FOREWORD

This Foreword is being prepared for such posterity and others that might be interested in a small segment of the Starbuck family descending from the sixth generation union of Paul Starbuck 1771 - 1826 and Mary Coffin 1750 - ????, particularly the descendants of their son Seth born 1768 in Nantucket, Mass. He died sometime after 1840 in Greenup, Illinois.

Pages 1 to 4 incl. under heading "FACTS AND PERTINENT INFORMATION RELATING TO SETH (7) STARBUCK AND HIS FAMILY", which forms a part of this compilation, reveals difficulties encountered in authenticating certain facts. Reasonable assumptions, it is felt, have been made.

The source of records in the migration of Paul and his wife Mary from Nantucket, Mass. to North Carolina was primarily Census Reports, Minutes of Monthly Meetings of the Quakers, and Wills filed in Stokes and Guilford Counties of North Carolina.

In the subsequent migration of Seth (7) Starbuck 1768 - 1840's and his family from North Carolina to Coles Co., Illinois the Records utilized were primarily Census Reports, Cemetery Records prepared by the Cumberland Co. and Coles Co. Genealogical Societies and visits made to cemeteries in those counties. The total destruction in 1885 of the Cumberland Co. Courthouse at Toledo, Ill. by fire resulted in irreparable loss of vital records.

Genealogical data relating to Seth (8) Starbuck 1816 - 1901 and his family were provided from Census Reports for Cumberland Co., Ill., gravestone inscriptions, newspaper obituaries and death notices, and Undertakers records. The memories of the two surviving grandchildren of Seth (8) namely Pearl S. and Francis A. Starbuck indicated on Page 4A of the Charts were also utilized to advantage.

Acknowledgement is gratefully accorded to the following individuals and organizations for their assistance and contributions in the overall accomplishment of this Compilation.

1 - James Carlton Starbuck of Decatur, Georgia who has amassed a prodigious amount of information in his several years of research of the Starbuck family.

2 - Miss Mary Holt of Greenup, Illinois a veteran genealogist and active member of the Cumberland Co. Geneal. Society which she helped organize. Mary is a native of Greenup, the daughter of Squire Holt a funeral director of the late 1800's and early 1900's in Greenup. The Library of the Society located in the home of Mary is the depository of much valuable Geneal. info.

3 - Virgil C. Dollahon's Compilation entitled "THE STARBUCK FAMILY HISTORY" is a 106 page work covering in great detail the antecedents and descendants of Matthew Starbuck of "Bon Homme Richard" renown, a brother of Paul (6). The work does not pursue, however, the descendants of Paul (6). The format of the Dollahon work has been followed in preparation of Charts and Notes contained herein involving certain descendants of Paul (6).

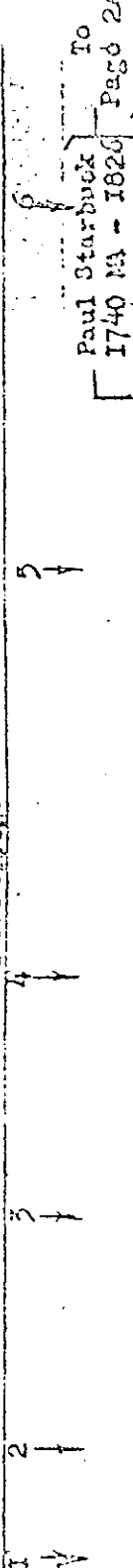

5 - The following Libraries and Archives were primary sources of information in the development of this Compilation.

