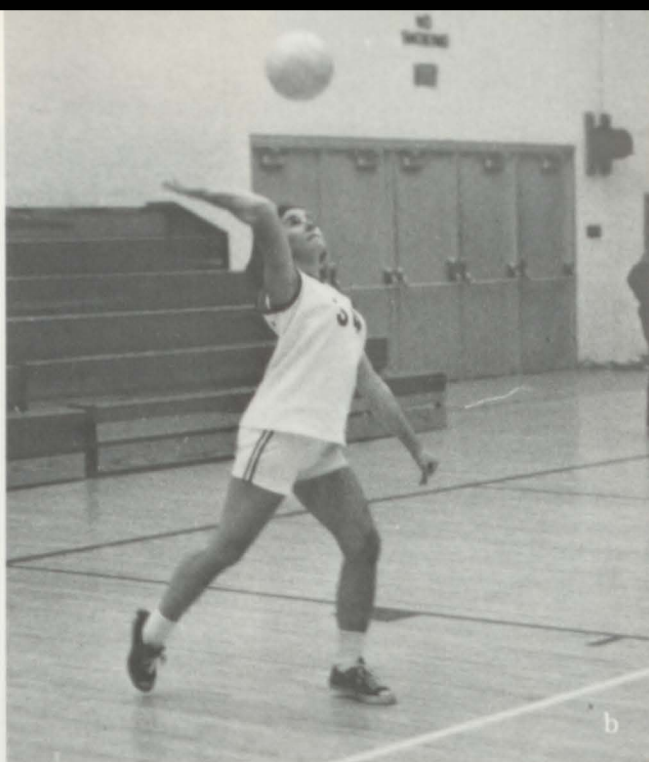


a) Balanced on the beam, Peggy Haggard performs at the optional level against North Central.

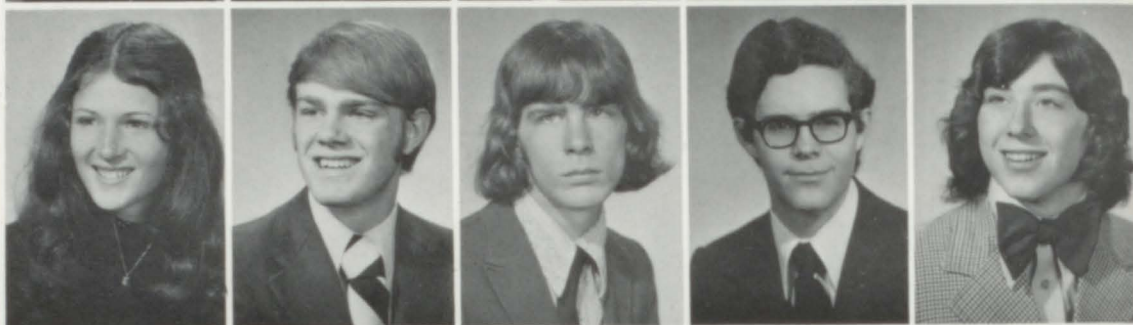


- a) Watching the pitcher, Doug Freeland takes a long lead off second base ready to head for home when the ball is hit.

