Honored Parents Brothers & Sister

I am permitted once more to write you a few lines to inform you how I am getting along. My health is tolerably good there is but little complaint with the remaining members of the comp that are present, true wee are all tired and worn almost out with so long being in the ditches and working of nights and wee see but little prospect of being relieved very soon but hope sutch will be the case for wee have great need of rest. I received a letter yesterday written by father on the 2nd of this mo I was extreamly glad to hear from you and that you were in good health write as often as you can for one needs all the encouragement posible under thes sircumstances which wee are pleased wee have mooved to a new line of works since I wrote last wee are pretty close to the rebel works and they annoy us considerable with shells and balls but wee have not lost but one man our hospital steward he was killed soon after wee came here, wee have a sunny place here there being no trees very near wee have had considerable rain fro the last few days. I received the pills sent me in due time, I wrote a few lines I started them to Charles & Amos day before yesterday I also wrote to the family once since wee have been at this plase. I informed you of the death of Wm. Curnutt & Henry Bayliff in one of my letters wee have no accounts of the boys that were taken prisoners. On the 22nd of last mo. wee get the witness and advocate both religious papers printed at Indianapolis, they come nearly every week they furnish some very good reading mater, I don't know when I can send this of I will guit for the present and write more likely this eavening. 5th day morning the 11th. I find myself in pretty good health this morning wee still remain in our old position there is considerable picket fireing going on all the time, it is almost like a hive of bees working after night here, every fellow has something to do after things get quiet at night the pickets generally almost cease fireing and the men go to work on the breastworks and to building shades and other things that it would be dangerous to do in the day time. wee got a small mail this morning there is one letter for I. S. Poe from Aunt. Isaac is at Marietta I think I see Aunt has the letters directed to Marietta but she puts the number of the regiment & the comp on them which she should not do if she wants them to do to the hospital, 4th Division 15th H.C. Hospital Marietta Ga. Is the proper direction for a letter to go to the hospital at Marietta. Wee have good water in our rear now it was between our lines when wee were at our other works but it is in a hollow in our rear now where wee go to coock wee are at our 4th line of works wee have advansed about a mile & a half since the battle of the 28th. I have nothing more of note to write at present. I will likely have the chance to send this off this eavening.