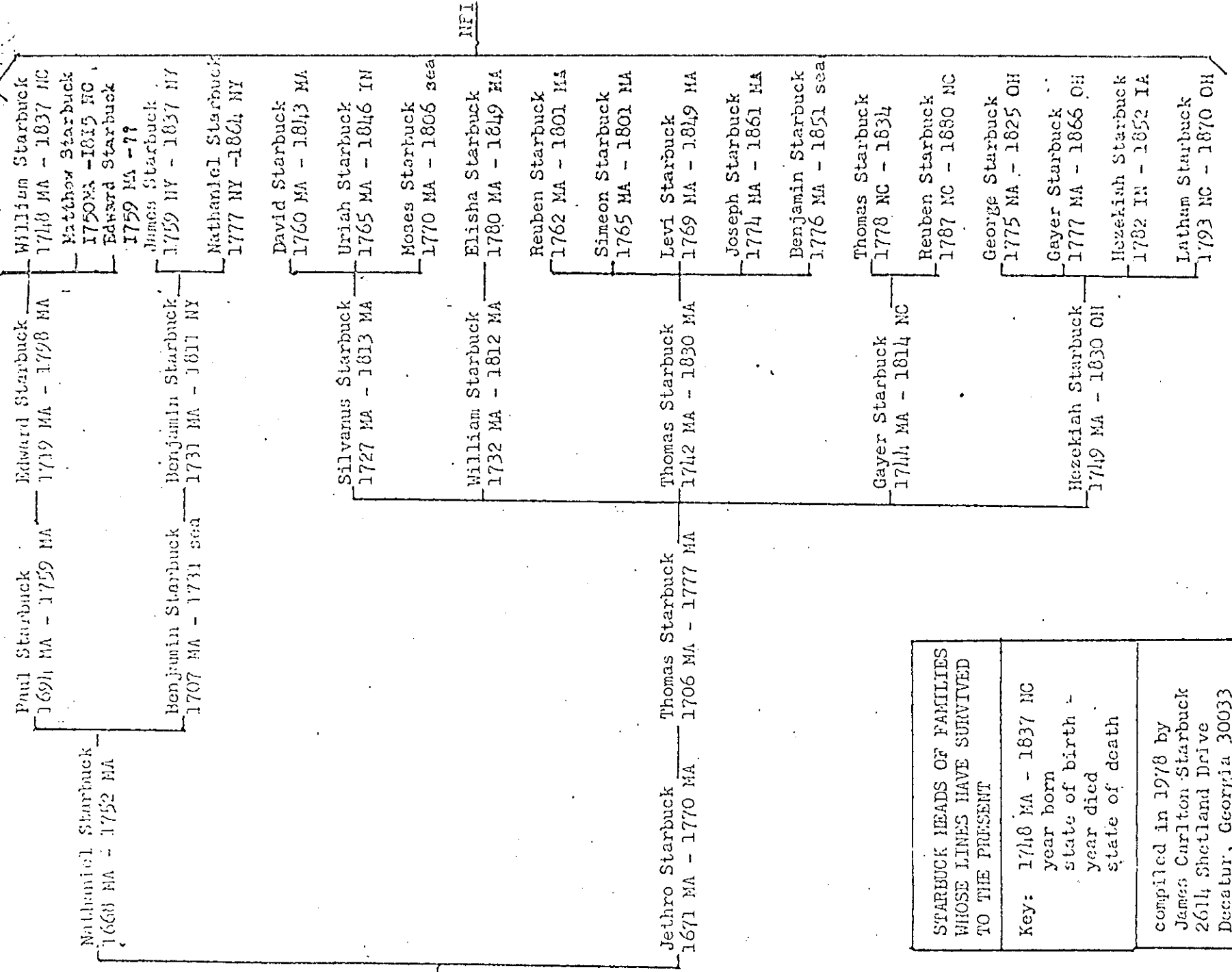

FACTS AND PERTINENT INFORMATION RELATING TO SETH (7) STARBUCK AND HIS FAMILY.

- 1 - Seth (7) was a son of Paul (6) Starbuck who died in 1826 or 1827 based on the date his Will was signed and the date it was probated in Stokes Co., N.C.
- 2 - Seth (7) named in his father's Will was born Dec. 28 1768 which substantially dates him as being born in 1769. (See Page 517 of "Hinshaw's" Vol. I, "Encyclopedia of American Quaker Genealogy".)
- 3 - It is assumed that Seth (7) and Paul (7) sons of Paul (6) are those shown on Census Reports for Stokes County, N.C. and Coles County, Illinois. The data below will involve only Seth (7), as head of family. No data for Paul (7) is shown.

