has always been proud of the fact that she married into the Swarn family and her in-laws have been just as proud to have her be a part of their family. She personifies the ideal wife depicted in Proverbs 31:10-31.

Cassie Swarn has deservedly received many honors and awards during her most fascinating careers as wife, mother, and community leader. This wonderful lady has always been a go-getter. She and uncounted others like her who took a public stand and stuck by their convictions when it wasn't popular to do so lightened the burden and defined a clearer vision for all of society. In the latter half of the 19th Century young Lemuel Swarn left the place of his birth, North Carolina, and set out on a journey that had Hendricks County, Indiana as his destination. Accompanying him were his young wife, Cidy, and their small son, Carey. There would eventually be six more bundles of joy to care for. The trek north was made with the families of Lemuel's uncle and sister. Once again displaying the compassion they had shown many times before, Quakers aided in transportation arrangements for the travellers.

Though Lemuel Swarn had been born of slave parents in Raleigh, North Carolina, he was privileged to receive a good education and his dealings and land acquisitions after settling in Plainfield, Indiana attest to his business acumen.

As patriarch, Mr. Lemuel Swarn set the standard of excellence and his progeny have proudly upheld the family name and offerred their talents in service to others. His descendants have made their mark in such varied professions as the ministry, music, postal service, business, dietetics, the military, public service, engineering, finance, and sales. The elder Swarn's offspring also inherited his strong religious faith and the dedicated and loving service they have given to Bethel A.M.E. Church of Plainfield has benefited all.

Following in the footsteps of their illustrious ancestor, the Swarn children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren as well as spouses and extended family members have successfully carried the banner of excellence forward.
