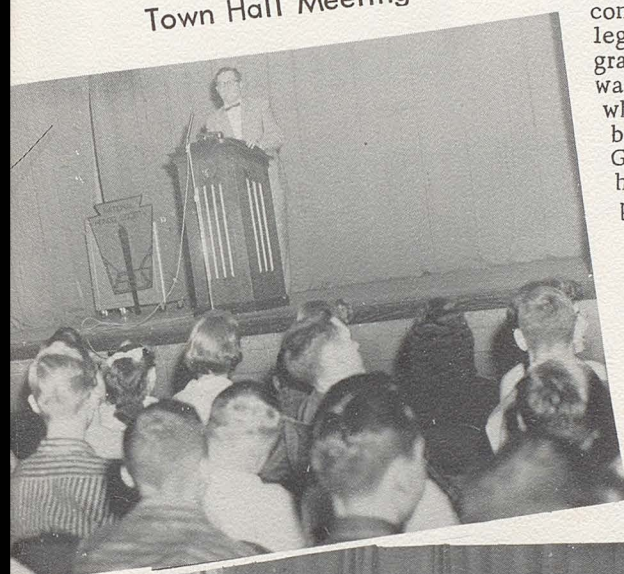

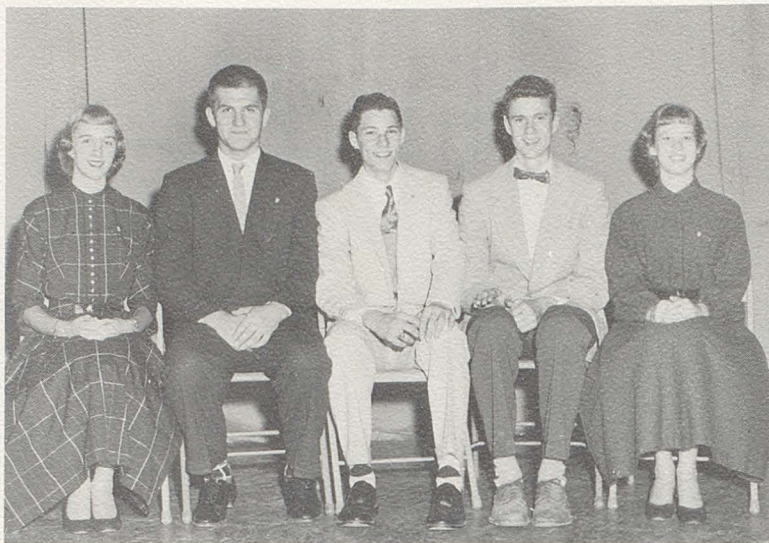
Honor Society

The Plainfield Chapter 2240 received its charter from the National Honor Society in May of 1940. The organization, being an honor group, strives to prove its worth by encouraging others to improve scholarship. It meets monthly with an evening dinner meeting.

To be eligible for election to the society, one must be in the upper third of the class in scholarship. Final selection is done by the vaculty by ranking the nominees on character, leadership, and service. Fifteen per cent of eligible seniors and ten per cent of eligible juniors are chosen.

The annual project of the Honor Society is a Sample Fair in the spring. The proceeds from this project go into its Student Loan Fund. The organization now has five loans available to worthy graduates. Another project is the annual subscription to an American magazine which is sent to a teacher in Germany and to one in Finland.

