This family seems to have come from or lived in Rowen County, N.C. later to become Surry and Guilford, Burke and Wilkes Counties (four separate counties from Rowen.)

They lived in such places as Deep River Area - Chadham County.

According to the "Society of the Descendants of the Colonial Clergy,"

Joseph Murphy (Morphew) was born in Spotsylvania, Virginia on April 1, 1734.

He had a brother William who also was a Baptist Minister in earliest.

Tennessee and Kentucky. Their father was William. Joseph was ordained at Deep River, North Carolina in 1760 and served as a missionary to Southwestern Virginia. He settled on the Little River of the Pee Dee (Montgomery, N.C.) 1759-1768. He later served at Shallow Ford (Yadkin County) in 1769-1780, then deep River Creek in Surry County (1790-1803) he died in Surry after 1803.

In 1790 Mary Morphew settled on the South Fork of New River, now Watuaga County with the Coleman family. Not to far away Daniel Eggers and several others formed the Three Forks Baptist Church. The first west of the Blue Ridge mountains. The Morphews also lived in Burke County Next they went to Elk Creek in Wilkes County along the Boone Branch. Some left October 4th, 1811 from Ashe County and Elk Creek, N.C. with a wagon train for Kentucky and points north. During the years from 1805-1815 settlers such as Wilcoxins moved to Estill County, Kentucky - Benjamin, Joseph, James Morphew Sr. and others joined the long procession. The Caldwells and Nathan Morphew went to Ohio and was in Preble County by 1808.

Historians think there were as many as 50 people in this movement and that they all met at James Morphows place on Elk Creek for their farewells. They left Elks Creek and friends and relatives behind who weren't making the trip. They then picked up the Shawnee Trail which runs between Elk and Stoney Creeks, thru' Cooks Gap, then to New River, following that to Three Forks Church and Cemetary and stopping for services. At this point James. Joshua and Benjamin left the party going by boat down New River to Ohio. The rest of the party went on past Three Forks, past what is now Boone, N.C., past Hodges Gap, across Grave Yard Gap, down to Dog Skin Creek, around the base of Rich mountain, on to the State Line Gap, which passed between Zionvillw and Trade, N.C. to the head of Roam Creek to what is now Shouns Cross Roads, over Iron Mountian and Stone Mountain along a trail used for years by Indians, and since Daniel Boone had moved from Surry to Beaver Creek. which was near Elk Creek he very likely used the Shawnee Trail. After Iron and Stone Mountains we came to Holston Valley, at some point here the party separates with all of Silas Mornhaws family and Elizabeth Englands party separates with all of Silas Morphews family and Elizabeth Englnads

brothers going down the Clinch River south to Tennessee and Alabama, James outfit left thru' Moccasin Gap of the Clinch Mountains to Powells Valley and Powell's River, and the Wilderness Trail which took them north on to Kentucky.

Just where did they go? It is not correct to say that all the NW bound Morphews journied to Estill County, Kentucky before fanning out. Nathan and James Jr, probably never saw Estill County on their move to Preble County, Ohio, or they may have been like many others, settled for a year or two somewhere on the route northwest, found the land too poor and moved on again until they located just what they were looking for. There is a hint that Joseph Morphew lived for a short time (1811-182?) in Lee County, Va. near where Cumberland Gap was used to admit pioneers through the highest mountains into the badlands of the SE Kentucky and promises of better lands further north. Althout the Virginia stop cannot be confirmed, it is known that Joseph Morphew was living in Estill County by 1825. County records list his son James (born 1805) marrying Rebecca Hogan there. By 1827 or 1828, the Estill County Morphews moved on once again -- this time to Putnam County. Indiana.

For further information concerning this family, read the book donated to the Putnam County and Marion County State Libraries by Arlie Morphew, Author, of Franklin, Indiana called The Morphew Family a genealogy of the Morphew (Murphy) group and their kin.

The 1977 family have spilled over into the western United States, also living closer in Hendricks, Marion and surrounding counties.