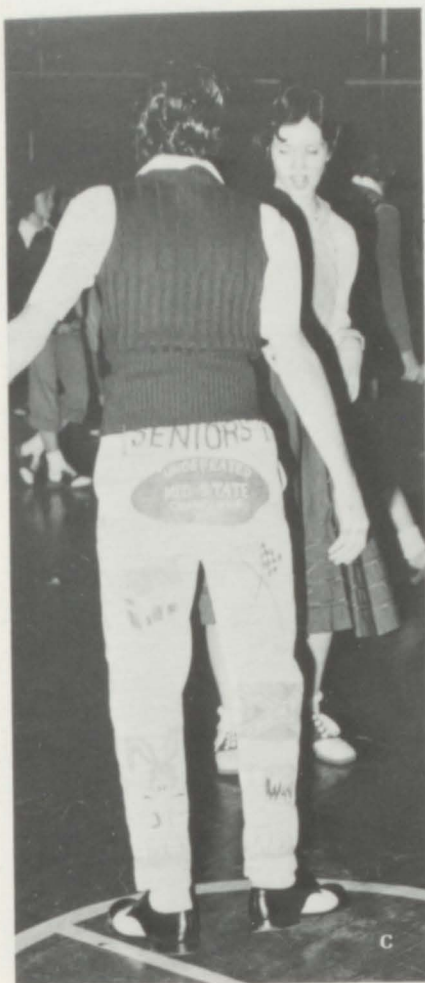

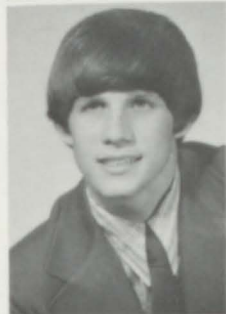

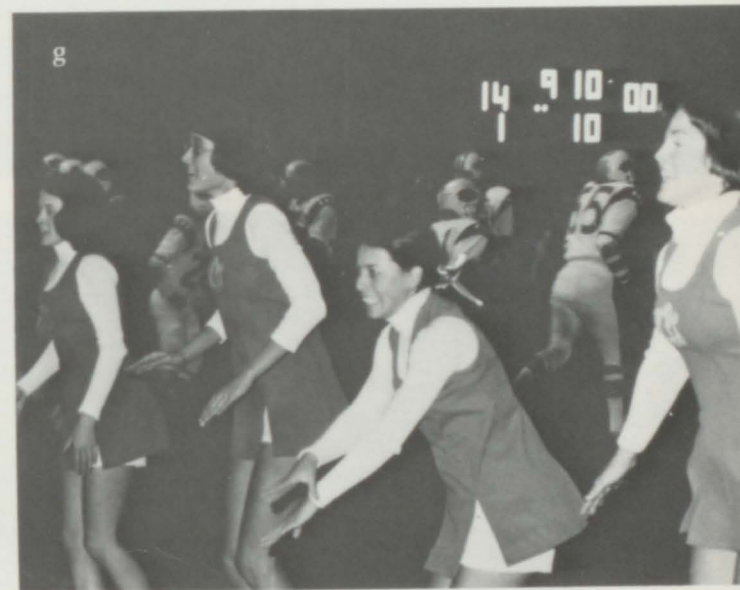

