The Charles Longmeyer Swales residence was  
north of the Pennsylvania Railroad Depot on  
N. Centre Street in Rainfield, Ind. A large  
2 story frame dwelling. The Swales  
family came from Hamilton County, Indiana  
to Greilwood Township (Rainfield) in approximately  
1858.

There are 5 Swales graves in the Farris  
Cemetery. The earliest is 1858.

Mahalia Salsman Fisher died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Martha Osborne near Hazlewood, May 30, 1934 and her earthly career was measured by 77 years, 7 months and 28 days.

She was the daughter of William and Lydia (Linville) Salsman. She was born in Green county, Ky., Oct. 2, 1846. She was the oldest of a family of eight children, namely, Mahalia, Martin of near Siltersville, Isaac Thomas, deceased, Ellen Duntigan, of Armo, Andrew Jackson of Oklahoma, Moses, of Missouri and two infants, who lived but a short time.

She was united in marriage to David Fisher, October 17, 1866, and to this union were born nine children, an infant daughter, Charles Elsworth, Anna Jane Lambert, William Thomas, James Andrew, Martha Emelne Olson, Oscar Everett, Nathan Harrison and Clinton Lefroy.

Three of this family have crossed the river of death.

She united with the Regular Baptist church at Mt. Moriah, June 6, 1867, and consecrated her life to Him, who is the Saviour of all who come to him for help and strength. Her life is an open book before us where-in all may read and know her many good traits of character.

Not only did she help to rear her own family, but she took into her heart and home several of her grandchildren, who were bereft of a loving mother's care, especially so, William Lloyd Fisher, whose mother was called home to glory when he was six days old. Aunt Halia, (as she was known to all) and uncle Dave took this little babe and reared him as their own until he reached the age of fifteen years, when he, too, went home to glory.

Her last sickness was of but a few

hours duration, when on Friday morning at 5:30, she passed peacefully to sleep. She closed her eyes on the things of this world and sleeps the sleep that knows no awakening. Thus one more journey has ended. Her race is run, her voyage over and we are forced to look on this tabernacle of clay which was only a few hours ago animate with the soul and now returning to dust from whence it came. May all who this day are in the shadow of this loss of a mother, grandmother, sister and neighbor, think on and emulate only the excellencies of character and life, the many redeeming qualities she possessed, and bury deeply from our minds the smaller and imagined imperfections and sweetly lay the body in the tomb, leave the soul with the loving merciful and just God who will not forget on the great resurrection morn to call into a larger service, this mother who so valiantly fought life's battles for four score years.

Aunt Halia's whole life was lived for others, one grand and noble sacrifice and service for God and family. No other words can describe her home life so appropriately as the words of the preacher of old, "She looketh well to the ways of her household and eateth not the bread of idleness. Her children rise up and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praiseth her. Many daughters have done virtuously but thou excellest them all."

She was bereft of her husband March 8, 1921, and since then had made her home with her children.

She leaves to mourn their loss, six children, 29 grandchildren, 21 great-grandchildren, one sister, three brothers and a host of near relatives and