- 4 - Cumberland County, Ill. which was a progeny of Coles County did not exist prior to March 2 1843. The 1850 Census for Cumberland County did not show any male Starbuck over 32 years of age nor any females over 40 years. It appears Seth (7) and his wife died sometime between 1840 and 1850. Since the County Courthouse at Toledo, Ill. was destroyed by fire in 1885 the records on this couple are obscure at this time. (1978)
No gravestones can be found in Greenup, Ill. Cemetery where this couple logically would have been buried. Vandalism has taken it's toll in the older part of this cemetery.

- 5 - Surry County, N.C. was organized Dec. 5 1771. Parent County was Rowan.
- 6 - Stokes County, N.C. was organized Nov. 29 1779. Parent County was Surry.
- 7 - Seth (7) apparently resided in Rowan County as a small boy since his father Paul (6) emigrated from Ma. in 1773.
- 8 - Data based on Federal Census Reports of Stokes County, N.C. for 1820, 1830, 1840 Coles Co., Ill. for 1840, Cumberland, Ill. for 1850, gravestone inscriptions and HINSHAW'S Encyclopedia etc. support assumptions made in this paragraph.

Seth apparently married a second time based on these two facts:

(1) - Inscriptions on the gravestones of Dianah Starbuck and Jesse G.L. Starbuck indicate they were respectively daughter and son of

S. & E. Starbuck.

(2) - Info. furnished Mrs. Wreatha Starbuck Fisher of Bloomington, Ind. by Mrs. Novak indicates a number of real estate transactions in Stokes Co., N.C. involving Seth Starbuck one of which is quoted as follows "Bk 13 Page 13 May 13 1837 Seth Starbuck and Elizabeth his wife to Joshua Young. Wit: Dianah Starbuck Flynt Lin---." This info. was furnished by Wreatha Fisher in her letter of Aug. 3 1979 to F.A. Starbuck.

See 1850 Cumberland County, Ill. Census (84-84) 1850 Census and 1880 102-102. It appears Sarah may have been either a mother who had married a Starbuck, a foster mother or an illegitimate mother of Leroy Starbuck. Her gravestone in the Greenup Cemetery has this inscription 'Rest Mother In Quiet Peace'.

Since the 1850 Census of Illinois shows Susanah Dickson living in the same dwelling (76) with Eliza Starbuck a possibility exists she was a widow living with her sister.

** Gravestone and obituary inf. indicates Seth (8) was born in 1815 - Illinois Census Report for 1850, 1870, and 1880 indicates he was born in 1825. In a rather long obituary uncovered in the GREENUP PRESS (Ill.) dated Feb. 28 1901 it was reported that he was born in Stokes Co., N.C. Jan. 13 1816. He died Jan. 25 1901 at age 85 years. The newspaper is in the files of the Cumberland County Genealogical Society at Greenup, Ill.

*** The above data indicates that if Jesse G.L. Starbuck was a son of Seth (7) the latter would have been approx. 63 years of age when Jesse was born, not beyond the realm of possibility. Seth's wife's age on the 1830 Stokes County Census was indicated as between 40 and 50 years. Her capability to bear a child must be considered a possibility. Seth's ability to sire a child must also be considered a possibility at 63 years. The writer of these notes was born Aug. 2 1903. His father William Wesley Starbuck (9) was 58 years 6 months of age when the writer was born. U.S. Senator Strom Thurmond and actor Jimmy Durante are examples of men siring children after 70 years of age.

8-(contd from Page 2) A logical question arises.- If Seth (7) son of Paul and Mary married Deborah Coffin in 1794 why was there no children of record born before William who was born 15 years later in 1809. Until other facts are developed it must be assumed Seth (7) fathered no other children.

9- The following listings are from the 1840 Federal Census of Coles Co. Illinois (approx. 14 or 15 Pages from the end of microfilm Roll #57.) It is thought that the info. might be of help in determining the contemporaries of Seth(7) at that date in time.

