had considerable rain for
a few days but it is a

we have had a promotion in
our company since I wrote last
Orderly Sergt Shimmy of Moores
ville has got to be 2nd Lieutenant
and it sets him up mightly

Peoples is Cap of Scott
1st Lieutenant. we still
get pretty plenty of ration
of crackers and hard coffee sugar
& rice & homony. we dont know
why we are going to leave
here unless this place is to
be evacuated after little there
is not very many troops
here now. I have not
heard any thing from
Vicksburgh for several days
there was a rumor that our
force was going to leave there
but I think there is no truth
in it. I received 3 papers day
before yesterday.

I have nothing more
to write at present.
