Honored Parents Brothers & Sister
we are still on the march have
been engaged with the enemy at
Dalton where we met with the
sad loss of our Captain T. A Peoples
killed and 3 men pretty badly —
wounded viz Thomas Carter leg broken
below knee he was doing well when
we left the hospital, Robert Pitch-
erson flesh wound in thigh James
Donovan flesh wound in thigh
both doing well when we left them.
my health is pretty good we
have not marched very fast our
advance has been fighting some
with the enemy's rear guard every
day we are now some 55 miles
from Atlanta where the enemy
will likely make a desperate resi-

stance he may make a stubborn
stand This side of Atlanta we
have not had any chance to send
any letters since we left
Dalton and there was but a poor
chance there. 6th day morning the
20th. I was surprised this morn-
ing by the whistle of the cars
which are now running here
The rebs did not burn but
one bridge which was soon rebuilt
I dont know whether we
will advance any to day or
not. we have quite a lot of
news afloat most of which we
dont put any confidence in
one current report yesterday
was that Grant had beaten
Lee and taken several prisoners
and that the enemy were
going to march on the army
of the Cumberland and hurl

it back at all hazards but
it will be a mammoth job
to hurl the army that is here
back we have a tremendous
army and one that will fight
they may inflict severe
loss on this army but they
cant whip it with there
whole army and attack us in
our own position in these
hills. we received a small mail
this morning but I received
none neither did Isaac I
received a letter while we
were near Dalton written
the first of this month.

I dont know when I will have
the chance to send this but
I think there will be a cha
nce soon. The boys are all in
pretty good health Isaac is well
write as often as convenient. Answer Jno Mills,

a half hour later, we have
just received an additional
mail. I received a letter written
the 9th of this month from Father.
I was very glad to hear from you
and of your good health, The
Chaplain was around a while
ago he says he will take up
the mail after while and it
will be sent off as soon as pos-
ible. as we are marching on the ene-
my and will be likely to meet him
before a great while and probably
some of us will fall no one knows
who, if I should be the unfortunate
one. I feel that all will be well
with me for I put my trust in
The Lord and if it is The will

of my Heavenly Father that I should
offer up my life I shall do it
cheerfully believing as I do that
he does nothing wrong, so if you
should hear of my death be not troub-
led. the reason that I have written as I have
is because we know not what may happen
and what I have written might save you of some
anxiety. as ever John Mills.

Wee received a small mail this morning but I received non neither did Isaac I received a letter while wee were near Dalton wrien the first of this month. I dont know when I will have the chance to send this but I think there will be a chance soon. They boys are all in pretty good health Isaac is well write as often as convenient. As ever Jno. Mills.

A half hour later. Wee have just received an additional mail I received a letter written the 9th of this month from Father I was very glad to hear from you and of your good health, the chaplain was around a while ago he says he will take up the mail after while and it will be sent off as soon as possible. As wee are marching on the enemy and will be likely to meet him before a great while and probably some of us will fall no one knows who if I should be the unfortunate one I feel that all will be well with me for I put my trust in the Lord and if it is the will of my Heavenly Father that I should offer up my life I shall do it cheerfully believing as I do that he does nothing wrong, so if you should hear of my death be not troubled. The reason that I have wrien as I have is because wee know not what may happen and what I have wrien might save you of some anxiety. As ever John Mills.
