In the early 1800's, the Lowry family came from Rush County, Indiana, to Hendricks County in a covered wagon. The hoops from the wagon are still in the family. There were Sam, Joseph, Dudley, Charles, Mary and Elizabeth who married brothers Dudley and Jake Hite, and John Harrison (born 1815) who married Lucinda Higgins, and after her death married her sister Nancy (born 1825).

The Higgins family consisted of the parents, William A. and Elizabeth (born 1792), and these children: William, Moses, Milburn, Alfred, James, Lucinda, Nancy, Asenath, and Ann who married Eliot Wilson.

John Harrison Lowry and his wife Nancy, William A. Higgins and his wife Elizabeth, daughter Asenath and Alfred Higgins are buried in the Lowry cemetery.

On October 19th, 1855 John Harrison Lowry bought 240 acres from Jesse Hendricks and his wife Mary (Recorded in Book 19, page 75 Hendricks County Record). John Harrison pressed brick in his own kiln for three houses that we know of, (All were in the Lowry family), and we have been told some went into the Christian church at Jamestown. (Jesse Hendricks ^{was} buried in the Lowry cemetery).

The children of John Harrison Lowry and Lucinda Higgins were: Luisa Jane who married Johnson van Arsdale; William J. who married Pantha Jane Neff; Mary who married Thomas Deatley; Angeline who married Meritt Hall, who died and then John Groover. (Angeline is in the Lowry cemetery).

Luisa Jane Lowry and Johnson Van Arsdale were the parents of Nancy Avaline who married J.M. Emmert, locally known as Nan and Mort Emmert, and Willmetta who married S.F. Cline, locally known as Willa Cline. The only child of Nan and Mort Emmert, a son, is buried in the Lowry cemetery.

The children of John H. Lowry and Nancy Higgins were:
Melissa who married Seaborn Patterson (We have in the family a motto made by Melissa)
Frank who married Armilda Orear
James P. who married Margaret Neff
Orval Wright who married Fanny Utterback and lived in one of the brick houses built from the kiln. (O.W. Lowry appears on an old list as Veterinary Surgeon, Farmer, Stock raiser).

Lucinda Avaline Lowry (1851- 1898) married John Basil Yelton. The Yeltons had come up from Pendleton County, Kentucky, to Park County, Indiana, and thence to settle on the Stringer farm (across from Fountain School) which lies five miles west of Jamestown. (Lucinda Avaline inherited a cherry drop- leaf table from her mother which is still in the family).

Maude Eliza Yelton (Born 1879 and still living) married Thomas Johnson Wilson. His parents Richard, Morrison and Zerelda Elizabeth Bradshaw Wilson, and brother William had come from Mt. Sterling, Montgomery County, Kentucky, around 1850.

In 1864 William Wilson bought from Maria A. Walker 118 acres in Hendricks County (Original land grant from U.S. Government to John McIntosh Mar. 12, 1830) Abstract in possession of John R. Wilson, Jamestown.

William Wilson had no children. Children of Richard Morrison and Zerelda Elizabeth Wilson were:

Mary Ann known as Molly, also Puss-married Amos D. Hendricks

Nannie M. married Leon Graves ^{and} lived at Thorntown.

John William married Fanny Clark (from Bourbon County, Kentucky)

Sarah Frances (died at age 5)

Richard Morrison married ^{Margaret} Margaret Neff (moved to California).

Thomas Johnson married Maude Eliza Yelton

Sissy Wilson (died at age 2)

Nathaniel (died at age 1)

Emma Lee (died at age 7)

Richard Morrison, William and wife Fanny, Mary Ann, Sarah Frances, Sissy, Nathaniel, Emma Lee are buried in the Lowry cemetery. These graves do not have formal headstones. There is a large field stone to mark the head of Richard Morrison's grave.
