Dear Pam,

I am glad some of the younger folks are interested in the family tree - Some of my generation think I am a nut. If I am there are some "other nuts" on the tree too.

Seems they want to know what I have found out anyway.

So far we have not had any horse thieves or tramps. If we could record some of the stories our ancestors told it would be more exciting - I'm sure your mother can tell stories her grandfather told about when he was a boy. If you remember them - be sure to write them up - let us make this family book more interesting, than born - married - children and death dates.

You may not know it but I live on the farm that was purchased in 1838 for \$2.00 per acre by Philomena Phillips - sold to my grandfather Amos Phillips in 1867 - then inherited by my grandmother in 1912 after his death - My mother and father bought the same 40 acres in 1929 - and after mother's death I became the owner by inheritance in 1960 - So our abstract is very small - They had bought the rest, a joining 40 acres in 1912 when my grandfather died - I am my only niece - daughter of my only mother, was that so or I could have some copies of the subdivision on the abstract

made that gives the names of all the children along the family line - So far I have not had time to go to the County Census records to verify the births - deaths - etc.

Just now I am getting all the names etc so I can record my findings - or some one else can follow it up. Too bad this Ancestry History did not come up while our Alder members were still alive.

I have been working on both sides of my family tree - "Believe you me" they all had big families and many children each generation so it will grow and grow -

I am enclosing a form I had printed so the information can be filled out for the records - I go to Plainfield for meals a lot. Why not get together some time and we can pool our information. I never heard the Indian story before - Although it is possible.

When I was in Boston at the Old North Church - I found the name Philimon Phillips on a brass plate on one of the Pews - on the Right side of the Center Aisle - I talked to the Church Sexton and they were interested in where the families had gone from there.
