Death of E. M. Tinder. Elijah M. Tinder, long a resident of this community, died at the home of his son, Edward E Tinder, Tuesday evening, after suffering from paralysis for some time - Mr. Tinder was born in Kentucky in 1823 and when about ten years old came to Indiana with his parents, settling in Jennings county. In a short time they came to Hen dricks county, where his years of manhood were spent. He married Elizabeth Hadley, who died in April, 1900. To them were born six children, four of whom are living-Mrs. Julia Towles, William Tinder, Mrs. Mary McCurdy and Edward E. Tinder. Mr. Tinder lived on a farm near Danville for some years, but for a third of a century his home had been in Dan ville. He was a life-long member of the Methodist church. The funeral is this afternoon from his late home, the services being conducted by Rev Hovis,

### Death of Elijah Tinder.

Uncle Elijah M. Tinder died at the home of his son, Edw. Tinder, Tuesday afternoon, of paralysis. The funeral services were held this afternoon, being conducted by Rev. Mr. Hovis. Deceased was one of Danville's oldest and hest known citizens, and was universally esteemed.

Mrs. Catharine Tinder died at her home on North Cross street Thursday evening, aged 86 years. The funeral services were held Sunday morning at the Baptist church, being conducted by Elder E. W. Thomas. Deceased was one of Hendricks county's pioneer settlers, and through her entire life was esteemed and highly respected by all who knew her. She was the mother of eleven children, ten of whom survive her.


#### Two Pioneers Gone.

Within the past week two old and respected citizens of Danville have been called away, the first being Mrs. Elijah Tinder, of whose sudden death we spoke last week. She was a daughter of James Hadley, who formerly lived at the old homestead near the water tank, east of Hadley, at which place she was born on October 30, 1829, being at the time of her death aged 70 years, 5 months and 3 days. She was married on February 4. 1844, to Elijah Tinder. To this union were born six children, two of whom died at an early age. Mrs. John Towles, Mrs. C. G. McCurdy, William and Edward surviving her. She has also two sisters living-Aunt Nancy Matlock and Aunt Jennie Tucker. She joined the Methodist church in her fifteenth year and to the time of her death was a faithful and consistent member. The funeral services were held at the residence Saturday afternoon, conducted by Rev. Switzer. A large crowd gathered to pay their last earthly tribute. The remains were interred in the south cemetery.

#### A Good Citizen Passes Away.

After an illness of several months, John W. Tinder died at his home on West Main street. Tuesday night. The funeral services will be held at the M. E. church tomorrow morning at ten o'clock, the burial being in the south cemetery.

Few citizens were better known in Hendricks county than Mr. Tinder, and few held the confidence of his fellowcitizens in a higher degree. His death leaves a vacancy in numerous circles in Danville's life that will be hard to fill. John W. Tinder was a native of Hendricks county, having been born in Marion township, January 22, 1835, and the span of his life covered the development of the county from a wilderness to its present high state of civilization. And all of his life, except what time he was serving as a soldier in the war of the rebellion, he was a citizen of Hendricks county. He was married February 5, 1857, to Laura, daughter of Wm. F. and Jane Hamrick, who survives him and has the sympathy of the entire community in her hour of affliction. To this union were born two children, a son and daughter, the son dying just after he had reached his twentieth birthday and the daughter when less than a year old. On July 2, 1862, he enlisted at Danville in Co. A, 4th Ind. Cavalry, and on the organization of the company was promoted to sergeant and was mustered out as second lieutenant. He served over three years, and was honorably discharged at Nashville, Tenn., in September, 1865, on account of the closing of the war. Mr. Tinder was an active republican, having been chairman of his party committee in several campaigns; was a prominent member of the Odd Fellows and also of the Jesse S. Ogden Post G. A. R. He had served Hendricks county twelve years as a member of its board of commissioners, and only last May was elected as one of the town trustees for Danville.



# PICTURES FROM THE PAST

Give Life To Family History

About 1908 Harvey Picket of Plainfield, Indiana, took the above photograph of Oscar Tinder's threshing machine. This was in the neighborhood of Hadley, Hendricks County, Indiana.

In 1826, James T. Hadley of Chatham County, North Carolina, located near the Mill Creek Friends meetinghouse. In the course of time his daughter, Elizabeth Hadley, married Elijah Tindle, who had removed to Hendricks County from Shelby County, Kentucky, in 1833. Together they farmed land given to her by her father.

When their son, William Hadley Tinder, became owner of the farm, he developed a truck patch from which he sold fruits and vegetables. He married Mary Allee.

After he died, their son Oscar N. Tinder bought the farm from his mother.

For many years Oscar operated a steam engine, threshing grain throughout the county—mostly in Center and Eel River townships. Threshing rings (groups of neighboring farmers who helped each other with their grain harvest) were very active in those days. When the season was over, the men and their families gathered at one of the farm homes for a supper topped off with homemade ice cream and cake.
