 duty pass out of witness we have  
 solicited our young Bomarks of  
 the Spanish American, and would  
 now to take our places. Praying we  
 are placing upon them a duty - that  
 will in years to come be faithfully  
 carried on. And as the years come  
 and, one by one your Bomarks will  
 join those of our Bomarks and be  
 laid beneath this low gun tent. The  
 Memorial day will be to those who  
 survive a day of instant and  
 devotion to you as it has been to us.
