Shought I would spend a part of newyears May writing to you I am feelly well at present and have been in pretty good health all the time we have a very mice beauth here in the edge of Holly Springs, Holly Springs is a nice lown it contained some 3000 inhabitance previous to the Rebellion there is a fiew Certagens here now but not very many it was her that the Rele made a dash some 2 weeks ago & took Leverah of our men prisoners they Rebels burned the deporand several valueable stores belonging to the government they thou also burned some other buildings there was right smart of resistance offered them by the illinois Cavelry there are several dead horses laying about 3000 yards from our camp y saw several laying in town. (they are taken of now) there are a lot of very fine building gs here most of what care used for hospitals. Ten M.S. Frants Head quarters is in a fife building here he has a telegraph wire detached from the main line to his headquarters he receives and sends

dispaches constantly, we have good tents they are large there are 12 stays in ours we have a little stove that some of the men left here and have it fixed up we can keep the tent very warm all the time it is prety cold here now espesially of nights it freezes about 2 inches thick and thanks out in the morning. We have got no news from home yet the mail is surpressed we hear news every day but it is only camp rumors we got some papers of the at the then we have not had any reliable news Since we have heard a time or do that our men had taken Richanond and we hear once and a while that Burnerdes was defeated there, we have the most reason to believe the latter for the news would not be likely to be kept from us if we were victorious there seems to be no doubt but that vicks burgh is evacuated. I would like very muleh to get a letter from home for the wait is surprefsed for 30 days at least. We hear that there is than armistes of Bo days granted I hope if it be so they will compramise and quit the whole army of the hipsifes phi is going north where I don't know we will go towards Memphis Sinet letters to bellumbus ky, and when the mail comes through they will come In Camp at Holly Springs, Mis 1st mo 1st 1863 (Jan. 1, 1863)

Dear Father Mother Brothers and Sister.

I thought I would spend a part of new years day writing to you. (they are taken off now) There are a lot of very fine buildings here most of which are used for hospitals. Gen U. S. Grants Headquarters is in a fine building here he has a telegraph wire detached from the main line to his headquarters he receives and sends dispatches constantly. We have good tents they are large there are 12 stays in ours we have a little stove that some of the men left here and have it fixed up we can keep the tent very warm all the time it is pretty cold here now espesialy of nights it freezes about 2 inches thick and thaws out in the morning.

We have got no news from home yet the mail is surpressed we hear news every day but it is only camp rumors we got some papers of the 9th of last month they had commenced to fight at Richmond then we have not had any reliable news since we have heard a time or to that our men had taken Richmond and we hear once and a while that Burnsides was defeated there. We have the most reason to believe the latter for the news would not be likely to be kept from us if we were victorius there seems to be no doubt but that Vicksburgh is evacuated. I would like very mutch to get a letter from home for the mail is surpressed for 30 days at least. We hear that there is an armistes of 30 days granted. I hope if it be so they will compromise and quit the whole army of the Mississippi is going north wehere I don't know we will go towards Memphis before long I think. I will quit for this for this time. Your well wishing son Jno Mills
