Hutchens Family

BENJAMIN J. HUTCHINS

Benjamin J. Hutchens was born in Surry (now Yadkin) County, North Carolina 25 Oct 1825, the 5th. son of Benjamin Hutchens and Rebecca Thompson.

NORTH AMERICAN ROOTS

Benjamin J. was a fifth generation American Quaker whose g-g grandfather Nicholas Hutchens moved to Virginia from England circa 1699. Nicholas' son Strangeman b. 1707 was a prominent member of the Society of Friends and had visited North Carolina in 1756 and again in 1764, probably as a visiting minister. He must have liked what he saw and he and three of his sons moved there permanently circa 1786. As part of the plantation system of farming in the south, the Quakers had held slaves up until the time of the Revolution War. But gradually some Quakers had come forward to proclaim that slavery was against the will of god; and Quakers were urged to free their slaves. In 1782, by deed of Manumission, Strangeman Hutchens freed his twelve slaves before he removed to North Carolina.

(The Heritage of Surry County, North Carolina, Volume I- 1983, edited by Hester Bartlett Jackson has recorded on page 432 a comprehensive synopsis of the history of Nicholas Hutchins and his son Strangeman. A copy is given in Appendix ?)

Strangeman married Elizabeth Cox circa 1731 and had four boys and seven girls who were all born in Virginia. Strangeman's second son, Nicholas married Sarah Ladd 1st. of 7th month 1764 and removed to Surry County N.C. circa 1783 where Nicolas had bought some land to farm near the North fork of Forbis Creek.

The first five generations of Hutchins in America were Quakers. In fact Strangeman and his sons Thomas and Nicolas have their names listed as founding members of the Deep Creek Monthly Meeting, one of the earliest Meetings in North Carolina. The minute of the meeting was recorded on the sixth of the fourth month, 1793 and a copy of the minutes are available at the Guilford College Library in Greensborough N.C. The Quakers were great record keepers and most of them were educated to the level that they could read and write. It is because of this and the fact that they had ~~to~~ get the permission of the members to marry or to buy and sell land that we know ~~some~~ much of our forefathers today.

Note: the first five generations of Hutchins have been documented in two books. The first " Four Generations of the Family of Strangeman Hutchins and his wife Elizabeth Cox as known January 10, 1935" edited by Mrs. Gussie Waymire Crider and Edward C. Crider. The second book in three volumes "Hutchins-Hutchens Descendants of Strangeman Hutchins" compiled and edited by Rita Hineman Townsend 1979. My great Aunt Eulala Hutchens had acquired two copies of the Crider book and made a notation that the Mealy O. Hutchins (sic) listed as the son of Benjamin J. was her father Nealy Orlando. She also noted that besides those listed: Daniel M., Sarah J., William, Benjamin, and Mealy O. there was a Nick Lewis. It also appears that in response to the Criders' request for people to send in their family records Aunt Eulala sent in the dates of births, marriages and deaths of the descen^{ts} of Nealy Orlando Hutchens as they were in circa 1947, for these records appear in Rita Townsend's book and a rough copy was found ~~in~~ among Aunt Eulala's personal papers after she died.

It was here on the banks of Forbush River that Benjamin J's father, Benjamin Sr., grew up and settled. Benjamin Sr. married Rebecca Thomson 23 Feb 1809 and had eight children:

Benjamin J. inherited land from his father as recorded in the probated will of Benjamin Hutchens, May 1830 Surry County, N.C.

"....Beloved sons—Joel, Nicholas, Daniel, Gideon & Benjamin Hutchens—to hold on and equally divide all my lands and improvements...."

Benjamin J. in North Carolina

On 27 Nov 1846 Benjamin J. Hutchins of Surry County N.C. sold, to Nicholas Hobson for \$610.00, 154 acres of land on the waters of Bran Shale Creek adjoining Daniel Vestal.

In Surry County, North Carolina, on the 7th. Sept 1847 Benjamin J. Hutchins signed a bond for one thousand dollars, the condition of the obligation is such that Benjamin J. Hutchins had made application for a Licence for Marriage to be celebrated between him and Margaret Vestal. The bond was co-signed by Daniel Mckie. Margaret Vestal was born c. 1829, the daughter of James Vestal and Sarah (Sally) Martin.

The 1850 Census of Surry County, N.C. lists a Hutchens, Benjamin 24, m, farmer, \$600, b. NC; Margaret 22, f, b. NC; Daniel 1, m, b. NC; Sally Vestal 67, f, b. NC. Benjamin was not listed in the 1860 Census for Surry County.

