Now to continue with the living.  
I, George R. Harvey, am the one referred to on page 425 of the 1914 Hendricks County History as "Raymond".  
My Grandparents had always preferred

to call me Raymond to distinguish me from my Grandfather George F. although I have only used the initial R. in my name.

I, George R. Harvey was born near Pecksburg Nov. 23, 1903. Attended Grade + High School at Clayton. Graduated with A.B and B.S. degrees in Law from Central Normal College in 1927. I had met Elva Meade (Carroll County) at Central Normal College and we were married Oct. 6, 1928.

We both taught High School, but in 1939 I was employed by the Indiana Farm Bureau for some thirty years, finally becoming an officer, Sec. Treas. During this period I had a 4 year (time out) to serve in the Army Air Corps during W.W. II finishing my service as a Lieut Colonel.

We are now both retired, my wife Elva from Teaching and I from the Farm Bureau.

We now live in Speedway, Indiana, and spend the Winters in Bradenton, Florida.
