Dear Parents & Brother & Sister, I proceed this evening to write you another letter to inform you of my welfare I am in moderate health now and improving slowly I have a pretty bad cold is the main complaint. I received 3 letters today from home one written the 22 of 2nd mo which was sent by Amos Carter and 2 others one written by Charles dated the 22 of 2nd mo and one dated the 1st of 3rd mo all of which Tip Minor brought to me — Amos Carter is at Memphis his he has got a detail

there for to clerk in
some government department.
I also rec. a letter some 2
weeks ago from home wh
ich came through in due
time I have written 2 or
3 letters since I rec. that
one I write every 3 or 4
days as a general thing
there must be some irregula
rity in the mail some where
I think I have several
letters back some place.

I was very glad to here
of your good health and
prosperity and that of our
connection but sorry to hear
that uncle Josiah was
declining. the health of
the corp is pretty good now
there is still none in the Hospit
al from our corp. the mor

Stability in the reg has
somewhat subsided but
there is some one dying more
every day yet that is pretty
bad but not so bad as
it was a while we have lost
about 85 men since we came
here the weather is more
favorable now and there
will probably not be so
much sickness. Daniel
Bray arrived here some
3 days since to take his
Brother home his coffin
has not come yet. He is
gone to see about it. Today
there is trains running
constantly now and we
will likely get mail promp-
tly. father has mentioned
something about J S Poe
being under arrest I will state

the case. the reason I
had not written any thing
about it - was I thought I
would see if he would write
himself. Shortly after we
came to this place Pac got
to telling the boys that he
had got to believe he could was
not consciously opposed to
fighting. he talked so much
about it that the Lieutenant
got spunky of him and one
morning when Pac was telling
his sentiments the Lieutenant
was by and told him he
would show him about wheat-
her he would not fight or not
so he went to the Colonel and
had Pac arrested and he has
been under arrest ever since
till day before yesterday when
the colonel told him he had

I was very glad to here of your good health and prosperity and that of our connection but sorry to hear that Uncle Josiah was declining. The health of the camp is pretty good now there is still none in the hospital from our comp. the mortality in the reg has somewhat subsided but there is some one dyeing most every day yet that is pretty bad but not so bad as it was a while we have lost about 35 men since we came here. The weather is more favorable now and there will probably not be so mutch sickness. Daniel Bray arived here some 3 days since to take his brother home. His coffin has not come yet he is gone to see about it today. There is trains running constantly now and we will likely get mail promptly. Father thee mentioned something about J. S. Poe being under arest I will state the case. The reason I had not written anything about it was I thought I would see if he would write himself. Shortly after we came to this place Pie got to telling the boys that he had got to believe he was conscenciously opposed to fighting he talked so mutch about it that the Lieutenant got spunkey at him and one morning when Poe was telling his sentiments the Lieutenant was by and told him he would show him about wheather he would not fight or not so he went to the Colonel and had Poe arested and he has been under arrest ever since till day before yesterday when the colonel told him he had (on next sheet)