Dr. Jerome E. Hutchens has a Bible that appears to have been owned by Benjamin J. Recorded in the Bible:

"Benjamin J Hutchens was bornd the 25 of October AD 1825
"Margaret D. Hutchins was bornd the 9th. (or 2nd?) of May AD 1829
"And wee was marred the 16 of September AD 1847

Also recorded in the Bible were the births of Benjamin J. and Margaret's seven children they had while living in Surry County N.C.:

Benjamin J. removes to Indiana

We are not sure exactly when Benjamin J. removed to Indiana nor do we know where Margaret D. died.

"Margret D. Hutchens Departed this Life the 7 of the first Mo. AD 1865

G-grandfather, Orlando, often told his grandsons of how he remembered moving from North Carolina to Indiana by wagon train and how he walked most of the way. He claimed to be 6 or 7 years old at the time; that would have placed the year as circa 1864 or 1865. Orlando's sister, Sarah J. (Guest), on the occasion of her 100th birthday reported in the Indianapolis paper, The News, that "she was born in Yadkinville, N.C., she moved to Indiana in a covered wagon, crossing the Ohio River on ice."

We are not sure what made Benjamin J. move: Was it The War? Was it the difficulty of farming the poor soil of the foothills and trying to compete with the plantations who employed slaves? Was it the dream of free fertile land of Indiana?

We do know that Benjamin J. was living in Morgan County, Indiana in 1869. According to The Peoples Guide, a Directory of Hendricks Co , published 1874: a B. J. Hutchings(sic) was living 3 miles west of Center Valley. He was born in NC 1825 and settled in Hendricks County 1869. His religion was not given. This description of his location would be exactly that of where Molc~~fy~~ J. Richardson (Lambert) owned land.

John T. Richardson of Central Valley, Indiana

When I visited the Central Valley Cemetery, near Hazelwood, Hendricks County, Indiana, I found in Section 1B, Row 4 the headstone of: Molcy J. Hutchens 1838-1911 (spelt with an e). Other Hutchens burried there are: Thompson Hutchens, son of B.J. and M.J.H. 1882; Jamima Hutchens (Ben J's son, Daniel's wife); Hutchens, infant daughter of D.M. and Jay 7-12-1876.

Not far from Molcy's grave was that of John T. Richardson, born Sept 15 1833, died July 2 1867(*Molcy's 1st husband*) and next to him Hester , wife of John T. Richardson, Aug 17 1863 (*Hester was John T's 1st wife*).

The Index to Death Records, Morgan County, Indiana 1899-1920 lists a Hutchinson, Mosley Jane, F, W, 73 Died Aug 27 1911 Monroe Township (H-17 41).

The Index to Marriage Records Hendricks County In. 1850-1920 lists: Richardson John T. to Hester Ann Larimore Jan 1 1854 (book 4 412); Richardson John T. to Malsey J. Lambert June 5 1864 (book 6 284); Richardson Molsey J. to Benjamin Huchins(sic) July 20 1870 (book 7 269).

The Registry of Deeds in Danville, In. shows that John T Richardson bought the following land in Liberty Township, Hendricks County, In:

In Section 27, 20 acres from Craven Family, May 14, 1858

In Section 27, 75 acres from Allen Rushton, Jan 16, 1866

In Section 34, 80 acres from Addison Hadly, Jan 16, 1866

In Section 27, 5 acres from Elizabeth Grinstead, Jan 16, 1866

In Section 33, 40 acres from Craven Family, Jan 16, 1866

In Misc. Record Book 9, page 273 (Danville, Hendricks County IN.) there is a record of the Petition of Alex H. Richardson to be the Administrator of the Estate of John T. Richardson, late of Morgan County, deceased, who died intestate. Also recorded there is a petition by Alex. H. Richardson, Administrator of John T. Richardson Estate vs John T. Richardson Heirs on 16 Oct 1869 to sell land at public sale to William B. and Daniel W. Richardson. In the Petition Elizabeth C. Richardson, Daniel M. Richardson, Thomas D. Richardson and Hester J. Richardson were listed as minor heirs of John T. Richardson.

On Sept 4 1868, at the Court House Martinsville, Morgan County IN. proceedings were held to hear a petition for the division of among the several owners of the John T. Richardson Estate. The Commissioners which were appointed in Nov 1867, recommended the setting apart and delivering to Malsey J. Richardson the West half of the North West quarter of Section 34 Town 14 North Range One West. Also 30 acres off of the South West quarter of Section 27 same Town and Range. (Ref: Book 2, page 79).

So in the Fall of 1867, we have Molc~~fy~~ J, a young widow of 29 years, living on a heavily mortgaged farm that her deceased husband had bought a year earlier. Her in-laws had taken her to court over the Administration of the Estate, the ownership of the lands, and the guardianship of the four minor children.

Benjamin J. Hutchens in Center Valley Indiana

The Peoples Guide, a Directory of Hendricks County, published 1874 gives Benjamin J Hutchens as settling in Hendricks Co in 1869.