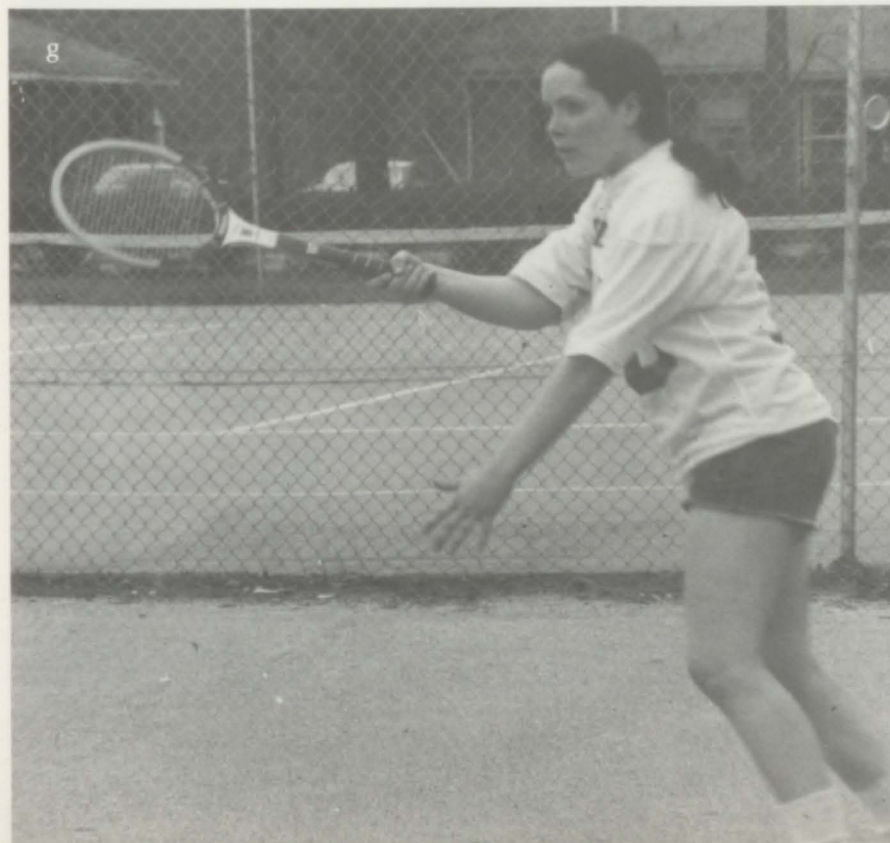

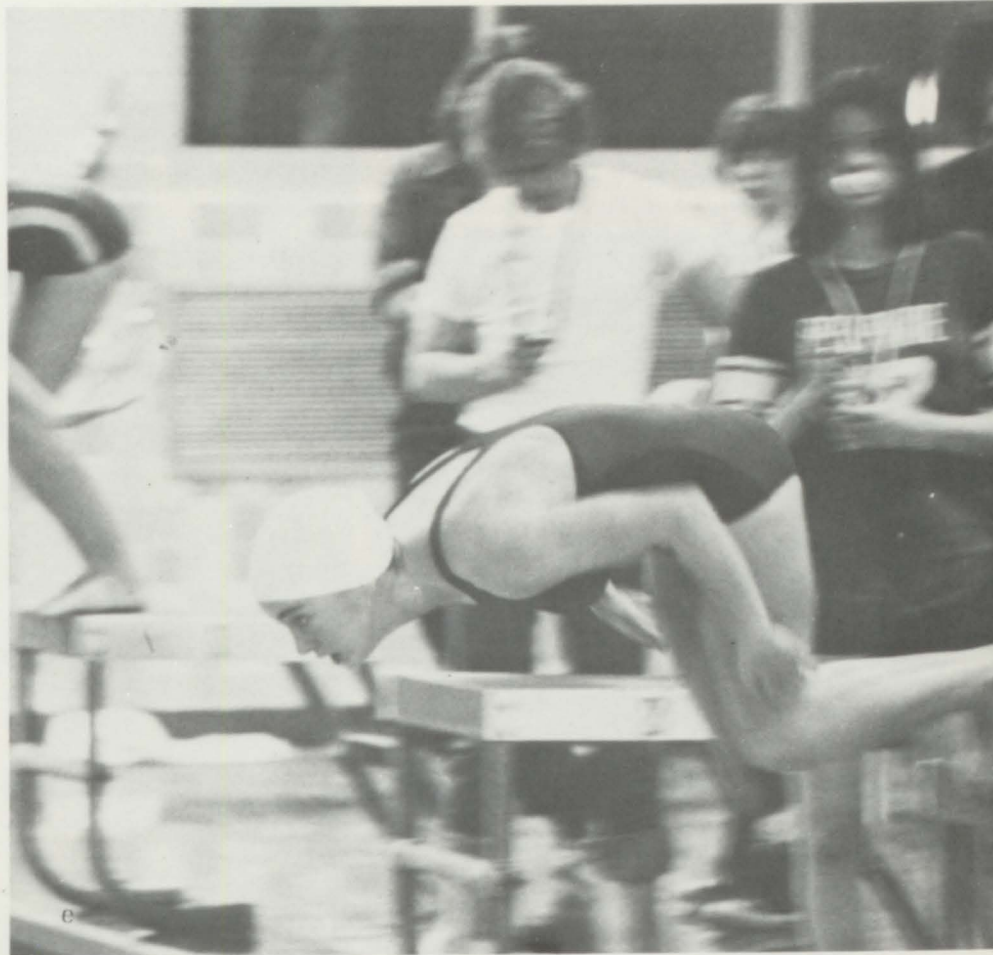

