I have the privailage of again writing you a few lines to inform you that I am in pretty good health. The health is good here but one man out of the camp that attends sick call Merary he has been unwell for a long time and does not seem to improve mutch. I received two letters from you to day. They were gladly received I had been looking for a letter for several days one of them contained some postage stamps, the weather is moderate here at present some days it is a little cool but generally pleasant. There is nothing of importance going on here things seem to be fixing for a grand move in the east before there is mutch done here. Third day morning the 22nd wee waked up this morning to find some 6 inches of snow on the ground it looks like the middle of winter up north wee thought winter was over but I gefs it has just begun. The boys are out having a gay time snowballing each other and Cos are cooks today wee made biscuits for breakfast it took about 60 for our family. There are 11 of us altogether it takes a lot of grub to feed all of us wee dont draw full rations of everything. Our grub gets low before the time is out, generally, I should think now would be the time for the Johnsons to make a raise while wages was so high the talk is that the soldiers wages is to be raised. I think they ought to raise the private soldiers wages and lower the officers for the men that do the work get but little pay and the men that set around out of danger get big pay. I would like to have been at home and eat a big dinner or two with Andrew, he likes better than me to go in for a new term of 3 years, I want to get free and then I'll stay so Isaac S seems to rather doubt it being a very wise investment that of buying lowa land at \$5 per acre he allowed it would be about as mutch as it would ever be worth he did not say mutch about it only mentioned he did not think it would pay.
