Cooples is tap of Scott 1st Lieutenant. me Still get pretty paents of ration of crackers and pert coffee Sugar of rico of homony. we don't know why we are going to leave heare unless this place is to be evacuated after little there is not very many brooks here now. I have not heard any thing from vicksburgh for several days There was a rumor that our force was going to leave there but I think there is, no truth in it. I received I papers day before yesterday. have nothing more to write at present. Your wellwishing Son Ino, Mills,

Dear Father Mother Brothers & Sister.

I take the present oportunity of writing a few lines to inform you how I am getting along. I am not very well at present. I have a very bad cold and my head is stoped up. I have some pills which I take occasionly and keep my bowels open. I think if I can get my cold worked off I will get better. I have been somewhat unwell for some time but able to be about. I hav not rec. any more letters from home since Hiner came. I have written once since. We have marching orders to go some 10 miles this side of Memphis to guard the railroad we are to go tomorrow is the order now. There is right smart of sickness in the reg. yet there is 3 in the hospital from our company now Caleb Rushton Wm. Ware & Hiram Wood Rushton & Ware is quite sick, Hi. Is not mutch sick. We have had considerable rain for a few days but it is a nice & sunny this morning. We have had a promotion in our company since I wrote last. Orderly Sergt Shinvy of Mooresville has got to be 2nd Lieutenant it sets him up mightly Peoples is Cap & Scott 1st Lieutenant. We still get pretty plenty of rations of crackers and pork coffee sugar & rice & homony. We don't know why we are going to leave heare unless this place is to be evacuated after little there is not very many troops here now. I have not heard any thing from Vicksburgh for several days there was a rumor that our force was going to leave there but I think there is not truth in it. I received 3 papers day before yesterday.

I have nothing more to write at present.