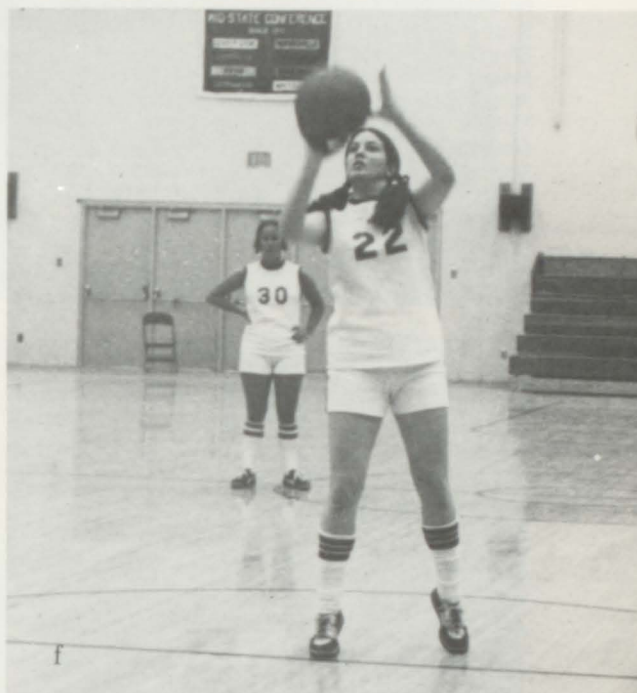

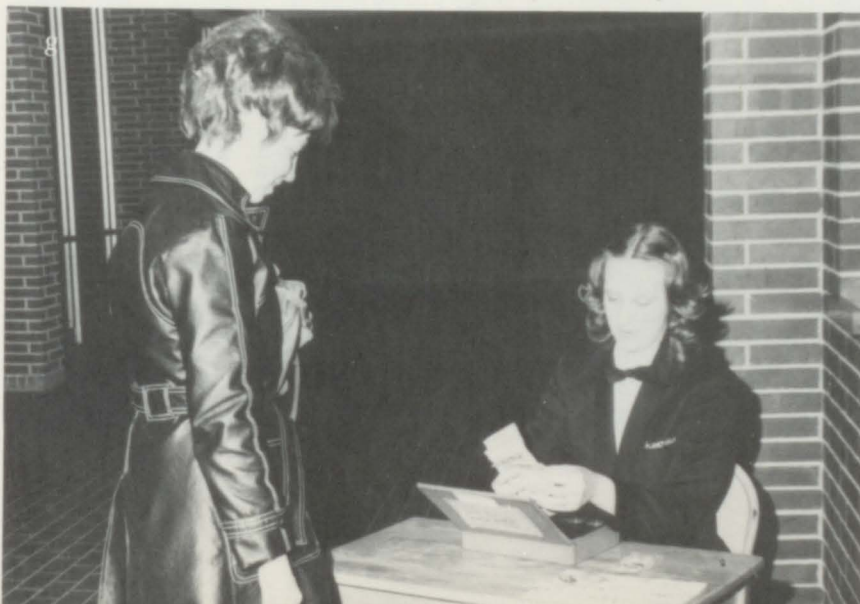