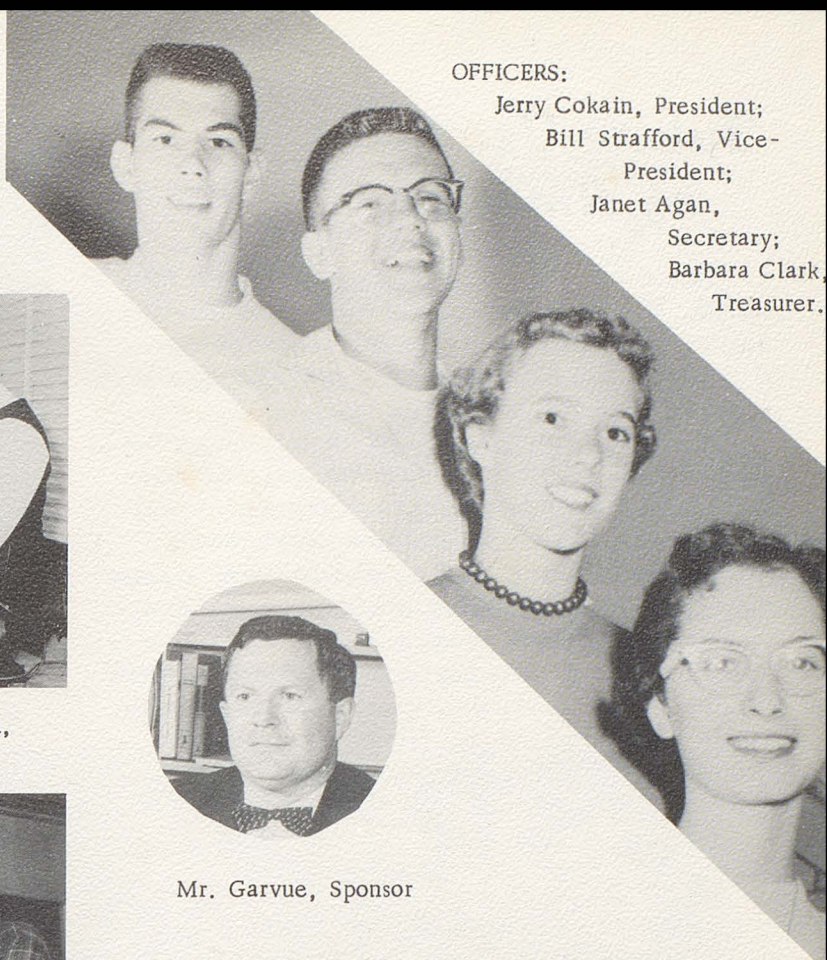

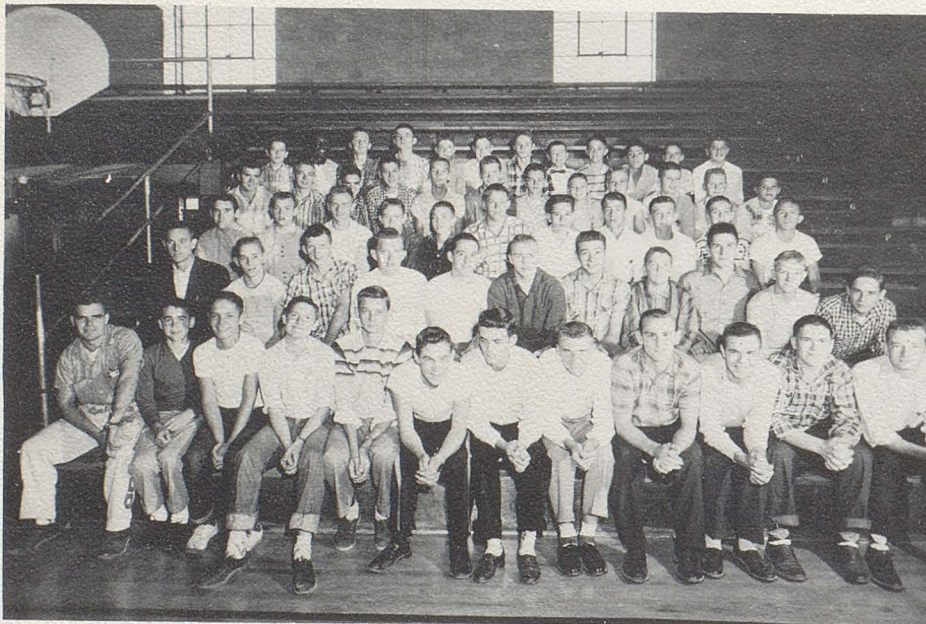

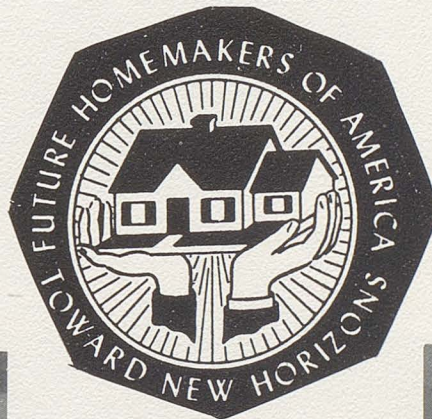

Its activities include such projects as having a grain and hay show, parent and son banquet, popcorn sales at ball games, pest eradication and district contests.



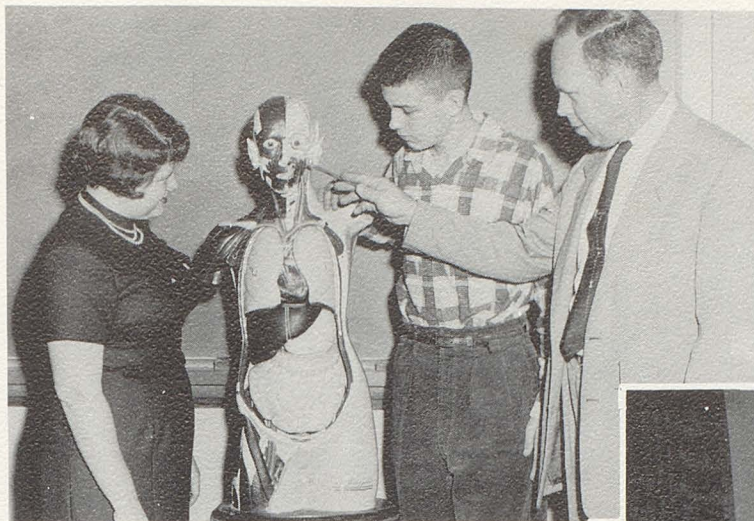