So in 1869 we have Molcey J owning 70 acres of prime agriculture land and only herself to work it. Arriving from North Carolina is Benjamin J, a 44 year old widower, with seven children ranging from five to twenty, six of which were boys. A man experienced in farming but no land of his own. It appears to be a match made in heaven.

God did enter the picture on 20th. July 1870, when Benjamin J married Molcey Jane. This Holy Union produced four more children:

"Gideon Thompson Hutchens was born the 2 day of October AD 1872; departed the 8 February 1882

"Margret Caroline Hutchens was born the 17 day of February 1873

"Jerimiah Walton Hutchens was born the 11 day April AD 1876

"Enos Marion Hutchens was born the 20 of June AD 1878

Benjamin's oldest son, Daniel M. Hutchens married Jemima W. Williams on Oct 31 1872 (Ref: Book 7 page 433) they had one child, Veta born in Morgan Co In. They were Friends of the West Union Monthly Meeting.

Sarah (Jennie) married George Guest in Indianapolis, they had no children but they did adopt some.

Ruth M. Steele (daughter of Carrie nee Hutchens) wrote Oct 1997:

"Aunt Jane had 2 sons Clarence and Claude. Clarence was divorced and lived with Aunt Jane. Francis was his daughter and lived there also."

Francis Gest Plummer wrote in Oct 1997:

"I never had too many relatives and we were not a close knit family. My mother died when I was 5 yrs. Old. That's when Grandma (Gest) took my Dad and his 2 brothers in to live with her. I do remember our visits with you in Plainfield. My Dad had a twin brother named Claude. He passed away a number of years ago. He has a daughter living who is 91 yrs old."

The rest of the boys went west, "GO West Young Man Go West".

William Alvis went to Pomeroy, Garfield Co Washington where he was married to Elizabeth Howell or Youdell and had five children, names unknown.

John Henry Benjamin (Henry) was a cowboy for 16 years in Oklahoma before settling in New Providence, Hardin Co Iowa, circa 1883; he married Mary Mulford and had four children.

Nealy (Orlando) went West to New Providence, Hardin Co Iowa at the approximate age of 23 circa 1881 where he met and married Anise Caudle and had six children.

Nicholas was living in Deer Trail Colorado according to Henry's Will; he married Hannah Grosbeck. Children, if any, unknown.

Lewis was also living in Deer Trail Colorado according to Henry's Will; he later died in Pomeroy Garfield Co. Washington. He was never married.

My father told me that he never knew much about the Hutchens side of the family. This dispersion all over the country would explain why.

The Richardson Children

Elizabeth C. (born circa 1854) married Reitzel, Nov 29 1868.

Daniel M born 1858, died 1940 and is buried at Central Valley cemetery.

Thomas D, born circa 1860-1863 ???

Hester J born circa 1865 married Gilbert Allen, Feb 20 1884. *Maxine Graham (nee Hutchens) described Hester as her father's half-sister and she could remember her.*

Ruth M. Steele (daughter of Carrie nee Hutchens) wrote Oct 1997:

"Uncle Enos and Uncle Walt were full brothers to my mother. Then Hester Allen was a half sister. Then Jane Gest(sic) was a half Sister. She lived at 2022 Hillside Ave. Indpls. And Mom used to go out there and visit for 3 or 4 days & nights.

Hutchens in Indiana

Benjamin's children from his first marriage all seem to move away when they became grown ups, that left Benjamin J and his new wife Molcy to raise their new family on the farm. It appears that Hester, Molcy's child from her first marriage remained with her mother and step-father.

On the 7th. day of Sept. AD 1903 Molcy J. Hutchens of Hendricks County, Indiana conveyed to Walter and Enos M. Hutchens of Hendricks County for the sum of Love Affection & one Dollars, 10 and 26 acres of land respectfully. (Danville Registry of Deeds Book 96, page 115 and Book 95, page 546)

According to The History of Hardin County Iowa, published 1911, Benjamin J Hutchens died while visiting his son Henry and instead of shipping his body back to Indiana, he was buried in the New Providence Cemetery, Iowa. His headstone reads that his was born October 23, 1825, died March 29, 1904.

On 26 day of June 1906 Malcy J. Hutchens of Hazelwood, Hendricks County, Indiana appointed E. V. Milhon power of attorney to settle up her estate at her death. (Danville Miscellaneous Records Book 7, page 549)

Maxine Hutchens Graham

Maxine Hutchens was born September 20, 1911, the daughter of Enos and Dovie Cooper Hutchens. Her maternal grandparents were the Rev. Shelby T. 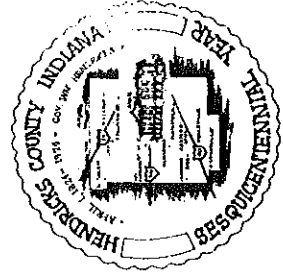
