After the rebs left wee came north how far I don't know when wee will moove on, soon I suppose. I received a letter to day from Cousin P. C. Hadley I have one for Isaac the last one I received from you was mailed May 19<sup>th</sup>. It has been very disagreeable laying in ditches. For so long it seems good to get where wee can rest wee advansed our works on the rebs to within some 300 yds there was some close sharpshooting done several killed and wounded along the line. I don't know when wee will have the chance to send our mail I thought I would write a few lines and have it ready. I find they are receiving mail at Headquarters I will deposit mine there.