10- Thomas Lincoln, the father of Abraham, and his wife are listed on Roll # 57. No children are indicated. (this info. is on the 4th to lastpage of Roll # 57.) Thomas is in age bracket 60-70. Wife is in age bracket 50-60.

11- Seth(7) and Thomas Lincoln were contemporaries in Coles Co. Ill. during the period from 1838 when Seth(7) came to Illinois from North Carolina. Thomas Lincoln born in 17 died in 1851. Seth born in 1768 died sometime between 1840 and 1850. They lived approx. 8 miles apart, as the crow flies, when Thomas lived on his Goose Nest farm and Seth lived in Greenup Ill. Seth(8) the son of Seth(7) was born in 1816 in N.C.

Thomas died on his Goose Nest farm which today is known as the Lincoln Log Cabin State Park approx. 8 miles south of Charleston Ill.

12- Seth(7) Starbuck is the only entry on the page where he is recorded as being in the 70-80 age bracket. For Seth's family one male is shown engaged in Agriculture and two shown in Mfg. & Trade. Females are indicated, three in 15-20, two in 20-30 and one in the 50-60 brackets.

MEMORANDUM

13- DID SETH(7) STARBUCK HAVE A SON WILLIAM BORN IN 1809 ?

The following are excerpts quoted from Mrs Wreatha Starbuck's letter of 17 April 1979 to F.A. Starbuck. Her letter has much info. re: the subject.

Quote: The 1820²⁰ Census of Stokes Co. N.C. shows a William Starbuck living next door to Seth(7) Starbuck, most likely this is a son and father. This has to be mine. (Wreatha's great grandfather) He was married to Mary S. Hester on Sept. 1829. From the above I deem it logical that the two people are son and father. I included William in the list of possible children of Seth(7) listed in the 1850 Census for Cumberland Co. from your list and mine and tried to fit these people into the Census lists. It came out perfectly for the 1810 Census. (Stokes Co. N.C.) "

MISC. RANDOM NOTES OF POSSIBLE USEFULNESS IN FURTHER RESEARCH.

(e)-No copies of the Greenup Press have been retained by that newspaper prior to 1927. No microfilm either.
(b)-The Greenup Library doesn't seem to have much information.
(c)-The Cumberland Genal. Soc. Library at Greenup is a good source for research. They are rather active and are accumulating copies of old newspapers, obituaries etc. They hope to have them microfilmed, with State of Ill. help. (See Note (r) below)
(d)-Toledo Ill. is the County Seat of Cumberland Co. The Public Libr. there has turned over to the C.C.G.S. (as of June 1979) some informational matter of genealogical importance.

(e)- TOLEDO ILL.

No newspapers have been retained beyond 1928 by the paper named Democrat as best remembered.

The records at the County Courthouse were all destroyed in the fire of 1885. There are no records of death certificates of families before 1916. No wills indexed between 1885 and 1900 for a Starbuck.

(f)-At Charleston Ill. the Coles Co. Genal. Soc. (Library at the County Court house bldg) is working to achieve an orderly arrangement of the considerable genealogical information they have there.

(g)-The Courthouse at Charleston Ill. has no census records. No marriage records before 1878.

(p)-The Spfld Archives has an 1840 STATE Census Volume, which according to their Card Index show an S. Starbuck, however, the Volume was so deteriorated that it could not be read on a cursory examination.

Pages 636 to 641 lists approx. 600 early pioneers by counties for the years 1828 to 1839 mostly from Ken, Tenn, Virginia, Ohio, and Indiana. From North Carolina only the following were listed:

Jacob Hoots -1836
Bailey Riddle -1833

David and Jacob Hoots are shown on the 1840 Coles Co. Census about 20 to 22 pages from the end of the Report. No research was attempted for the remaining men above.

Page 653 of the above mentioned Encyclopedia states "Owens and Harmon" were the first blacksmiths in Coles Co. according to LeBaron History of 1879 - F896 C-9 H67L. The LeBaron Volume was examined but nothing of importance was found.

William is the only Starbuck on the 1840 Census for Stokes Co. N.C. and Seth(7) is the only Starbuck shown on the 1840 Census For Colusa Co. Ill.