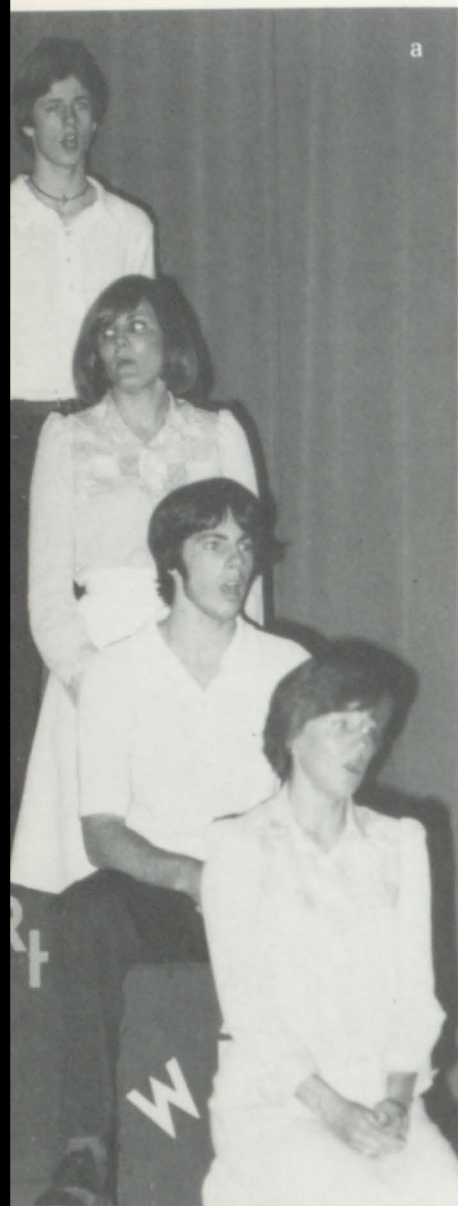

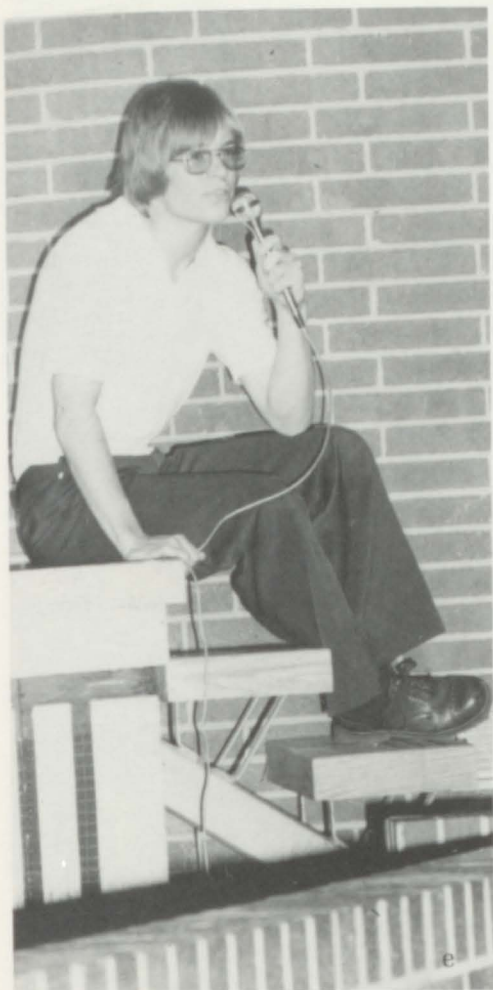

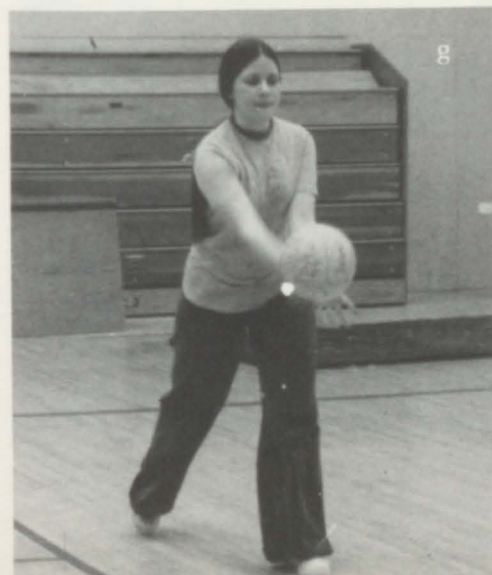
